



Bloomingdale Real Estate Update

(Editor's Note: Realtor Ronnie McLaughlin has lived in Bloomingdale for six years with her husband and two children. She is also active in the Bloomingdale High School PTSA and Girl Scouts.)

Bloomingdale's Real Estate Stats: Where does your home fit in?

As of May 23, the Bloomingdale community had 32 actives homes for sale. The homes averaged 2,569 square feet and had an average current sales price of \$332,889 and a median sales price of \$260,000. The average active listing had 4 bedrooms and had been for sale an average of 56 days. The reason for the wide difference between the average sales price and the median sales price is that one house currently for sale at just under \$1.3 million is well above the average for Bloomingdale.

As of this same date, there were 45 current pending sales meaning 45 buyers have found homes in Bloomingdale recently and are waiting to get through inspections, appraisals and loan approvals before closing on their new home. Current pending homes have an average sales price of \$189,554, a median price of \$229,000 and have been on the market for 35 days.

Over the past 30 days, twenty-seven homes have sold at an average sales price of \$256,543 and a median sales price of \$233,000 averaging 30 days on the market.

Neighborhood Snapshot: The Links

The Links located along Culbreath Drive boasts 96 homes averaging 2,606 square feet built between 1995 and 1998. Thirteen of the homes line the Bloomingdale Golf course and most have four bedrooms, three baths and private pools. The Links is a mandatory HOA neighborhood with three streets – Delamere Court, Duncombe Drive and Swift Circle. Ten homes sold over the past year at an average sales price of \$312,465 and an average of 33 days on the market.

ATTENTION! CALLS FOR AN AREA DOG PARK ARE ANSWERED

When County Commissioner Stacy White took office in 2014, the BHA asked for his help to bring a dog park to one of our local community parks preferably in BL East or West. We, of course, were not the only ones pushing for this community amenity, as several residents from across the Brandon-Valrico area approached White with the same idea. On May 23, a public meeting was held in Brandon to announce the new dog park's location at Saladino Park on Bryan Road, and to discuss the proposed facility concept,

see diagram right. While we cannot take full credit, the board is pleased that an iniative they worked to pass and many residents desired has been approved. Costs for the park \$450,000. Construction will begin this winter with completion scheduled spring 2018.

Congratulations to Bloomingdale Senior High School (BSHS) student, Kevin Coomber, for earning this year's Bloomingdale Community Scholarship worth \$2,000. He is a High Honor Role student with a 5.45 GPA, over 120 hours of community volunteer hours and he scored 1310 on the Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT).

"The applicant pool was the best we have ever had with 15 applications received," said Scholarship Chairman Dann Berkowitz. "Most attended BSHS, but Strawberry Crest and Armwood were also represented."

"Kevin's application was exceptional," Berkowitz added. "He truly represents the best of the best in our community."

Academically, Kevin's accomplishments are second to none. In addition to his high GPA, he has already completed four weeks of college-level STEM courses, become a certified Internet Web Professional, and earned a perfect score in Science on the FCAT.



Proposed Bell Shoals Medians Maintain Bloomingdale "Signature" Look; Public Hearing Scheduled for FY18 Budget

Bell Shoals Update

Thomas (Tommy) Rawls, P.E., Program Manager and new Project Manager for the Bell Shoals Widening Project attended the May 8 regular monthly Board meeting of the Bloomingdale Special Taxing District (BSTD) Trustees. Rawls told Trustees that their relationship would be a long-term one, and that his focus is on the design and construction aspects of the road project. Additionally, Rawls noted that property acquisitions remain ongoing.

While possibly three years from project completion, planning is moving swiftly —including requiring BSTD Trustees to decide on the Bell Shoals median landscaping. After careful consideration of increased costs and the desire to have Bloomingdale maintain its signature look, the Trustees voted 5-2 to have County install irrigation and colorful but low-maintenance plants and shrubs in the medians. All medians will have Cathedral Live Oaks as well.

Fiscal Year 2018 (FY18) Budget

During a series of budget meetings, the Trustees finalized the proposed budget for FY18. On Monday, June 12, a Public Hearing will be held at 6:15 p.m. at the Bloomingdale Community Offices, 3509 Bell Shoals Road, to present the budget and hear public comment. The hearing will take place immediately preceding the regular monthly meeting of the Trustees at 6:30 p.m. View the proposed budget on the BSTD website at www. bloomingdaletaxingdistrict.org.

Public Hearing

The Bloomingdale Special Dependent District is conducting a public budget hearing for the purpose of hearing public comment regarding its proposed FY 18 budget. The Trustees will vote on the budget. The hearing will be conducted at the Bloomingdale Community Office, 3509 Bell Shoals Road, Valrico, FL 33596, on Monday June 12, 2017, at 6:15 p.m.

In accordance with Chapter 286, Florida Statute, the public is advised that if a person decides to appeal any decision made by the Board of Trustees with respect to any matter considered at this hearing, he/she will need a record of the proceedings, and that, for such purpose, he/she may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

All meeting facilities are accessible in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Any additional necessary accommodations will be provided with a 48-hour notice. For information, call 813-684-6667.

District Tightens Water Restrictions throughout 16-County Region, Restrictions Start June 5

The Southwest Florida Water Management District's (District) Governing Board voted to increase water restrictions throughout the region. The modified Phase III water shortage order affects counties throughout the District's boundaries including Charlotte, Citrus, DeSoto, Hardee, Hernando, Highlands, Hillsborough, Lake, Levy, Manatee, Marion, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Sarasota and Sumter.

District hydrologists report a rainfall deficit of 11-inches since the start of the dry season last October. In fact, this is the driest dry season in the past 103 years. Even though the region is experiencing drought conditions, there is adequate public water supply available. Florida's dry season runs October through May.

Under the new water shortage order, lawn watering is reduced to once-per-week and allowable watering hours also are reduced. Micro-irrigation and hand watering of non-lawn areas are still allowed any day, if needed. Additionally, there are now limits on car washing and homeowners' associations may not enforce any deed restrictions, which could cause an increase in water use. The restrictions will remain in effect through August 1, 2017. AREA LAW AND ORDER

Between May 8 and May 25, the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office conducted 26 traffic stops in Bloomingdale East and Bloomingdale West. Those traffic stops resulted in 22 written warnings, two verbal warnings and two citations. Since the realignment of districts on May 8, we are able to provide statistics just in the Bloomingdale area.

One statistic increasing in the area is traffic crashes within our subdivisions. We have had five crashes without injuries and one with injuries. Those kind of numbers in such a short span of time tells us that we need to slow down, stop at all stop signs and above all be courteous drivers. These are not crashes on Bloomingdale Avenue, but rather inside Bloomingdale East and West!

Also in Bloomingdale, there were two drug law violations, one residential burglary and four vehicle burglaries. Only one vehicle was unlocked. There were a few criminal mischief calls, but none that resulted in a report.

Remember to watch out for what is happening in your neighborhoods. If you see something, make sure you call the HCSO Non-Emergency number at 813-247-8200. Please remember to lock the doors to your home, secure your garage doors, secure your guns and lock up your vehicles. This will significantly reduce the opportunity for you to become a victim.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT!

We are still seeing an overwhelming number of our citizens targeted by phone scams.

Use caution when dealing with people over the phone that you don't know, especially when you're asked to send money to someone you don't know. Verify the caller's story with friends or family members before withdrawing money and sending it in the mail. 2017 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday

The 2017 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday, passed by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by Governor Rick Scott, runs through Sunday, June 4 ending at 11:59 p.m. During this sales tax holiday, qualifying items related to disaster preparedness are exempt from sales tax.

Qualifying Items

Selling for \$10 or less: Reusable ice (reusable ice packs)

Selling for \$20 or less: Any portable self-powered light source (powered by battery, solar, hand-crank, or gas): Flashlights, Lanterns, Candles

Selling for \$25 or less: Any gas or diesel fuel container, including LP gas and kerosene

Selling for \$30 or less: Batteries, including rechargeable batteries, listed sizes only (excluding automobile and boat batteries): AA-cell, C-cell, D-cell, 6-volt, 9-volt, Coolers and ice chests (food-storage; nonelectrical)

Selling for \$50 or less:

- Tarpaulins (tarps), Visqueen, plastic sheeting, plastic drop cloths, and other flexible waterproof sheeting
- Ground anchor systems, Tie-down kits, Bungee cords, Ratchet straps
- Radios (powered by battery, solar, or hand-crank): Two-way, Weather band

Selling for \$750 or less:

- Portable generators used to provide light or communications, or to preserve food in a power outage.
- First-aid kits (always exempt)

Note: Eligible light sources and radios qualify for the exemption even though they may have electrical cords.

2017 Hurricane Season Starts, Above-Normal Season Predicted

From the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration

NOAA's Climate Prediction Center has issued its annual Atlantic hurricane season outlook. The season runs from June 1 through Nov. 30.

This year, NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) forecasts an abovenormal hurricane season with a 70 percent likelihood of 11 to 17 named storms, five to nine hurricanes and two to four major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5; winds of 111 mph or higher). An average season produces 12 named storms, six hurricanes and three major hurricanes.

As if being a busy high school principal, single mother of two, and involved community volunteer isn't enough, Bloomingdale Senior High School's (BSHS) Sue Burkett couldn't say no to the moms who are part of the school's Academic Foundation when they asked her to run for Honorary Mayor of Brandon. Why? Because it is for the kids.

"It's hard to say no when money is being raised to support children," said Burkett.

The race for Honorary Mayor of Brandon, which kicked off June 1, is an opportunity for candidates to raise thousands of dollars for their favorite charities. It was originated by The Community Roundtable in 1959. Every dollar raised is a vote, and on July 4 Burkett will find out the total amount she raised and whether she will be riding in the Brandon Fourth of July Parade as the new "Mayor."

In keeping with her For the Kids campaign slogan, the BSHS principal has chosen to raise money for organizations close to her heart—the Bloomingdale High School Academic Foundation, Center Place for the Fine Arts, and the Boys & Girls Club of Tampa/Clair Mel.

- Bloomingdale High School Academic Foundation was started in 2014 to meet the needs of teachers in the classroom to provide the highest level of academic instruction. All funds go directly back to the classroom to provide technology, specialized equipment, or supplemental textbooks.
- Center Place, established in 1976, has made the arts accessible to the community through classes, exhibits, and performances. Many children in the area have grown up attending events and learning about the arts at Center Place.
- The Boys & Girls Club of Tampa/Clair Mel building was under renovation when fire destroyed the entire structure in December 2016. BSHS adopted the children of the club to make sure that they still had a Christmas celebration, and the school continues to support the club during the rebuilding process. Boys & Girls Clubs of Tampa Bay provide safe environments for youth between the ages of 5 and 18 years old during out of school time as an alternative to being on the streets or home alone.

Burkett is supported in her campaign for mayor by her own kids, Jake, 19, who attends Florida State University, and Becca, 16, who attends Durant High School, as well as her fiancé, Steve Baricko. And then there are the 2,300 students at BSHS that she considers a part of her extended family.

Added Burkett, "I want my students to be good citizens, and this [mayor's race] is a great life lesson for me to lead."

The candidate for mayor has been principal at BSHS since February 2013. Before that she was principal at Burns Middle School for 4 years, and was an assistant principal for curriculum at BSHS from 2005 to 2009. Burkett has lived in the Bloomingdale area for 14 years.

No matter how things turn out in the Honorary Mayor of Brandon race, Burkett will have something to celebrate. On July 5, she and Baricko fly to the Cayman Islands to be married.





Cimino Elementary Applauds Former Students

Last month, 850 Cimino Elementary students clapped out more than 50 high school graduates, all former Cimino students. The clap out, a tradition established last year by Principal Cindy Dowdy, shows current students that hard work pays off, while for former students, it is their moment to shine as the entire Cimino student body applauds their achievement during a courtyard walk through.

The graduates, primarily from Bloomingdale High School, represented Bell Creek, Blake, Durant, Newsome, Riverview, Spoto and Strawberry Crest High Schools. Also attending were Florida Virtual School and homeschool graduates.

We want our kids to have fun, but according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), drowning kills more children from ages 1 to 4 than anything else, except birth defects.

So, how do you balance having fun with being safe? The CDC has several recommendations.

- 1. Swim classes are an effective way to prevent accidental drowning. Classes begin as early as 6 months of age. Swim programs such as KinderSwim, Inc. (www. KinderSwim.com) teach young children aquatic techniques such as "float, swim, float" until they reach the side of the pool or until someone can rescue them. As children age and progress, so do the swim classes.
 - Katja Borosch is the Owner of KinderSwim, Inc. and she teaches swim lessons to all skill levels including to special needs children. Borosch believes, "Skills first, fun later." She believes in empowering children to be responsible around the pool and expanding those skills as the child grows.
- Fences around the pools are important because they create a primary boundary.
 The CDC recommends a four-sided isolation fence with self-closing and self-locking latches.
- 3. Life Jackets for weaker and younger swimmers or those who can swim but are in a large body of water are important. The American Academy of Pediatrics suggests parents not substitute water wings for a life jacket because they can give a child and adult a false sense of security.
- 4. Finally, learn CPR because it can save a child's life. CPR classes are offered throughout our county. Contact your local Red Cross for more information at 1-800-733-2767.

Nothing on this list is more important than proper supervision by adults who can swim. Drownings happen quickly and quietly so a fast response is critical.






