AREA LAW AND ORDER

Between Sept. 26 and Oct.17, the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office conducted 11 traffic stops in Bloomingdale East and West. Those traffic stops resulted in two verbal warnings, seven written warnings, one citation and one arrest.

At community entrances and within subdivisions, there were two crashes without injuries and five with injuries. There were four DUI stops. Remember, slow down, stop at all stop signs and above all be a courteous driver. And, wear your seat belts at all times.

There were five vehicle burglaries; only one vehicle was locked. Let's be more diligent in protecting our property. The good news is that no firearms were stolen. There were two residential burglaries and three criminal mischief incidents. Finally, there were eight arrests made for various crimes in the Bloomingdale area.

HOLIDAY TIPS

The holidays are right around the corner. Be smart and do your part to be a well-informed citizen and enjoy a safe season with your family. The Sheriff's Office wants all of our residents to have an enjoyable and safe holiday season.

AS A SHOPPER - Be extra cautious and stay aware of your surroundings and your actions. Do not leave your car unlocked, especially with the engine running. It is illegal to leave your vehicle running and unattended.

Do not leave packages or other valuables in your car. If you must, lock them in the trunk. Lock your vehicles at home too.

Be a courteous driver - everyone has a lot on his or her mind during the holidays. So be kind and avoid road rage.

AS A HOMEOWNER - Prepare and secure your home before you head out for holiday traveling or even before you go shopping. Burglars drive through neighborhoods unwanted, unnecessary looking for "easy targets." Don't let your home be one!

Special "Security Watch" requests can be completed at the Bloomingdale Community Station on Erindale Drive if you are going out of town.

When the holiday is over, don't leave that empty large screen TV box out by the road. Finally, take the time to record your serial numbers and take photos of your valuables. Having your serial number can greatly increase the possibility of getting your stuff back.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT!

Remember to watch out for what is happening in your neighborhoods. If you see something, make sure to call Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office Non-Emergency number at 813-247-8200.

Remember to lock the doors to your home, secure your garage doors, secure your guns and lock up your vehicles. This will significantly reduce the opportunity for you to become a victim.






