Hurricane Irma

The September 11 Bloomingdale Special Taxing District (BSTD) meeting was cancelled due to Hurricane Irma. However, that did not prevent the District from surveying damage and initiating cleanup efforts on the part of landscape maintenance company Buccaneer during the week following the storm.

Debris including leaves, limbs, and twigs were strewn throughout the community, and several trees were downed.

Once Buccaneer addressed communities in its care that had emergency conditions, cleanup throughout Bloomingdale commenced, resulting in \$3,500 of cost above contracted maintenance obligations.

One of the most-noticed losses in the community were the young trees that were blown over in front of Alafia Elementary School. Volunteers conducting cleanup activities at the school stood the trees upright in an attempt to save them; however, some trees soon fell over a second time. Buccaneer has now determined that the trees roots were sliced and damaged, making replanting impossible. The BSTD will determine whether to purchase new trees at a future meeting.



AREA LAW AND ORDER

Between Aug. 15 and Sept. 26, the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office conducted 21 traffic stops in Bloomingdale East and West. Those traffic stops resulted in five verbal warnings, 11written warnings and five citations.

The traffic crashes at the entrances into Bloomingdale East and West and within the subdivisions continue. We have had 13 crashes without injuries and three with injuries. Remember, slow down, stop at all stop signs and above all be a courteous driver. And, wear your seat belts at all times.

There were three vehicle burglaries and only one was unlocked. Let's be more diligent in protecting our property. The good news is that no firearms were stolen One of the vehicles had a wallet stolen which resulted in credit card fraud. Finally, there were three residential burglaries, one burglary of a shed and four criminal mischief incidents.

Halloween is right around the corner. Let make it safe as possible. If your children will be going out trick or treating, insure they are safe by going with them.

- 1) Make sure they have light colored clothing or lighted apparel.
- 2) Only go to homes with porch lights on.





Home security is always a priority. Here are some good Home Security Tips we found at Howstuffworks.com

- 1. Lock up your home, even if you go out only for a short time. Many burglars just walk in through an unlocked door or window.
- 2. Change all the locks and tumblers when you move into a new house.
- 3. For the most effective alarm system, conceal all wiring. A professional burglar looks for places where he or she can disconnect the security system.
- 4. Your house should appear occupied at all times. Use timers to switch lights and radios on and off when you're not at home.
- 5. If you have a faulty alarm that frequently goes off, get it fixed immediately and tell your neighbors that it's been repaired. Many people ignore an alarm that goes off periodically.
- 6. If you lose your keys, change the locks immediately.
- 7. Before turning your house key over to a professional house cleaner for several hours, make sure the person is honest and reputable as well as hardworking. Check all references thoroughly. If the house cleaner is from a firm, call your local Better Business Bureau to check on the firm's reputation.
- 8. Trees located near windows or shrubbery that might shield a burglar from view can be major flaws in your home-protection plan. Consider your landscaping plan in light of your protection needs.
- 9. If the entrances to your home are dark, consider installing lighting with an infrared detector. Most thieves don't want to be observed trying to get
- 10. If someone comes to your door asking to use the phone to call a mechanic or the police, keep the door locked and make the call yourself.

With the storm fresh in mind, it's a good time to get ready in case another one comes.

Could've been worse.

That's the impression left with many Hillsborough County residents after Hurricane Irma turned inland as it moved up the Florida peninsula, reducing the chances of devastating winds and storm surge in the Tampa Bay area.

Sure, some parts of the county took hard hits from the storm, particularly areas that flooded near the swollen Alafia and Little Manatee rivers. And, after days without airconditioning, lights, or refrigerated food, many residents have a renewed appreciation for electricity.

In Irma's aftermath, it's wise to consider what went well and what did not. Did you run out of batteries, wish you had bought more water, or scramble to come up with a plan for your pet? Did you long for a generator, plywood to cover windows and doors, or a radio?

Meanwhile, first things first: Hillsborough County Fire Rescue asks residents to remove storm shutters until the next threat. Though they help protect homes in foul weather, the shutters can deter access for first responders during a fire, and can prevent residents from finding a safe exit.

Plan now before another storm heads our way. After all, hurricane season lasts through Nov. 30.

Some crucial matters to review:

- · Have a plan that touches on all likely needs, from acquiring sandbags to finding a suitable pen for your pet.
- Pack an emergency kit.
- Know if you are in an evacuation zone. They are not the same as flood zones, which are mapped by FEMA for use in the National Flood Insurance Program.
- Sign up for HCFL Alert, Hillsborough County's mass notification system.
- If appropriate, register for Special Needs Disaster Assistance.

It's likely you'll never be more aware of what's needed to weather a hurricane or tropical storm than you are now. With Irma gone but still fresh in mind, take advantage of the opportunity to prepare for the next storm.





Master Deputy Roger Bradley is a Community Hero

He quietly works each day to make our community better and Hurricane Irma was no exception. His name is Master Deputy Roger Bradley; he lives among us and he is a true hero.

Bradley is a life-long Bloomingdale resident, veteran of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO), and loves helping children. He works at Burns Middle School as a respected School Resource Deputy helping both faculty and students whenever he can.

Principal Matthew DiPrima says, "We are so fortunate to have Deputy Bradley as our SRD. He has consistently put others first throughout his career and it is evident in his daily work. He is one of our heroes."

After Irma pounded Florida, Bradley's HCSO supervisor, Corporal Jeremy Davis, asked for volunteers to assist FEMA and the Collier County Sheriff's Office. With his family safe in north Florida and his work at the county shelter done, Bradley jumped at the chance to help.

As he along with 13 other officers drove south, "the worse the [hurricane] damage got.'

The group spent almost a week working 14-hour shifts in Collier County and sleeping on cots at a local elementary school. The officers they assisted had been working 7-8 days straight with little rest.

When the HCSO officers arrived City Everglades and Goodland, they split into teams to search for residents in peril and give out necessities like food, water, and ice. Bradley said, "I've never seen so many grown men and women come to us crying because they're so glad to see us. Many of them were without food,

water, and power, for at least 3-4 days before anyone could get to them."

"If you had a bag of ice, it was like gold."

Of his time in Collier County, Bradley says, "It was very gratifying and I felt really good about the help we gave those people."

Thank you, Master Deputy Bradley, for all you do for our community. You are a true hero!



Pamela Reeves is the Burns Middle School Visual Art Teacher and like most teachers, she was not only concerned with preparing her home for the storm, but also her classroom. At home, she made sure she had all the necessities such as food, water, and batteries. At work, she made sure her classroom was prepared for any potential wind or water damage.

As Irma approached, Reeves noticed something that she had not prepared for - an increase in her students' anxiety. At the time, many forecast models brought Irma barreling straight through Florida with winds up to 129 mph. Governor Scott was calling for people to evacuate or head to shelters. Scenes of cars stopped on I-75N and lines at the pump topped the news. Some students began to panic feeling they may die in the storm. Reeves said, "Many students just didn't feel safe."

Reeves decided she needed to do something. She knew that art helps her daughter relax so on the last day of school before the storm, she announced an art contest with the theme "What Makes Me Feel Safe." Students were asked to work on their projects over the break and she says, "I figured this was a way for them to be distracted from the storm and remind them of things that make them feel safe."

The contest was a success. Reeves received 25 entries and she selected 3 winners. She is proud of all the students who participated and a select number of pieces are going to be displayed in the Raymond O. Shelton School Administrative Center in downtown Tampa through January.

Reeves is a Bloomingdale resident and credits her passion for art to her former Bloomingdale High School art teacher, Karen Marcos. So why does she teach art? She says, "I just want to give back to the students in the same way my art teacher gave to me."
