



Large Turnout at Bell Shoals Meeting

On Oct. 23, Hillsborough County representatives gave area residents a chance to learn more about the Bell Shoals Road widening project. The meeting, hosted at Bloomingdale Senior High School, provided a project overview to area residents in a public forum setting. Curiosity about the project's details led to a big turnout, with residents able to see the work plan diagrams and ask questions of the project staff.

After thanking everyone for coming out to the meeting, project manager Thomas F. Rawls, Hillsborough County Public Works, stepped aside for a quick presentation highlighting the project's scope, estimated cost, and expected changes.

As previously reported, the project will widen the segment of Bell Shoals Road between Bloomingdale Avenue and Boyette Road from a

two-lane, undivided rural road, to a four-lane, divided urban facility complete with bicycle lanes and stronger emphasis on pedestrian safety. The project will also widen the bridge over the Alafia River, and replace the traffic signals at Glenhaven Drive, Rosemead Lane, and Bloomingdale Avenue.

The presentation also included several new details: Some neighborhood entrances, including Shoals Landing Drive, Emerald Creek Drive, and Tomahawk Trail, would experience access changes at some point due to the work being done on Bell Shoals.

Additionally, the project start date is now spring 2019. Once a contractor is selected, a second public hearing will occur in early 2019.

The presentation also confirmed that Newland Communities and Hillsborough County are funding the estimated \$65 million construction project. Rawls also encouraged anyone with comments and questions about the project to share the information with staff by phone or e-mail.

Bloomingdale Real Estate Update

How's the Market?

When I'm out and about, people always ask me, "Ronnie, how's the market?" This is my current answer. "The market is good!"

Listings are experiencing more competition. According to the Greater Tampa Association of Realtors Market Statistics for single-family homes for the month of August 2018, the number of new listings is up 10 percent year over year. The number of months of availability is up 7.7 percent year over year and pricing was only up by 2.5 percent, which is the second smallest rise since December 2014.

What does all of this mean? There are more houses for sale and interest rates are rising, so homes are on the market longer than what we have experienced for years now. And, even though the number of buyers is up 5.95 percent, the buyers do not have as much purchasing power as they did in past years when interest rates were lower. (GTR Market statistics from MLS)

Bloomingdale Estates located south of Bloomingdale Avenue along John Moore is comprised of 179 homes averaging 4 bedrooms, 3 bathrooms and 2,320 square feet. The homes were built between 1980-1991. 
BHA President George May said, "The best part of this event is seeing our families coming out and enjoying themselves, interacting with each other and our vendors."





Allow me to reiterate the District's appreciation for your vote of confidence. Now, your trustees will get to work revitalizing the community we all call home. This is only the beginning. Come and join us as we embark on a new direction.

Be aware that Phase I of the 3-year sidewalk repair project has been completed. Hillsborough County had their contractor complete repairs on what were deemed the worst areas of sidewalks with regard to unevenness. *Look for repairs to resume in 2019*.


