🔻 Hillsborough's New Online System Makes Pet Adoption **Simpler, More Convenient and More Transparent**

Hillsborough County has made major improvements to the way people look for adoptable pets.

The Hillsborough County Pet Resource Center unveiled its online kennel, a new system that substantially increases the amount of information available to prospective adopters. The online system, called ADOPT, features individualized pet profiles, real-time updates on which dogs and cats are

available for adoption, and detailed search options for those looking for specific characteristics in a pet such as breed, sex, or age. A resident can now filter search results to find, for example, only female dogs less than 2 years old, or look online to see if their lost cat has been taken to the shelter.

ADOPT pet profiles also include all the information the staff and volunteers have gathered when observing pets while at the shelter, giving those considering adoption a look into the dog or cat's personality and how it could fit within their life.

The ADOPT online kennel system can be accessed by desktop computer or mobile devices at HCFLGov.net/Adopt. An instructional video also is available.

Dozens of dogs and cats are adopted every day from the Hillsborough County Pet Resource Center, and the ADOPT system is designed to make the process even easier and more convenient. The PRC is Hillsborough's only open-admissions shelter, meaning it accepts dogs and cats regardless of size, breed, age, or medical condition.

Let's Be Careful Out There By Tom Leech, President

In November, your trustees began the planning necessary to incorporate new resources into our community. Community safety and security became the first focus area. The intent is to provide an increased police presence through the

engagement of off-duty Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) deputies who will conduct active and passive policing activities within Bloomingdale. This type of program has succeeded for several years in communities such as Northdale Special Taxing District.

We have already begun a pilot program that will run through the end of this month. The trustees developed the pilot after consulting with the deputy in charge of the Northdale program and with Community Resource Deputy Clifford Fletcher at the HCSO Erindale Community Substation. The purpose of the pilot program is to gauge effectiveness before committing to the cost of a dedicated community policing effort. Pilot



program results will shape the program that would begin in Fiscal Year 2019 (FY19) (October 2019).

Please be aware that the pilot program does not mean constant police presence throughout the community. Deputies will work 4-hour shifts on different days. Most of the shifts will be weekdays with a few weekend shifts. Deputies will perform all law enforcement tasks normally associated with HCSO--patrolling subdivisions, thoroughfares, and enclaves as well as performing traffic control, traffic monitoring, and security services.

Based on the success of the pilot, the trustees will build out the FY19 program. Key drivers include the community's reaction and receptiveness; perceived effectiveness of the program; deputies' interest in participating; and the projected cost. Your input is important. Let us know what you think about the program and any ways we might improve future implementation.

One last note--off-duty deputies can issue citations and, where appropriate, make arrests. So, let's be careful out there!

💐 Lean Left, Head Left... Great for Chipping

Has your golfing buddy told you to hit down on the ball so it'll go up? Or, has he told you to quit trying to help the ball get up in the air? Lots of advice, but no course of action.

A few simple adjustments to your chipping setup and both of the previous issues will be resolved - Lean left, head left. The great thing about this setup is it's so close to how you look like when you strike the ball in a full swing.

The goal is for your total weight to be more on your left side (80 percent). Having your left leg straight and right knee bent forward at address puts the center of your chest and head to the front side of the ball.

Move your hands, arms and shoulders back and through together. The club head will strike the ball first while the club head still going down.




