



#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

The roadways in and around Bloomingdale are changing.

#### **OFF-DUTY DEPUTY PROGRAM**

Our community security program got off to a resounding success on Feb. 6 thanks to off-duty Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) deputies. On Day 1, three traffic citations were issued during the morning school hours. Remember, while these deputies are not on official duty, they are in uniform, drive their HCSO cruiser, and retain law enforcement authorities the same as if they were on duty. Based on the initial success of the pilot program, your Board of Trustees voted to continue the program. As I mentioned last month, patrol locations and times will rotate to blanket the community and to maintain unpredictability.

#### BELL SHOALS ROAD WIDENING

Property Manager Rick Pitrowski and I met with Hillsborough County officials earlier this month and reviewed the progress and impacts of the Bell Shoals widening project. The tree removal, movement of gas and fiber optic lines, and the associated construction traffic are all part of this long-anticipated effort.

Much of the work affecting Bloomingdale has involved finalizing land acquisition or the rights to use land adjacent to Bell Shoals. These legal efforts are nearing completion, which will translate to another surge in activity along Bell Shoals.

Despite the quickened pace, the project has a long way to go to completion. Construction is divided into phases beginning at Boyette Road and running to just north of Bloomingdale Avenue. The county expects to have finalized plans in the next few weeks.

When complete, Bell Shoals will have four lanes of traffic stretching from Boyette to Bloomingdale. A landscaped median will separate the two directions of traffic. Along Bell Shoals, entrances at Glenhaven Drive and Greenhollow Lane will be moved back to accommodate the new roadway. And traffic flow will be much smoother.

#### TRAFFIC CALMING ON NATURES WAY

Thanks to the many efforts on the part of the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association (BHA), the county is finalizing

a traffic safety plan that will narrow from four lanes to two the stretch of Natures Way between Elba Place and Bell Grande Drive. Changes also include the addition of bike lanes in both directions and installation of medians. This new traffic flow is intended to lower the number of speed-related accidents that occur in our community. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2020. More information will follow in the coming months.

#### SIDEWALK REPAIRS

The next phase of sidewalk repairs being conducted in Bloomingdale by Hillsborough County begins May 1. This is the second of a three-phase, 3-year, \$1 million project to make the sidewalks in the community safe again. The project was approved on Feb. 1, 2017, thanks to the combined efforts of the BSTD, the BHA, and Commissioner Stacy White. The first phase was completed last year.

#### Park Renovations Scheduled For Completion in April/May

Renovation projects at both Bloomindale parks will be completed in time for summer, but the renovations will look a little different from when they were first announced.



The original park plans, as reported in August 2017 by the Osprey

Observer, included expanding the Bloomingdale West tennis courts into a \$600,000 tennis center and racquetball courts, restrooms, shelters and parking, while the Bloomingdale East project would have removed the tennis and racquetball courts in favor of the new nearby tennis center and a \$400,000 splash pad.

"There is no plan for a splash pad," Kyla Booher, Hillsborough County Parks and Recreation, said.

The splash pad was reconsidered when County staff realized a fully staffed park would be needed to conduct daily water tests to ensure public health and safety, something the unstaffed Bloomingdale East and West parks lack.

"We shelved that project in favor of better amenities to incite more people to come to the parks," Booher explained.

Renovations to both parks will be completed in stages. Booher confirmed new picnic shelters, water fountains, benches, and trash cans had been finished in the Bloomingdale East park. The Bloomingdale West park will also receive new water fountains, benches, trash cans, and a small modular public restroom.

The county also decided to resurface and update the tennis and racquetball courts. The Bloomingdale West tennis courts have a tentative completion date of early April 2019, while the Bloomingdale East tennis courts should be open by early May 2019. Resurfacing the tennis and racquetball courts will take 30 days so the acrylic sport coatings will have time to permanently set via a process called curing. Workers have started on the Bloomingdale West resurfacing and plan to begin resurfacing the Bloomingdale East courts while the West courts cure.

Factoring in the renovation costs to a Brandon park, Booher stated the estimated total cost of the renovations was \$600,000, excluding the costs to resurface the tennis and racquetball courts.

#### **Neighborhood Snapshot - Bloomingdale Pointe**


Bloomingdale Pointe located between Springvale Drive, Natures Way Blvd, Green Hollow Lane and Bell Shoals Road is a non-mandated neighborhood consisting of approximately 207 homes, mostly built between 1979-1982. Roads are Briarpark Way, Casaba Loop, Greenford Street, Greenrock Place, Greenstone Place, Orange Crest, Orangepoint Road and Sand Pebble Drive. The three and four bedroom homes average 1,800 square feet and two car garages. Nine homes sold over the past 365 days at an average of \$130 per square foot. Three of the homes were pool homes. Average time on the market was 32 days.

#### Long-Vacant Valrico Sweetbay Supermarket To Become Charter School

After years of sitting vacant, a Haines City-based charter school hopes to inject new life into the former Sweetbay Supermarket at 1101 Bloomingdale Ave., just east of Bell Shoals Road in Valrico.

Navigator Academy of Leadership has filed an application with the Hillsborough County School District to transform the old grocery store into a charter school for more than 1,000 students in kindergarten through eighth grade.

The Sweetbay Supermarket opened in 1997 and closed in 2009 when the parent company decided to shutter its low-performing stores throughout Tampa Bay.

In the decade since, the property owner, Net Lease Realty Partners, has had no luck leasing the 58,505-square-foot building so it's now in the process of selling the property to MG3 Developer Group of Hollywood, Florida.

MG3 specializes in financing, designing and developing construction projects with a focus on charter schools. The company's portfolio includes the Hillsborough Academy of Math and Science, the Pinellas Academy of Math and Science, Independence Academy of Tampa, Bell Creek Academy in Riverview, the Kids Community College South East Campus in Riverview and BridgePrep Academy of Riverview.

According to its application, Navigator Academy of Leadership will focus on science, engineering and technology including the use of K'NEX to introduce basic building and engineering concepts and LEGO Robotics to introduce students to coding and technology.

Its target is to have an enrollment of 1,054 students within five years of opening.



Grace also serves as Treasurer on our Bloomingdale Homeowners Association Board. At a recent meeting discussing the Community Clean-up Day, she learned that a sponsor was still needed to bring in a document shredding service, Shred-It (www.shredit.com).

As a CPA, she has seen first-hand how identity theft has wreaked havoc on the lives of some of her clients, so she stepped up and volunteered to be the sponsor. Grace said, "We see identity theft all the time and so I thought offering the community an easy way to shred their documents was too important not to have."

While so much identity theft occurs online, many thieves still take advantage of unsuspecting residents throwing away sensitive documents into the trash. Those documents must be shredded. Grace says, "People will still go through your trash. You would think they don't do that, but they do."

In addition to shredding, Grace suggests obtaining an IRS PIN (www.irs.gov) which is linked to your social security number and prevents fraudulent tax filing. She also suggests using a credit/identity monitoring service such as LifeLock (www.LifeLock.com) for peace of mind, even after identity theft.

#### THIS MONTH: A FLORIDA FRIEND, THE PILEATED WOODPECKER

The Pileated Woodpecker is the largest woodpecker in North America. The male has a red stripe on his face and the female has a black one, both have a long neck and triangular red crest that sweeps off the back of the head with a heavy long black bill. Because of its size it is a most striking bird that can be heard at great distances with loud whacking as it strikes a tree in search of food. It is a very common woodpecker and is not an endangered species.

#### NESTING


Nest trees are typically dead and within a mature stand of trees, so the birds don't have to travel far for food. The male begins excavating the nest cavity and does most of the work, but the contributes female particularly as the hole nears completion. The nest construction takes three to six weeks and the birds will rarely use the nest again. They stay together in their territory all year and will defend it but will tolerate new arrivals to the area.





#### **MATING AND BABIES**

Pileated woodpeckers are monogamous, stay together for life, and are not migratory. The female will lay three to five white eggs, which will be incubated for 15 days by both the male and female birds. Both feed the nestlings and after about 24 days, the young will leave the nest. They only nest one time each year.



#### **FEEDING HABITS**

They often feed in one spot for long periods. They drill distinctive rectangular shaped holes in the wood to get their main prey, carpenter ants, and other insects from deep in the wood. They also eat beetle larvae, termites, flies, cockroaches and grasshoppers. They are very loud birds sounding like a jackhammer when they are pounding into trees.

#### **PREDATORS AND MORE**

Pileated Woodpeckers can live as long as 12 years. Their common predators include black snakes, hawks, owls and squirrels. The cartoon character woody woodpecker was created in 1940 after the Pileated Woodpecker.



### 💐 Making More Putts with Better Aiming...

Most missed putts from short range, 4-6 feet, are often a result of incorrect alignment of your body during the putting set up. We make similar mistakes of incorrect alignment during our full swing set up.

Here are a few guidelines for better aiming to make more putts:

- 1. Red Line- The line the ball travels on is your target line.
- 2. Yellow Lines The other line we call the body line; consisting of your feet, knees, hips and shoulders. They need to all be square or even.
- 3. Both red and yellow lines are aimed parallel to each other like a railroad track.

If you aim your body incorrectly (right at the hole); you'll compensate by rotating your body or putter face to get the ball back to the left and get it in the hole.


Compensating is the main reason why your score varies from round to round. Aim better...putt better...no compensation.

Don't forget the Move Over Laws which applies to all emergency vehicle, Road Rangers, and tow trucks. Do your part and try to set a good example for our children and other drivers.

Recent data shows more children drowned in Hillsborough County last year than any other county in Florida. The number of drownings spiked to 11 in 2018. That's the highest in the state and more than the previous two years combined. That same year, another six children drowned in Pasco County — two more than in 2017. Statewide, the number of child drowning deaths was 88, up 7 percent from the prior year, according to the Florida Department of Children and Families.

The Y and the Florida Blue Foundation believe teaching children how to be safe around water is not a luxury; it is a necessity. Thanks to a Florida Blue Foundation grant, the Tampa Metropolitan Area YMCA will offer free Safety Around Water lessons to children March 18-21 to coincide with Hillsborough County's and Pasco County's Public Schools spring break.

The Safety Around Water program is free and open to the entire community, beginners and non-swimmers, ages 3-12 years. During the 4-day course, certified instructors teach kids a sequenced set of skills that will reduce the risk of drowning and give them confidence in and around water.

Classes take place Monday, March 18 - Thursday, March 21. Participants must be present on the first day of class and bring their own swimsuit and towel. AYMCA membership is NOT required; however, due to limited space, pre-registration is required at participating Tampa Ys. Contact Campo Family YMCA at (813) 684-1371 for information. 

#### National Letter of Intent Signing Day for Local Student Athletes By Deidre Morgan

In what has been the largest number of Student Athletes to date, eight students from three different sports, signed their National Letters of Intent (NLI) on Feb. 6 at Bloomingdale High School. National Signing Day has traditionally been the first day that a high school senior can sign a binding National Letter of Intent for a collegiate sport with a school that is a member of the United States National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).
