

How to File a Homeowners Complaint By Joe Harless

According to Ron Spiller, Director of Hillsborough County Code Enforcement, the BHA established a Neighborhood Standards list in collaboration with the County Code Department in order to help maintain properties in non-mandated neighborhoods in the community.

Residents can file a Homeowners complaint through Hillsborough County:

- 1. Online https:.hillsboroughcounty.org/en/government/ departments/code
- 2. Phone 813-274-6600
- Mail Code Enforcement Department, 3629 Queen Palm Drive Tampa, FL 33619

The complainant will receive an email acknowledging receipt and the name of the officer assigned. Within 3 work days, the officer will observe the violation and take it from there. The case progress can also be tracked online.

Complaints can be anonymously made through county, but it is important to note that information received regarding code violations is not be exempt from public record. If the person being complained against asks who made the complaint, the information must be provided.

The top reported violations for the Bloomingdale area include overgrowth (lawns not being cut or trees trimmed), trash, junk, and debris, and inoperable vehicles. Residents take pride in the community, so if they see something, they report it. That mindset is one reason that Bloomingdale is as nice as it is.

SPRING FLING

Spring has arrived in Bloomingdale—new plantings, lots of pollen, and of course, Spring Break for Hillsborough County schools. With this time of year, the Bloomingdale Special Taxing District (BSTD) has seen increased property damage.

Sometime between Sunday, March 17, and Monday, March 18, vandals spray painted signs, sidewalk, fencing, brick walls, and a Frontier utility box at both Oak Crest and Eagle Pointe neighborhoods on Erindale Avenue. The vandalism resulted in \$2,400 in sign removal, cleaning, repainting, and re-installation, and another \$250 in pressure washing costs for the District. It is no laughing matter.

On the evening of March 25, there was another wall hit at the intersection of Erindale Drive and Culbreath Road, in almost the exact same spot as last summer's hit that destroyed a sign and wall, as well as incurred extensive to a homeowner's property. Wall damage this time was less extensive; however, the contractor's estimate and insurance claim against the driver are still pending. This will all determine the overall cost to taxpayers once settled.



THIS MONTH: THE CRESTED CARACARA

Caracaras are from the Falcon family and can be found in Florida, Arizona, Texas and the Caribbean. They live in a semi-open habitat offering open ground for hunting and dense cover for nesting. First described in 1871 by John Audubon, "Caracara" comes from a south American Indian name, based on its bird call. It is the national emblem of Mexico and is commonly called the "Mexican eagle." Because of hunting and habitat loss in the United States, it is currently considered a threatened species.

Behavior

These birds fly very close to ground often surprising their prey because of how fast and quiet they fly. Roosts may contain up to a dozen Caracaras but abundant food sources may cause more than 75 to gather. Several years I ago saw 30 caracaras together in a local orange grove.

Breeding/Nesting

They typically breed from December until May. Caracaras build nests by weaving plant material, sticks, weeds and debris into a bulky 2-foot structure. Nest sites are usually 8' to 50' above ground in shrubs, trees and cabbage palms. Crested Caracara stay together for the breeding season; however, live a solitary life at other times. The female lays from 1-4 eggs that are cinnamon in color. The young usually fly off (fledge) after 6 to 8 weeks.

Hunting

This scavenger has probably the most varied diet of any bird of prey. It primarily eats carrion, but also eats live prey including insects, rabbits, squirrels, skunks, birds, snakes, lizards, alligators, bird and turtle eggs and occasionally fruit. They fly low searching for prey they can surprise.

Container Gardening

For many of us "Yankee" Wisconsin transplants, the idea of planting a vegetable garden in November is as unsettling as a Sunday without a Packers game. After several years of watching my fragile tomatoes wither in the Florida sun, I decided to start planting in the Fall. Because the soil here tends to be sandy, I decided to try container gardening.

The containers were cut-up 55-gallon barrels. I created a watering system using 4" corrugated perforated pipe, pipe sock, and ½" PVC pipe. I cut the pipe to a length large enough to form a ring on the bottom of my container and I placed a sock over the pipe to keep out the dirt. I inserted a length of PVC into the pipe, long enough to extend past the top of the container, but I did

not drill holes in the bottom of the containers. This system worked best with a single drainage hole half way up the side of the container.

Once you have your system set up, fill ³/₄ to the top with good soil and plant your starter plants. Because the heat adversely affects the roots of your plants, it is best to plant once the temperatures are consistently below 80 degrees. Add your favorite water-soluble fertilizer to your watering can and, using a funnel, pour 1-2 gallons of water into the feeding tube once a week. You may need to add some more water during the week, depending on the weather; I usually water twice a week.

Advantages of Container Gardening

Container gardening requires watering from the bottom, so it encourages deep

root growth and you don't need to water as frequently. With the moisture already at the bottom of the container, there is less evaporation. If you use a fertilizer like fish emulsion, the critters in your yard are less likely to smell the fish and dig up your plants.

Enjoy your home-grown veggies!

- Annuals Coleus do well in sun or shade and provide vivid colors and patterns for months.
- Bulbs Planting daylilies ensures months of color from these low-maintenance plants.
- Herbs Nasturtiums leaves and flowers add a peppery zest to salads.
- Vegetables Continue planting warm-season crops, such as beans, sweet corn, and squash. Mulch well to prevent weeds and provide water if the weather has been dry.
- Pests Monitor landscape plants weekly for aphids on tender new growth. For lawn insects, rule out cultural problems, such as lack of water, that resemble insect damage before applying a pesticide. Identify and conserve insects that benefit your yard.
- Flowering plants Check if leaves and/or flowers of gardenias and roses are damaged.
- Perennials and bulbs Divide clumps of bulbs, ornamental grasses, or herbaceous perennials to expand or rejuvenate garden beds or to pass along to friends.
- Lawns Apply fertilizer after new growth has started which is usually early April, choose a fertilizer (not a "weed and feed") with little or no phosphorus unless a soil test indicates the need for it. A fertilizer with controlled-release nitrogen yields longer-lasting results.
- Shrubs Choose from a wide variety of shrubs to add to the landscape now.
- Mulch Add mulch to minimize weeds and conserve moisture during dry weather. Organic mulches add nutrients to the soil.


Bloomingdale Celebrates 50 Years of Baseball!
