

### Bloomingdale High School's Lockdown Procedures = A+

On April 3, someone called 911 claiming to be at Bloomingdale High School with a firearm and threatening to use it. The school went into an immediate lockdown while deputies responded and searched the school. It was determined that the threat was unfounded, and the lockdown ended.



This was a crucial test of

Bloomingdale's preparedness." In accordance with Florida law, all public schools perform monthly lockdown drills to ensure teachers, staff, and students know how to respond to an active and immediate threat on campus. Spokesperson for Hillsborough County Schools, Tanya Arja, confirmed that Bloomingdale High responded flawlessly. She says, "The students and staff are trained on lockdown procedures and protocols. They all did exactly what they were trained to do."

In addition, parents were notified of the lockdown when it occurred and again when the all-clear was given. Arja states, "We want our parents to know we take all rumors or threats of violence seriously at our schools. We have an armed, trained officer on every campus."

The suspect was arrested and charged with misusing 911, making false reports of bombs and firearms, and disrupting school functions. Police believe that it may be the same person who threatened Clair Mel Elementary and Dowdell Middle School.

#### **PLANS FOR COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT** By Tom Leech

As we are more than halfway through the current fiscal year, your Board of Trustees has already begun looking at our budget for the new fiscal year that begins on October 1, 2019. This will be the first budget to incorporate the assessment increase you approved last year. In relative terms, the District will have about 30 percent more revenue with which to work. Planning for the additional revenue began in November and I want to share some details with you.

In March, the Board hired Genesis Halff (yes, 2 f's) to redesign and rebrand Bloomingdale. We expect to have a design plan by mid-June, with the actual work beginning by November. First up will be Bloomingdale's eight external entryways. Look for new signage, lighting, and landscaping that offers a fresh, updated look to our community.

The pilot security program begun in February remains in place and under budget. Our security team is experimenting with different shift times and lengths of shifts to maximize effectiveness. The offduty Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) deputies involved patrol the entire Bloomingdale community, performing traffic control, traffic monitoring, and security services. As of April 18, eight shifts have been filled and the Deputies have performed the following:

- 41 traffic stops with warnings
- 5 traffic stops with citations
- engaged two suspicious vehicles
- engaged one suspicious person
- responded to domestic dispute call
- transported one Bloomingdale resident to the hospital.

Although details are still being worked, we expect this program to become fully active in the new fiscal year.

The surveyors you may have noticed along Nature's Way are associated with the "traffic calming" plan scheduled to begin in Spring 2020. The four-lane stretch of Nature's Way will be trimmed to two lanes of traffic, separated by a raised median, with bike lanes on both sides. This project should help minimize excessive speeding and related traffic risks. Thanks to our partners at the Bloomingdale Homeowner's Association (BHA) for their tremendous effort to bring this safety project into being.

Finally, work related to the widening of Bell Shoals Road continues at a brisk pace. Crews have installed new power and telephone poles and shifted the lines over to the new poles. Construction on the segment adjacent to Bloomingdale is still about 2 years out, but I have been working with Hillsborough County to finalize the plans associated with this segment and to agree on the maintenance plan for landscaping in the new medians.

Your Board of Trustees is pursuing an aggressive strategy to address years of disrepair to our community. I am excited about our trajectory and hope you will enjoy the ride – and results. Here we go!



## BLOOMINGDALE COMMUNITY STATION NOTES

#### Summer Safety

We have all heard those words – usually as a reminder delivered by a cautious Mom. However, those words become even more important as summer approaches and kids spend a little more time on their own and with friends. This month is also Safe Kids Week, May 5-12, a time to celebrate kids, prevent injuries and save lives.

Summer is the most dangerous time of year for kids, according to a study released by the National SAFE KIDS Campaign. The study "...found that May through August account for nearly half of all injury related childhood deaths, with July being the deadliest month."

#### Here are a few reminders!

First reminder: "Florida Safety Belt Law" (Florida Statute Chapter 316.614) It is unlawful for any person:



- To operate a motor vehicle in this state unless each passenger and the operator of the vehicle under the age of 18 years are restrained by a safety belt or by a child restraint device pursuant to s.316.613, if applicable; or
- To operate a motor vehicle in this state unless the person is restrained by a safety belt.
- It is unlawful for any person 18 years of age or older to be a passenger in the front seat of a motor vehicle unless such person is restrained by a safety belt when the vehicle is in motion.

For more information on traffic safety, teen driver tips or safety belt usage, contact the HCSO Community Outreach Division at (813) 247-8115. Remember, It's BELTS OR ELSE!

#### Second Reminder: Florida Sun is HOT!

- Protect your child with sunscreen 15 spf or greater
- Limit exposure
- Stay hydrated during outdoor activities

**Third reminder:** Florida's drowning death rate among children ages 1–4 is the highest in the nation. Enough children drown each year in Florida to fill three to four preschool classrooms. For information, Explore WaterSmartFL.com.

- Supervision: Supervision, the first and most crucial layer of protection, means someone is always actively watching when a child is in the pool.
- Barriers: Barriers physically block a child from the pool.
- Emergency Preparedness: In an emergency, it is critical to know CPR, to have a phone nearby, and to immediately call 911. Swim lessons and life jackets are preventive measures that save lives.

Powerlifting is an individualized sport where competitors attempt to lift as much weight as possible for one repetition in the squat, bench press, and deadlift. Competitors are placed into divisions based on weight class, age group, experience, and equipment (geared) or not (raw).

You won't find stereotypes at BPHAT. Their powerlifting team consists of males and females ranging from age 13 to 58 and includes a mom and two sons, a local minister and her son, a father and daughter and a paraplegic. At BPHAT, powerlifting is both strength building and relationship building. Owner Matt Brewer says, "While it's all about the individual effort, we do it as a team. Everyone cheers each other on."

Powerlifting is also an excellent way to build confidence in teens. Brewer says, "The confidence in kids that are in powerlifting is amazing. Confidence is one of the biggest things I have seen that it offers high schoolers."

BPHAT's USPA (United States Powerlifting Association) powerlifting team has set 3 world records, 6 national records and at least a dozen state records.

At the Battle of the Bay 5 competition in February in Tampa, 9 BPHAT lifters competed in the 3-day competition and all returned with medals: 7 first place medals, 1 second place medal and 1 third place medal. Two lifters qualified for Orlando Europa USPA Powerlifting Championships on Saturday, April 13. Both won Gold in their divisions.



#### **Hosta Perennials:** Low Maintenance and Excellent Coverage

If you're exploring alternatives to traditional grass and want a beautiful low-maintenance yard, then the Hosta perennial may be perfect for you!

Hosta is a genus of plants which belongs to the lily family and retail for about \$15 at your local nursery. They come in different sizes and colors including shades of green, blue, yellow and white. Before you plant it, learn how much sunlight your Hosta can receive and make sure you leave enough room for it to spread into a full-sized plant. Soil should be kept moist, but not wet and morning watering is best. Mulch can be very helpful with keeping the soil moist. Don't forget to fertilize each Spring.

LOW maintenance doesn't mean NO maintenance! Hostas can be vulnerable to deer, slugs, and snails. Use fencing or plant daffodils around your Hostas to keep the deer away and scatter crushed eggshells to deter slugs and snails. A light scattering of sand or sawdust will work too.



Hostas are just one good choice of landscaping. Groundcovers are the gardener's best friend so challenge yourself by increasing your planting beds up to 10% each year and you will realize after a few years that you love your lawn and garden more!

After 34 years of teaching orchestra, Sandy Neel will soon be retiring from Burns Middle School as one of Hillsborough Counties longest tenured teachers. Her impact on students and our community is far-reaching.

As a pioneer of string instrument education in Hillsborough County, she was vital in creating the curriculum for the performing arts wheel. She also served as Founder of the Hillsborough All County Orchestra and is a former conductor for the Tampa Bay Youth Orchestra and the Patel Conservatory Youth Orchestra.

She led by example as an active member of the Rosewood Quartet, a local string quartet that performed at events and fundraisers. Each year Mrs. Neel's orchestras earned superior performance ratings at the Florida Orchestra Association Music Performance Assessments, Solo & Ensemble music festivals, and she consistently had students place positions in All State and All County orchestras.

Her talents are truly endless – from being a black belt in taekwondo to raising show goats - and her love for Star Wars is like no other. At her core, Neel's genuine love for teaching her students made her students want to do better. If you know her, she has lots of "Neelisms" but you know her favorite motto, "Don't practice until you get it right, practice until you can't get it wrong." Her saying and her devotion motivated many students to come in early for additional practice.

Mrs. Neel conducted her last concert with Burns' orchestra on April 25 at Bloomingdale High School. Surrounded by life-long friends, family and students (past and present), the show was both spectacular and emotional.

Burns Middle School Principal, Matthew DiPrima stated "Sandy Neel is an inspiring and special person. She is the light when there may be darkness. I would end up in her classroom when I needed a respite at work. Her orchestra classes would always bring a smile to my face and a hop to my step. She is truly 'The BEST leading the REST'."

Room 139 at Burns will soon be empty of Mrs. Neel's "Neelisms" but her legacy there will live on forever.


