Neighborhood Snapshot River Crossing Estates

River Crossing Estates is a mandatory HOA neighborhood tucked back along the Alafia River just south of the Golf Course. This neighborhood boasts 181 one- and two-story homes on River Field Ct, River Overlook Dr, Winding River Dr, W River Ct, Vista River Dr. The average square footage is 2326, mostly one-story with

approximately 30 two-story homes. Most of the homes accommodate 4 bedrooms. The homes were built between 1996 and 2002. Over the past year, six homes have sold at an average sales price of \$318,000 or \$134 per square foot. Five of the six were pool homes and five of the six homes had 3-car garages. The average days on the market over the past year was 19 days!

REQUIRED LEGAL NOTICE EXPLAINED

In June, the District mailed a county-required legal notice of a public hearing to be held on Monday, July 8, at 6:15p.m. at the District office. Based on some responses received, some confusion still remains in the community. To clarify:

- 1 The letter is a **legal requirement** to notify residents of the upcoming public hearing on July 8.
- 2. The non-ad valorem tax assessment is paid as a part of your Hillsborough County property tax bill and has been for over 30 years.
- 3. The last tax assessment increase was 12 years ago, which is why some residents have never seen a letter like this before.
- 4. The current tax assessment increase was voted on in a Referendum last August and passed with a majority of votes. This increase is \$40~from \$130 to \$170 per year.
- 5. The increase will be reflected as a line item on your next property tax bill and is **not a new tax** nor does it require any separate payment or action.
- 6. The tax assessment dollars **maintain all common areas in the District:** mowing, landscaping, irrigation, electric and lighting at entrance ways, tree trimming, and signs. It is also used for Holiday decorations and the new Off-Duty HCSO patrols in Bloomingdale.
- 7. The tax assessment dollars are **NOT used for** the Bell Shoals widening or Natures Way improvements, nor for any road or sidewalk repairs.
- 8. Tax assessment dollars are not "sat" on. The District follows the policies and guidelines required by the State of Florida and Hillsborough County, including strict budgeting requirements that only allow for a limited amount of funds to be carried over each fiscal year.
- 9. The language of the letter is the County's required legal language and not intended as any type of threat by the District.
- 10. These dollars stay in Bloomingdale and benefit ONLY Bloomingdale.

Some of the confusion stems from a process that would appear to be conducted backwards. The assessment increase was a Referendum on the August 2018 ballot voted upon by Bloomingdale residents and passed by a majority vote. From referendum vote to hearing notice mailing to the public hearing on Monday, the District has followed all legal requirements mandated by Hillsborough County and the State of Florida. Each of these steps was advertised at least 2 weeks in advance in the Tampa Bay Times, the Bloomingdale Gazette, and on the District's website.

Well Drilling

Many of you have noticed the well-drilling activity near Heritage Park and the dying turf along Erindale. The well at the Heritage Park entrance had reached its lifespan and had to be backfilled and a new well dug to provide water for irrigation to that area of the community. There have been some difficulties while bringing the new well online and these are being addressed with our landscape and maintenance contractor. The board appreciates your patience – especially our neighbors in Heritage Park.

In the Know: What to do about Red Light Citations

Though intended to reduce the number of drivers disobeying traffic signals, the red light traffic citations in Hillsborough County also present stress and confusion for people who receive a citation.

Two of the biggest traffic citation sites in the County include the Bloomingdale Avenue/Bell Shoals Road intersection and the mall entrance on Highway 60 and Brandon Town Center Drive.

If you do receive a citation, take these simple steps:

1. Read the Whole Citation

The citation should include an image of the car, the license plate, and a website link that will show a video image of the violation. If none of the images/videos match the car, contact the government body that sent the citation (either Hillsborough County or the city of Tampa) and request a hearing.

2. Confirm Who Was Driving

Florida law dictates that the owner of the vehicle accepts responsibility for the citation even if they weren't driving the vehicle at the time of the citation. In other words, if your brother borrowed the car and ran a red light, you're still responsible. However, you do have the option of transferring liability to the actual driver, but it has to be done within a time frame listed on the citation and you'll have to inform the County or the city of the transfer of liability.

3. Be Sure It's Not You

If you request a hearing, you may be required to pay an additional fee to cover the costs of holding the hearing. So if the image, license plate, and video clearly shows your vehicle running a red light, it might be simpler to just pay the fine. But remember, the option to appear before an official might allow you the chance to present an argument that could end with the citation being dismissed. And even if you end up having to pay the citation to the County, no points will be deducted from your driving record and your insurance should not be affected.

We have all seen posts on the Bloomingdale Neighborhood Community Page, the Nextdoor app and Lost and Found Pets of Hillsborough County about missing pets. While they all tug at our heart-strings, none of those posts got the outpouring of community involvement like the one for Sammy Berntsen.

The Berntsen Family reported Sammy, a 5lb Maltese dog, missing on May 25. Jon, Heather and their son Nikolai had their worst nightmare come true when Sammy was discovered missing from the family's backyard.

Sammy is more than just the family pet. He is also a medical therapy dog for six-year-old Nikolai.

Once the loss was discovered, the family immediately started the search. First, they went door to door asking neighbors if they had seen the wayward pup. Then came the social media posts. Thousands literally shared and reshared the posts providing substantial clues and information regarding the dog's whereabouts.

The family made signs and offered a reward for Sammy's safe return. Heather even went so far as standing on the corner of Natures Way and Culbreath with signs and stopping cars asking if they had seen their dog. Much of this effort happened within the first 24 hours.

Many residents became involved most notably Bloomingdale High School student and Somerset resident, Nicholas Klaeren, who started a Go Fund Me. Nick wanted to help the family with either the reward money or to ease the financial burden if the family had to get a new therapy dog for Nikolai. Thank goodness the latter wasn't needed.

The family had given up all hope of ever seeing Sammy again when on May 30 a Hillsborough County Deputy pulled up with Sammy in the front seat of his patrol car. Jon who was working in the yard couldn't believe his eyes and yelled for Heather and Nikolai to hurry outside. After following several leads the Deputy found Sammy, a bit traumatized but in otherwise good health.

The family overcome with joy, cried happy tears and couldn't believe that Sammy was home. According to Nikolai, he and Sammy once again were like two peas in a pod.

On June 2, Nicholas presented the family with the \$200 he received from the Go Fund Me campaign. The family in turn donated the money to the Humane Society of Tampa Bay. The Humane Society is building a new facility to expand their no kill shelter, provide pet outreach and re-homing capabilities.

The Berntsen family would like to thank each and everyone of you who helped, in any way that you could, to bring their furry family member back home!

(Reporter's Note: Despite all the posts on various social media outlets about traffic woes and construction, we have an awesome community of strangers, neighbors and friends who came together to help a fellow Bloomingdale family in need. I, for one, am proud to be a Bloomingdale resident!)



Perhaps Heather Bernsten said it best in her FB post, excerpted:

"An enormous heartfelt thank you goes out to this amazing community including the officers of the HCSO! The positive reinforcement and help with searching was enormous! We live in an amazing place where the vast majority are fantastic people. We must always be vigilant and even more importantly, look out for one another. There are no strangers just friends we haven't met yet. I am just so humbled by the outpouring of help and compassion. Love to you all."
