



Online portal lets residents report issues to help improve roadway safety in Hillsborough County.

Hillsborough County maintains over 140,000 signs on more than 6,000 miles of roadway. County staff cannot be aware of every sign in need of repair. Residents and commuters are asked to keep a watchful eye on the condition of signs in their neighborhood and along the roads they drive every day.

See a damaged, knocked-down, vandalized, or missing sign? See a sign that is not visible due to an overhanging tree? Let County know www. hillsboroughcounty.org/en/report-a-missing-or-damaged-traffic-sign.

After normal business hours, damage to the following signs only: "Stop", "One Way", "Do Not Enter", "Yield" and "Wrong Way" can be reported to the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office at 813-247-8200.


When you purchase a home in Hillsborough County, there are land development code requirements that irrigation professionals are expected to follow. The requirements listed are important to achieve an efficient irrigation system. In Florida, turfgrass needs ½" to ¾" of water twice a week during the spring and summer growing season. These two design features are important. They ensure that underwatered or overwatered spaces within the irrigation zone area, are at a minimum.



## Letting both of our eyes control the distance...

The amateur putter doesn't miss the hole three feet wide left or right. They miss it three feet short or long. The length of your putting stroke should dictate the distance your ball travels.

Let our eyes do the hard work by taking practice strokes while looking at the hole. Your eyes will tell your brain, how far back and through your hands need to go to get the ball to the hole.

Now let your actual stroke have equal distance back and through with the same tempo back and through as your practice strokes.

Taking your practice strokes from behind the ball involves both eyes to get the needed calculating information to the brain



#### School's in, help keep our kids safe by obeying ALL traffic laws.

Schools are open and the school buses are full. Traffic is back to the normal congestion and this means our drives to work will take longer. Be patient! Traffic laws that protect our kids must be followed by all of us! With school back in session there are specific rules that are critical for our kids' safety and are very expensive if broken.

#### These include:

School Busses - Drivers MUST stop in both directions for school busses when those busses are stopped on a road with no median dividers (example Bloomingdale Avenue in most areas). When you don't stop, you put our kids in danger. Also, slow down and keep a safe distance between you and other vehicles including those busses.

<u>School Zones/Crosswalks</u> – Do not speed through school zones. There are no excuses for speeding, and it puts our children in danger. Speeding fines are DOUBLED in school zones. Do not block a crosswalk. We need this area for our children to safely cross the roadway.

<u>Teens</u> – Sit down with your teen driver and emphasize the importance of obeying all traffic laws and using seat belts. We've lost too many teens to auto accidents in which teens were not buckled up.

#### Fines

Most traffic citations can also increase your auto insurance rates and can stay on your policy for at least 3 years.

Failure to stop for a school bus - \$268
Speeding in a school zone - \$303.00
Child restraint violations - \$163.00
Not wearing your seat belt - \$113.00

## **HART System In Bloomingdale**By Joe Harless

Even with the ongoing construction in the area, Bloomingdale residents can still get around using HART, Hillsborough Area Regional Transit.



The *Osprey Observer* reported back in January that HART had made changes to its Cross-Country Limited Express (LX) routes, 25LX and 60 LX. Now Bloomingdale/Valrico bus riders can make use of HART's Route 60LX at the Campo YMCA on Culbreath Road. That route will then go onto Nature's Way, exit onto Bell Shoals Road, and then swing back onto Bloomingdale Avenue before heading for the Tampa International Airport (TIA).

Buses run on the hour and cost riders \$2 each way. By comparison, a one-way ride to TIA from Valrico using a shuttle service can cost just under \$90. Supershuttle, www. supershuttle.com/, offers a shared ride van service for approximately \$37, allowing up to two bags per rider, curbside pickup/desk in baggage claim drop-off and no costs for tolls.

When not using Route 60LX, the HART Flex system route can be accessed between Kings Avenue and Providence Road on Bloomingdale Avenue, which allows riders to switch buses for Routes 8 and 31. Route 31 connects to Routs 37 and 46, and Route 8 goes to downtown Tampa, granting the rider access to several other routes. Commuters in our area are familiar with 25LX which is a weekday route to and from various Tampa stops.

New route schedules can be found at goHart.org, on the buses, or by mail. For more information, call the HART information line at 813-254-4278.

Interestingly, the Tampa Bay Area Regional Transit Authority, which serves Hernando, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, and Pinellas counties, has reportedly been considering a cable-propelled transit system and air taxis as possible future transportation options, although the organization currently has no plans to enact or use those options.

#### The Monarch Migration Is Upon Us

Now that Fall is upon us, it's time to look up in the sky and catch a glimpse of majestic monarch butterflies returning south to their winter homes.

#### Migration

Monarch butterflies simply cannot survive cold winters. Also, the change of seasons results in a decline of their primary food source, milkweed. During migration, monarchs can travel between 50 – 100 miles per day. Their full journey can take up to two months to complete. In Spring, monarchs return north. The monarch is the only insect known to make a two-way migration as birds do.

#### Annual Life Cycle

The annual life cycle of all monarch butterflies consists of four generations, with the fourth generation being slightly different than the other three. The first three generations will die after two to six weeks. The fourth-generation butterflies are the ones that migrate south in the Fall to warmer climates and will live for six to eight months. The cycle repeats, and the fourth generation returns North in the Spring.


#### Butterfly Festival

On Oct. 26, St Mark's National Wildlife Refuge will hold its annual Monarch Butterfly Festival. Admission to the refuge is \$5.00 and the Festival is free. The Festival offers educational demonstrations, wildlife exhibitions and entertainment. An ongoing activity for children is monarch tagging. The tags and tagging process do not harm the butterflies, and the data collected have the potential to answer many important questions about monarch biology and conservation. St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge is located at 1255 Lighthouse Road, St. Marks, Florida (http://www.stmarksrefuge.org/).

If you find a tagged monarch, you can report it to Monarch Watch at the University of Kansas. They have been collecting data since 1992 (https://www.monarchwatch.org/).




### Back to the Books



#### **Bloomingdale High to Host High School Music Festival**

Two more judges will assess the visual performance and the overall effect of the show. All bands will be looking to match or improve scores earned during last year's festival.

Bloomingdale's Director of Bands, Jon Sever, keen to welcome the public to witness the shows, said, "[The MPA] gives the public a chance to see how hard these kids have been working. Spectators will be able to enjoy a wide range of marching styles during the performances."

Showcasing all of the bands in the county will be an all-day event. Tickets can be purchased on the day of the event for \$10 or less. Spectators will be able to choose from a variety of concessions items and food vendors during the festival. Starting performance time will be around 1 pm.
