Soon, the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association will become the Bloomingdale Neighborhood Association. We are changing our name, but not our services and programs.

Truth be told... we have learned through our history which began in 1980 that we have never been a "true" homeowners association. Developers in the 80's and 90's failed to submit paperwork to county to make the BNA a mandatory master HOA.

Our name change is a positive step to make our organization a true representation of what it is and does. Our by-laws and articles of incorporation clearly define our purpose:

"The voluntary Association's primary purpose is to promote neighborhood cohesion and harmony while protecting property values and the quality of life of residents. This is accomplished through programs and services spearheaded by a volunteer Board of Directors.

- a) Goals and objectives include but are not limited to:
- 1. Providing a communication focal point through email, the Bloomingdale Gazette, webpage and social media, as well as periodic mailings to Members.
- 2. Providing a voice for the community by acting as a liaison with governmental agencies and institutions, businesses and schools in and around our area.
- 3. Encouraging and facilitating active resident participation in all quality of life issues affecting our community, including land use, transportation, safety and security matters.
- 4. Organizing neighborhood activities including community clean-up events, garage sales, festivals, and holiday events.
- 5. Maintaining a strong partnership with schools by providing community service hours for youth, scholarship opportunities, and youth improvement/education programs.
- 6. Establishing a neighborhood standards program based on county codes to maintain neighborhood aesthetics and to keep the community a great place to live, work and call home."

It will take some time to convert all our name changes, website, social media, etc. Please know we still need your support! We are still an information resource for residents who need assistance. We don't know all the answers, but we usually know where to go and who to ask for assistance.

Why are we changing our name? Easy, HOA means many things to many people - some positive, some negative. We want no confusion as to what we are – a voluntary organization that works to promote harmony and cohesion in our community. Rather than an HOA, we are more akin to a civic association. "A civic association is a type of organization whose official goal is to improve neighborhoods through volunteer work by its members." (Wikipedia)

We do hope residents embrace our new name, increase our membership by joining and be more active as we move forward.

Social Distancing Seaside Can Be Easily Navigated

Our early September trip to the Canadian Rockies was canceled due to COVID-19's unwelcome appearance, so my husband Phil and I decided to seek a safer destination closer to home.

There is no reason why you can't find a way to balance your personal safety with the need for that coveted change of scenery. A trip to the beach has the capacity to calm the frazzled feelings we've all experienced since last March.

Lucky to have such great beaches so close to home, we decided to rent a house overlooking the Gulf for five nights. Two other Bloomingdale area couples joined us. We chose Anna Maria Beach on the north end of Anna Maria Island. With its white sand beaches reminiscent of baby powder, it was the perfect place to dip our toes into the surf.

Anna Maria Beach is mostly residential, but it's easy to find condo and home rentals via VRBO or Airbnb. It has a quiet feel with plenty of space on the beach to social distance. It's a great place for families to spend time together.

Early morning walks on the beach were a reminder that despite COVID-19 and all the other negative news, the sun still rises and nature is king. It was hatching season for the Loggerhead baby turtles. Volunteers were out helping the ones who couldn't seem to find their way towards the surf. Sadly, only about 1 in 1000 babies survive into adulthood so this extra help can be crucial to the species survival. The babies are so small and can fit in your palm, but don't touch them; it's against the law. Watching them make their way, fighting the surf and then finally heading out to sea, was therapeutic in ways I can't begin to explain.

There's plenty to do or just relax on the beach with a great book. One day we chose to go on a boat ride to visit Egmont Key. We rented a private boat with a captain through Salty Dolphin Tours. It also offered tours which were not private. Even on those tours, the company limits the numbers on each trip.

We ate out at three local restaurants. The Sandbar is right on the beach and great for watching sunsets, but if you do plan to stay for it, I would suggest making sure that you have protection against the mosquitos and No See Ums. Currently, the Sandbar only has outdoor seating. About five blocks away on the bay side, near the City Pier, is the Waterfront Restaurant. You can eat inside or outdoors, where you have a view of the bay. The last place that we tried was in Holmes Beach, The Ugly Grouper. This was located right off the main road and only outdoors. The food was great and there was a duo playing music. It had a great tropical feel despite not being on the beach. If you rent a condo or house, you also have the option to cook your own meals.

There is not much that can't be fixed by a few days beachside. Mid-week and non-holiday times work best for a quiet visit. For more information on Anna Maria Island, visit https://annamariaisland.com.



Halloween 2020 Staying Safe in a COVID-19 World

Halloween – Chills and scares, all light-hearted, mark this annual tradition. This year though, a real scare is out there in the form of COVID-19. Experts say the holiday can be observed, but adhering to safety precautions is a must to minimize the risk of contracting the virus.

- If you have or have been exposed to the virus...Do not participate in the festivities!
- Generally, activities with household members or neighbors, at a safe distance, are considered lower risk. These include house decorating, scavenger hunts, movie night and, of course, pumpkin carving.
- Moderate risk activities include trick or treating with grab and go goodie bags, open air haunted forest, and small outdoor parades and costume parties with social distancing and mask rules in place.
- If people are screaming, greater distancing is advised. The greater the distance, the lower the risk of spreading a respiratory virus.
- At pumpkin patches, use hand sanitizer before touching pumpkins and produce.
- Higher risk activities include door-to-door trick or treating, large activities held indoor including parties and haunted house, and trunkor-treating. Using safety precautions and social distancing should help mitigate some of the trick or treating risks. Some recommend using latex gloves to pass out candy to the neighborhood kids.

And finally, a last word on masks and costumes:

- Do not use costume masks in place of cloth masks
- Do not use a costume mask (such as for Halloween) as a substitute
 - for a cloth mask unless it is made of two or more layers of breathable fabric that covers your mouth and nose and doesn't leave gaps around your face.
- Do not wear a costume mask over a cloth mask because it can be dangerous if the costume mask makes it hard to breathe. Instead, consider using a Halloweenthemed cloth mask.



The bottom line: MAKE SAFETY THE PRIORITY! Stress the importance of masks, social distancing, frequent hand-washing and other safety measures with your children and set the example!

And, Have a "Boo!"-tiful Halloween, Bloomingdale!

This time of year, it is not uncommon to find injured birds or wildlife in our neighborhoods. If you find an animal in distress, the Raptor Center of Tampa Bay is happy to help. They are a local solution for injured wildlife. While they focus on birds of prey, they rescue all native Florida wildlife.

Nancy Murrah, Raptor Center President and Wildlife Rehabilitator, welcomes Bloomingdale residents to call the Raptor Center when an injured animal is found. Call 813-205-1851.

"Right now we have 10 baby squirrels.

We really work to put animals with people that can help that species. We take anything in. Then we get them to who can rehabilitate with them."

The Raptor Center of Tampa Bay often releases animals in Bloomingdale. On several recent occasions, the center released Eastern Screech Owls in a field close to Culbreath Road.

"If you look at what we do, in a nutshell, it would be that we rescue, rehabilitate, raise and release. The goal is to release."

Bulls Win September Games

Bloomingdale Bulls Football surprised the region by beating two perennial Tampa Bay powerhouse teams in their first two games. Living up to their team motto, Tough People Win (#TPW), the team played tough, never quitting, despite being underdogs and having to come from behind to win.

Before the first game on Sept. 11, Bloomingdale was a 30-point underdog to Armwood. They stunned the Armwood Hawks beating them at Bloomingdale 15-14. Senior and University of Southern California (USC) cornerback commit, Philip Riley ran 53 yards for a game winning touchdown on a kickoff return to deliver the winning touchdown for Bloomingdale.

Armwood had not lost to a Tampa Bay opponent since Aug. 24, 2018.

Bloomingdale's second game of the season on Sept. 25 was an away game at Tampa Bay Tech. Despite winning the last two meetings in the series, Bloomingdale was ranked behind Tampa Bay Tech. Prior to the game, Tampa Bay Tech was ranked 17th in the state and Bloomingdale was 20th in the state.

Even with a third quarter 22-0 deficit, the Bulls never gave up. They scored 19 points in the final 11 minutes. That alone is outstanding. But the final play of the game occurred as time expired. Quarterback Tre Simmons threw a 28-yard pass to WR Agiye Hall on the last play. Hall, an Alabama commit, made his catch in the left corner of the endzone in between three Tampa Bay Tech defenders to secure the Bulls win: 25-22.

As of Sept. 27, the Bulls are ranked 12th in the state and 3rd in Class 7A.
