"Operation Pond Fountain"



A tri-colored heron once again enjoys the restored pond fountain.

At Bloomingdale Avenue and Lithia Pinecrest Road in Valrico is the Creste Pointe Towne Shoppes. The shopping center boasts two large water ponds, each with a beautiful pond fountain.

For several months one pond fountain was "AWOL." This "AWOL" pond fountain was between the Walmart Supercenter parking lot and Wendy's. My wife and I wondered why this pond fountain was "AWOL" for so long.

We decided something had to be done.

Armed with an Apple iPhone 11 with fantastic camera lenses, a Canon Power Shot SX530 HS Camera with telephoto lenses and at home a Dell desktop computer with the Windows 10 Photo App, I decided to "take action." I gathered intelligence and background on these beautiful ponds and fountains from the Internet.

With my research completed, I then emailed the Hillsborough County Commissioners and filed a complaint on this "AWOL" pond fountain. The Hillsborough County Environmental Protection Commission (EPC) staff began corresponding with plaza management. Those efforts resulted in timely action and repair of the fountain.

Although the EPC does not regulate stormwater pond fountains, the EPC staff went above and beyond to assist in restoring the fountain. EPC's mission is "to protect our natural resources, environment and quality of life in Hillsborough County."

Extremely helpful in the overall success and support of Operation Pond Fountain, in alphabetical order, was the Hillsborough County Government, Tampa Audubon Society and the University of South Florida (School of Geosciences, College of Arts & Sciences - USF Water Institute).

As cars made their way through the Campo Y parking lot, smiles were everywhere.

The Campo Y Trunk or Treat event, which took place on Oct. 23, had to be reimagined due to COVID-19. 
