





Holiday Observances Available to Students Regardless of Faith

Many religions have holy days for the faithful to observe or celebrate. Nevertheless, many widely accepted observances across the country, such as Christmas and Easter, are affiliated with Christianity. Florida is no exception. This is despite the fact that according to JewishVirtualLibrary.org, Florida is home to more than 650,000 Jewish people. The World Population Review website also indicates that Florida is among the top ten U.S. states with the largest Muslim populations – ranked 7th – having 877 Muslims per 100,000 people, or over 190,000 Muslims. Given these large numbers, there are likely many non-Christian students throughout Florida who do not see time off on their school calendars for their religious observances.

At Bloomingdale Senior High School, sophomore Ireland Newport had a bit of a struggle with this issue. Newport has been actively practicing Judaism for over a year, and she said having to take off days for services required some extra effort. According to Newport, she had to get a note from her rabbi and take it to the Student Affairs Office to take time off from school. "I think there is just an issue with the amount of work I have to go through for essentially a doctor's note," Newport said.

Bloomingdale High School Principal Dr. Marcos Rodriguez said he advises students to visit the Hillsborough County School District website at HillsboroughSchools.org to see the school district calendar for information about holidays and observances affecting all students.

To help students and staff take time off to observe holy days not listed on the calendar, Rodriguez encouraged them to speak to people in school administration, such as people working in student affairs.

Omar Erchid, a Tampa attorney and Muslim who graduated from a public high school in Florida, had a different experience. Erchid said that he just needed to give the school a prior notice before taking off to observe Muslim holidays. These notices were typically accepted, he said.

Given the number of people in the U.S. who identify as Christian, Erchid said he could see why preference is often given to Christian holidays on the school calendar.

"It's understandable that the big Christian holidays – Christmas, Easter, and the other ones – are holidays, because those people, whether religiously or culturally, will be observing those days," Erchid said. "Would it be nice for schools to be closed on Muslim holidays? I'm sure it would be. But I think for Muslims, as long as they're able take those days off with no penalty and be able to make up their work – I don't speak for all Muslims, but for myself, I'm fine with that."

Cimino Care Bears Program Provides Comfort for Families in Need

From December 8-10, Cimino Elementary collected new and gently used stuffed animals to support local first responders. The donations will be given to first responders to use to comfort children in traumatic situations.

Sergeant Shannon Ostojic was thrilled with the gifts from Cimino.

"Here at the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office, we are honored to partner with Cimino Elementary students, teachers, and parents to provide stuffed animals to families suffering from a traumatic event," Ostojic said.

Early in 2021, the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office received a federal grant for victim specialists to aid and support to victims and witnesses of serious crimes. The Victim Specialist Unit aims to be the first source of help to victims of crime.

Ostojic said that the Victim Specialist Unit bridges a gap between the trauma and need. The stuffed animals from Cimino families will make an immediate difference in difficult situations.

"The toys that were so generously provided by Cimino Elementary, were given to the Victim Specialists Section so they can in turn provide comfort to children and families experiencing hardship and loss. We thank everyone for their donations and generosity," Ostojic said.




