
The next step in the Nature's Way median project is underway. The District, in partnership with the University of Florida, is undertaking a two-fold landscaping plan for the medians. This plan includes the installation and planting of a St. Augustine hybrid turf and a sub-surface irrigation system.

The new sod, developed in part by the University of Florida, requires less water and is more resistant to major disease. The irrigation system is a sub-surface drip system and will come from three different irrigation manufacturers. University scientists will closely monitor the systems and collect data for future studies. New soil will also be brought in as part of the project.

This is a win-win for both the District and UF scientists. Residents will enjoy new lower maintenance turf at a reduced cost to the District and the university will gather valuable information for future turf grass lines.

In other news, the ground work is complete at the Oakcrest entrances off of Erindale. The walls have been stripped and painted and landscapers are ready to plant palm trees, shrubs and new sod.

At first glance, Tampa Fresh Foods looks like your average grocery store. However, every item in the store is a work of art and nothing is edible. When you take a close look, you will be amazed at the product details.

Tampa Fresh Foods is an art exhibition by British artist Lucy Sparrow. The fully functioning supermarket contains over 50,000 items made of felt and took over two years to create. The store is interactive. Visitors can browse the aisles and shop. All of the items in the store are for sale and can be picked up and felt.

"My inspiration is real life—really, just absolutely real life. If I can encapsulate real life in anything I do with felt, I'm happy," Lucy said.

Lucy said she especially enjoyed making items that are specific to the Tampa area. Florida specialty items include citrus fruits, Cuban sandwiches, Cigar City and Tampa Brewing Company beer, Tampa Bay Rays peanuts, a seafood counter, and cigars displayed in a humidor room to give the customers an authentic experience.

When asked about her favorite part of the Tampa show, Lucy said, "The sea food really made me super happy. I found it very challenging and that was a lot of fun."

Lucy replicated the iconic Tampa Postcard Mural out of felt. The mural took two weeks to complete.

If you still have room for dessert, visit Grandma Brown's Cinnamon Roll, which will offer a Caramel Apple Cinnamon Roll. Check out the website for the many other food choices.

Plenty of entertainment will take place during the fair each day. On the Florida Stage, you can catch the Dennis Lee Band offering a blend of comedy, country music, rock and roll and patriotic songs. Adults and kids alike will enjoy the Hollywood Circus under the Big Top. The Community Showcase will present local performers from across the state. Head over to the Five Points Stage where Jay Mattiolo will entertain you with the wonders of magic. This is just a sampling of the many types of entertainment you can catch throughout each day. Thrill seekers can look forward to spending time on the midway, which is the largest in the United States.



You could spend a whole day just visiting all of the exhibits. From everyone's favorite, Cracker Country, where you can immerse yourself in the life of a Florida pioneer to coming face to face with Twigs the Giraffe and his friends at the Giraffic Menagerie Petting Zoo, there's something for everyone.

The Florida State Fairgrounds is located at 4800 US Hwy. 301N in Tampa. General admission for adults is \$10. Senior admission is \$8 on weekdays; February 10, 11, 14-18 and children 6-11 are \$6. Ages 5 and under are free. Parking is free. The gates open at 11 a.m. weekdays and 10 a.m. on weekends. Closing times are subject to change pending weather and other conditions. Alderman's Ford Conservation Park Offers Easy Hiking & More

This Florida winter day was somewhat gray, but very warm for the season; the perfect time for a walk in the park. My husband was not interested in joining me so I made the trip solo. Because I was alone, I wanted to go to a place where there were other people nearby, but where I could still enjoy some solitude. I chose Alderman's Ford Park, which is also part of this year's Hillsborough County Hiking Spree and is less than a twenty minute drive from the Bloomingdale area.

There is a loop trail not quite two miles long that almost anyone can do. The mostly-shaded trail is paved so it works well for both strollers and wheelchairs. It is also dog and bike-friendly. I had done this loop many times before, so this time I also wanted to focus on some of the offshoot dirt trails, which are also good for beginners to navigate.

I took the Red Trail, which can be reached a few hundred yards from the parking lot just past where the loop trail begins. It's not a hard trail, but there are some tricky parts about halfway in near the river where you have to



really pay attention to follow the trail and climb over a few tree limbs. The nice views of the river make it worth the hike, and it ends up back on to the main trail further down.

I strayed off the loop trail again to follow some of the Blue Trail toward the primitive camping sites that are available at the park. I only did a small portion of this 1 ½ mile trail, which was flat and sandy. The White Trail is located to the left of the parking area over the bridge that is located right past restrooms. This trail is flat and easy to navigate too.

Back in 1848, settler James Alderman built his homestead south of the Alafia River in Lithia. He fashioned a crossing by cutting down the steep banks of the river, creating Alderman's Ford, now home to the park.

There are two entrances to the park. The main entrance is located at 100 Alderman Fords Dr. (off Rt. 39) and the canoe launch, which is located at 9625 Canoe Launch Dr. in Lithia. The cost to enter the park is \$2 per vehicle.


