COMMUNITY TRAFFIC AND SAFETY

These station notes include information about traffic laws and safety issues to help residents be more informed. Find information about your neighborhood on the Hillsborough County Sheriff's website:

BICYCLES: (316.2065 fss) The bicycle statue has a lot in it. At the top of the list, if you're riding on the road, you must follow all the same laws as a vehicle. Stopping for stop signs, signaling, yielding right of way to pedestrian etc. Bicycles shall be equipped with a lamp on the front exhibiting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet. And a rear red lamp visible from 600 feet. If you must ride in the road, be visible and follow all related traffic laws. Always follow the flow of traffic. For more detail see 316.2065

PEDESTRIANS: (316.130 fss) traffic regulations.

(1) A pedestrian shall obey the instructions of any official traffic control device specifically applicable to the pedestrian unless otherwise directed by a police officer.

(2) Pedestrians shall be subject to traffic control signals at intersections as provided in s. 316.075, but at all other places pedestrians shall be accorded the privileges and be subject to the restrictions stated in this chapter.

(3) Where sidewalks are provided, no pedestrian shall, unless required by other circumstances, walk along and upon the portion of a roadway paved for vehicular traffic.

(4) Where sidewalks are not provided, any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall, when practicable, walk only on the shoulder on the left side of the roadway in relation to the pedestrian's direction of travel, facing traffic which may approach from the opposite direction.

(5) No person shall stand in the portion of a roadway paved for vehicular traffic for the purpose of soliciting a ride, employment, or business from the occupant of any vehicle.

(6) No person shall stand on or in proximity to a street or highway for the purpose of soliciting the watching or guarding of any vehicle while parked or about to be parked on a street or highway.

(7)(a) The driver of a vehicle at an intersection that has a traffic control signal in place shall stop before entering the crosswalk and remain stopped to allow a pedestrian, with a permitted signal, to cross a roadway when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk or steps into the crosswalk and is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling or when the

pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger.

It is strongly suggested that runners and bicyclist protect themselves by wearing light colored or reflective clothing. If you must walk in the road, you should be facing traffic.

SCHOOL BUS: Know when you must stop for a school bus. (316.172 fss) "The driver of a vehicle upon a divided highway with an unpaved space of at least 5 feet, a raised median, or a physical barrier is not required to stop when traveling in the opposite direction of a school bus which is stopped in accordance with the provisions of this section." Anything other than the before mentioned must stop for all school buses while they are loading children. ** Remember school will be out for summer so watch out for our children as they will be in the neighborhood more often. **

GOLF CARTS: There are no places on county roads or roadways of the Bloomingdale area that are legal to drive a "golf cart" period. This also includes 4 wheelers, buggies, go carts etc. However, there are some vehicles which have similar appearances which are legal. These vehicles must have lights, blinkers, and break lights amongst other safety devices. They have speed limits and can only be used on roads where the speed 35 or less. They must have a current tag issued by DMV and have insurances. These are not your normal golf cart. They are registered with the DMV.

AREA LAW AND ORDER

During the past four months there have been over 430 traffic stops conducted in Bloomingdale east and west. Sixty-five (65) traffic crashes. Eight (8) DUI investigations conducted. Eight (8) vehicle burglaries. Three (3) residential burglaries. Remember to keep your vehicle locked and valuables put away. Seeds of Faith Community Garden Presented Award by the University of Florida

Seeds of Faith Community Garden, located at Bay Life Church in Brandon, was awarded the 2021 Florida-Friendly Landscaping: Community Garden Category award, presented by the University of Florida IFAS Extension.

The Community Garden category award is a state-wide award with recognition made over a two year period. Lynn Barber, an agent for the Florida Friendly Landscape Program sponsored by University of Florida, Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, presented the award on Saturday, May 14. Lynn share this about Seeds of Faith during the presentation:

"Seeds of Faith Community Garden follows Florida-Friendly Landscaping[™] principles to conserve resources and enhance horticultural success. Seeds of Faith Community Garden grows and donates nutritious fruits and vegetables to people in need, producing over 2,000 lbs. of edibles per growing year. Produce is primarily donated to ECHO and Hope for Her. Plants provide refuge for pollinators while the site provides refuge for protected gopher tortoises. Additionally, the garden serves as an educational resource for Hillsborough County residents/students of all ages."

"It was really special to receive the recognition for all the hard work and service to the community that our garden receives from its growers. Thanks to all and thank you, Jackie Rivas, for nominating us!" said Steve McKinnon, Seeds of Faith Garden Secretary.

Seeds of Faith reached 1,850lbs of produce so far in 2022 and has limited harvesting left for the season. This summer they will be planting four to five beds of sweet potatoes on the



Shopping, Nature, and Great Food Awaits in Mount Dora

Visit Mount Dora for Relaxing Getaway

A recent visit to Mount Dora was both relaxing and enjoyable. The town, founded in 1880, is just shy of two hours by car from Bloomingdale. With its 'hilly' elevation at 184 feet above sea level, it feels reminiscent of a New England town. In fact, you will find Lobster Rolls and other regional delights throughout town.

My husband and I stayed for two nights at the Lakeside Inn, enjoying a room overlooking Lake Dora. The Inn, which opened in 1883, is actually the oldest continuously operating hotel in Florida. Notables such as Thomas Edison, Henry Ford and Presidents Calvin Coolidge and Dwight D. Eisenhower have stayed there. If you vacation at the Inn, you can leave your car parked and walk just about everywhere.

Whether you are interested in a romantic getaway or a girl's weekend, Mount Dora may have what you are looking for. If you are looking for late night activities, this may not be your best option.

There are great parks located near the lake and within walking distance of downtown. Palm Island Park is an eight acre preservation area where a boardwalk winds through a wooded area; sometimes hugging the lake. Dirt trails also divert away from the boardwalk allowing you a more intimate walk through the trees and plants indigenous to the area.

Right next to Palm Island is Grantham Point Park. It was created from road rubble and fill. There, you can't miss Mount Dora's most famous landmark – its lighthouse.

Get out on the lake and visit the Dora Canal. This one-mile narrow waterway separates Lake Dora from Lake Eustis and is so beautiful and serene. The grand cypress trees along the way are magnificent. Look for egrets, herons and many other birds, turtles and alligators. Two ways to enjoy the lake and canal include a two hour pontoon ride; one of the tour companies leave right from the Lakeside Inn, or if you are looking for a little more speed and excitement, book the CatBoat Adventure tour.

In downtown, shopping opportunities abound. Many of the stores boast art and gifts from local artists as well as antiques. My husband was not quite as thrilled about this, but plenty of outdoor benches await the men who wish to relax while their significant others shop. I managed to find some free moments to spend time on my own wandering in and out of the stores during our short stay.

There were many restaurants to choose from. We had breakfast one morning at a local favorite, The Highland Street Café. It is located just under a mile from downtown, but worth the trek. For dinner, we chose Pisces Rising, noted for its seafood, and then the next night we had a great meal at The Goblin Market, which was a charming and quite intimate restaurant with book-lined decor in every room. Though a little pricey, the food was wonderful and worth the splurge.

When the day ends, a visit is not complete without viewing a beautiful sunset over Lake Dora. There is something about ending your day with one of nature's finest shows.

There is no mistaking the passion and frustration felt by Representative Learned regarding Bloomingdale's and Brandon's traffic problems. As a fellow commuter of these roadways, Representative

Learned has made it an official priority to improve infrastructure and safety in the area. He opened up a little about the planning that goes into the large-scale improvements he has worked to complete like the interchange of Bloomingdale and 301. He realizes that completing large scale transportation and infrastructure changes would be easier for commuters in the summer months as there is often less traffic during this time. However, he explained, "roads must be dry for three full days before asphalt or paint can be laid." Subsequently, planning any type of roadwork during the summer months is not feasible due to those pesky afternoon showers.

Representative Learned's goal to fix our infrastructure problems does not just stop at reducing traffic. As an avid biker who has cycled the Culbreath loop, according to his GPS tracker, over 1,164 times, Learned is very proud of the work he did to add bike lanes throughout the Bloomingdale community. He excitedly explained how he is thrilled to be adding the first bike lanes to Bell Shoals Road, a project he believes is long overdue.

However, Learned conceded that there is much more work to be done besides fixing our roads. Learned, a family man who is married with twin 8-year-olds, knows better than most the struggles facing families trying to find affordable housing here in the state of Florida. Recently, he and his family tried relentlessly to find a home to buy or rent in the current market and found the process to be near impossible with properties selling over asking price and rentals being snatched up in 15 minutes or less. This coupled with rising inflation prices and stagnant wages has Learned eager to return to the state capitol to continue working toward common sense, bipartisan plans that truly impact the people in his neighborhood.

Perhaps the most surprising fact about Representative Learned is that he seems to truly enjoy hearing from the people he has been elected to represent. In an era of automated responses, Learned still believes in sitting down and talking to his constituents.
