

Stretch Zone, located at 3478 Lithia Pinecrest Rd., is a new option in your health and wellness routine. The new South Hillsborough Pipeline will be approximately 25 miles long and will range in diameter from 36 inches to 72 inches. It will start at the Tampa Bay Regional Surface Water Treatment Plant in Brandon, connect to Hillsborough County's Lithia Water Treatment Plant and end at the County's new connection point at Balm Riverview and Balm roads. 


### **Congratulations to Bloomingdale's 2022 Valedictorian and Salutatorian!**


### **Congratulations to Bloomingdale's 2022 Scholar Athletes!**

Turn the ordinary into the extraordinary, while supporting local artists, at Creative Junk Therapy. Creative Junk Therapy is a non-profit creative reuse center where your imagination can run wild as you create all kinds of cool projects by reusing or upcycling materials.

The center has three components to its mission: Art, Environment, and Therapy. The mission is to promote creativity, environmental awareness and community through reuse.

The art showcase supports local artists by consigning their artwork and hosting classes. Several of the artists are local to Bloomingdale, including Beth Smedley (Smedley Creative) and Katherine Carrier (Art Beyond the Frame). Classes by local artists are scheduled regularly. The class schedule is available on the Creative Junk Therapy website: www.creativejunktherapy.org/our-events

The center promotes environmental awareness by challenging people to reconsider what waste is. Creative Junk Therapy is part thrift store and part reuse resource. Items are collected from businesses and individuals and offered as resources for educators, artists, and creators.

Executive Director Karen Koseck said the center is making a direct impact on what is going in landfills by collecting materials that many would normally trash. To date, Creative Junk Therapy has received over 11,000 pounds of donations.

"We are promoting the concept of doing something with things so they don't go in landfills. Whether it is using it for what it is or making it into something else. We are inspiring people to see beyond what a thing is," explained Karen.








The therapy side of the center is when people get lost in creativity. The welcoming class space and 'make and take' area provide a place for people to creatively express themselves.

"Therapy comes in when you get lost in a project. You get lost in the thing you are creating and you get in touch with something deeper inside of you," said Karen.

Creative Junk Therapy opened in 2020 during the pandemic. It is run by volunteers and managed by a small board. It is located at 727 W. Lumsden Rd. in Brandon.
