## Navigator Leadership Academy Hosted Under the Sea Art Show

On April 27, students and families from Navigator Academy of Leadership stepped out of the doldrums of life and into an under the sea art show experience.

The Under the Sea Art Show, spearheaded by Navigator's elementary art teacher Heather Adkins, featured artwork from every grade level (K-8th), art-based activities in the cafeteria, local student-focused vendors, and food trucks. The main feature of the night was the Glow Room that took over two months to create.

The Glow Room highlighted the unique animals in the oceans. Neon mediums – paint, crayons, oil pastels and markers – made the room come to life. Grade levels learned about various sea animals such as sea turtles, jellyfish, puffer fish, stingrays, fish, coral reefs. Mixed media art, everyday materials found at home and recycled materials such as CDs, paper towel rolls and plastic bottles were used to create the display.

Principal Rebecca Valdes said the art show provided a way to showcase the students art and allow them to be proud of their work.

"The Art Show is always a success and could not

be possible without our teacher leaders guiding the way. This year the showcase is the show was the Glow Room! It was an amazing room where all K-8 students joined together to create one work of art!" Valdes said.

According to Adkins, the inspiration of the art show was multifaceted. She teaches a love of art and how science and math can be part of it.

"Art is everywhere! My goal everyday is to make art fun and engaging for my students as well as to see them see art in even the smallest things," Adkins said. "My background is in math and science so if there is any way to incorporate it, I do."

Part of the mission of the Navigator Academy of Leadership is a cross-curricular integration of science, math, art, reading and technology. For the Under the Sea Art Show, students spent weeks reading and learning about maritime science and math elements like shapes, lines and symmetry.

## Canine Cabana Celebrates 15 years



Residents are invited to attend the public hearing to finalize the budget June 12, 2023 at 6:15 p.m. at the district offices at 3509 Bell Shoals Road.

In other news, the board voted to approve new Summer banners for the community light poles. The red, white and blue decorative banners were scheduled to be installed at the end of last month. Trustees also agreed to include Spring banners in 2024 that will be installed after the holiday décor and lighting comes down in January next year.

The Bloomingdale Special District holds regular monthly meetings the second Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at their office on Bell Shoals Road. The public is always invited to attend.

## Hundreds Attend Meeting to Give Input on Lithia Pinecrest Improvements

Those living in Bloomingdale are all too familiar with traffic issues plaguing Lithia Pinecrest Road. Residents here as well as other areas along the corridor constantly deal with delays, especially around school dismissal and rush hour. The road has received an "F" rating for many years, but little has been done to alleviate problems.

Suzy Watts, President of the Bloomingdale Neighborhood Association (BNA), is concerned about residents having a safe way to evacuate should the need arise.

"We currently have daily accidents on Bloomingdale Avenue, and weekly on Lithia Pinecrest. This is an unsafe area, and we are surrounded by two unsafe roads," she noted.

On May 23, a public input meeting was held at the Bloomingdale Regional Library. Several hundred area residents stopped by to learn about the Lithia Pinecrest Road PD&E study and talk about issues with county representatives and discuss future improvements to the road.

The study will identify and evaluate potential improvements to Lithia Pinecrest Road from Fishhawk Boulevard to Lumsden Road and Bloomingdale Avenue from Culbreath Road to Pearson Road. The total project length is 7.5 miles.

Alternatives to the current road situation may include widening, access management improvements to incorporate turn lanes onto side streets, intersection analysis to evaluate roundabout alternatives and other intersection configurations, improved pedestrian, and bicycle accommodations, including shared-use paths, a connected sidewalk system, buffered bike lanes, mid-block crossings, and more.

The project development is due for completion in late 2024, but the preliminary design, land acquisition/final design, and construction completion are still to be determined.

The total cost estimate for the project is \$200 million. Project development is \$4 million and is currently funded. The design will cost \$10 million and as of now, is unfunded as is \$40 million for land acquisition and \$146 million for construction.

Danny Alvarez, Florida House Representative for District 69 attended the open house.

"As State Representative, I wanted this road built three years ago. My push and priority are to get it done as fast as possible. The county has negligently ignored the east side without any reason, but it's time that we let that go; it's time we fixed that road and yesterday is not soon enough," said Alvarez.

There is no quick solution, and Alvarez noted that even if it were funded today, it still would be a couple of years until the road got built. This is just the first phase. The county will ultimately have to decide on the plan. He noted that once it goes out to bid, we are talking about the road expansion taking five years.

According to Ryan Gill, Hillsborough Soil & Water Vice Chair and Supervisor, another important issue that needs to be looked at during the planning phase is the importance of what future impacts will be made on Florida's natural resources. The Alafia River runs right through the area, and this must be taken into consideration.


County Commissioner for District 4, Michael Owen, noted that there will be another meeting in about five months to showcase a few different scenarios for road improvements.

Asked why this process is so time-consuming, Owen said, "This is all about money; it's all financial. We didn't create a corridor here, so we must buy the land. The land is what is expensive. So, the likelihood is that we are going to be widening in some places and not in others and doing roundabouts at some subdivisions and getting creative from Lumsden to Fishhawk Blvd. and that's the reality."

## BSHS Baseball and Softball Win District Championships!




The BSHS Baseball finished with a 17-9 record
