BACK TO SCHOOL

School will be back in session before you know it. Aug 10th is coming soon. Be smart and do your part... The alternative could cost you more than you think. Lookout for school zone signals and always obey the speed limit. Watch out for our children, near schools, bus stops, sidewalks, in the streets, and school parking lots. Watch out for your school crossing guards and obey their direction. On several occasions drivers have almost hit the crossing guard and children. Be a good role model. Always buckle up in the car, and follow the pedestrian rules. Your children are watching and will learn from you.

Remember NO Texting and driving. In Florida you can't hold your phone in school or construction zones. The safety of your kids and the safety of other kids are much more important than any phone call. Our first concern each school year is the safety and protection of the thousands of kids headed back to school in our community. Many of these kids will be walking or riding their bikes to school for the first time. Others will be waiting at bus stops for their school buses near streets and corners.

Florida traffic law 316.172 requires that ALL VEHICLES MUST STOP BOTH WAYS for school buses on roads without medians. If the road has at least five-foot width of grass or a raised median, opposite traveling traffic does not stop. Drivers, keep a safe between other vehicles and especially school buses in front of you. SLOW DOWN.

Parent speak to your children about how to be safe and alert while getting to school. Especially those with teenage drivers. Emphasize safe bike riding – wearing their bike helmets, crossing only at crosswalks, obeying all bikeriding rules, and watching for cars. Have your kids walk or ride their bikes in groups with friends or classmates. Discuss the importance of being very careful if strangers approach them. Review the route they should take to school and walk or ride it with them. Note the seriousness of them staying at their bus stop, watching out for cars and behaving while they wait. Accidents only take seconds to happen. We want to help make Hillsborough County a safer place but we need your help. Have a safe school year. Bloomingdale Special District Works Hard for our Community



Bristol Green Residents Receive \$500 in Bloomingdale Beautification Award Contest

Stephen and Leslie Beckhorn, residents of Bristol Green, were excited to receive \$500 thanks to the first annual Bloomingdale Beautification Award (BBA) contest recently held by the Bloomingdale Neighborhood Association.

The contest ran from April 1 to July 1 and to participate, residents had to make improvements to their home property by improving curb appeal, greenery, color, cleanliness, lawn maintenance, and neatness. A time-dated before and after photo of their yard or home had to be taken as part of the submission process.

The BBA committee reviewed the entries received and then viewed the homes. About a dozen residents applied, but only eight met the requirements that were set forth.

Judging was done on curb appeal, with guidelines from county code regulations as well as using deed restrictions (if applicable) for judging guidance.

Suzy Watts, President of the BNA, said, "We live in a beautiful community. Many of our neighbors have gorgeous homes and gardens. We celebrate one each month with Yard of the Month. With this award, we rewarded neighbors who transformed the exterior of their home."

Leslie, who is a Pilates instructor at Baycare Fitness Center, said she is a very competitive person and when she heard about this contest, she knew she was going to work hard and try her best to win. The Beckhorn's have lived in their home for six years and at least 90 percent of the landscaping has been changed over that time. They did all the work by themselves.

"We just love our home. All the labor has been worth it," noted Leslie.

George May is a past president of the BNA (formerly known as the Bloomingdale Homeowner's Association) and his company, American Investment Advisors, is one of the sponsors.

He said, "I had volunteered to help locate homes for the monthly yard of the month award and noticed some of the homes and neighborhoods were going down. The board does a lot of things for the community, and I felt like this was an area that could use a little help."



BNA Garage Sale is September 9 Enjoy These Tips to Participate Successfully

The Bloomingdale Neighborhood Association (BNA) will hold its annual Garage Sale on Saturday, September 9. There are many reasons to participate, especially if you are interested in clearing your home of items that are no longer of use to you.

Depending on what you plan to sell, you can earn anything from a few dollars to a few hundred, but it's the opportunity to declutter and reorganize that is most appealing.

Give yourself enough time before the sale to go through drawers, under beds, inside cabinets, and the garage, to find long-forgotten items that have outgrown usefulness. Find an out-of-the-way spot to store your items.


Good organization is the key to keeping your sanity through the process. Sort by item type. Keep like items together and consider pricing them all the same. That way you don't have to make price tags for individual items, and it will be easier for you to remember the cost. For example, if you have a lot of baby clothes, you may price them all at \$1 or toys at \$2 or \$3. Remember that a lot of people will try to bargain with you, so keep that in mind when pricing the items in the first place. Other homes will be participating, so you need to be competitive.

Work on pricing as you sort through your items to make it easier. The Dollar Store or Walmart sells inexpensive stickers you can use if you do choose to individually price items. Remember, just because the item meant something special to you doesn't mean it will serve the same purpose for others. If you really want it out of the house, price it to sell.

Have everything set up and ready to set out first thing in the morning. Your first customers may appear up to an hour prior to the sale start time, most likely before you are quite ready to begin. But you can make quite a few dollars early on if you allow the early birds access to your goods.

The BNA will take care of advertising the Community Garage Sale but make signs to post in and around your immediate neighborhood leading people to your specific sale. Don't forget to remove them when it's over.

The variety of choices changes weekly, and she will post on social media what is available each week.

There are a few tables inside the store where you can enjoy the sweets onsite. Hot coffee and tea, as well as cold drinks, are also available.

She said, "My dream was to always own my own small bakery, and with hard work and determination and the help of my husband and in-laws, I could make my dream come true."

The Neto's moved to FishHawk from Connecticut 11 years ago. Sergio started a small mechanic shop in Brandon, which has expanded over the years. Maribel enjoyed a full-time career in the corporate world as a business manager for 10 years before pursuing her cheesecake passion. They also have four children and eight grandchildren.

"We love the Florida life and are so happy to live here," added Maribel.

You can purchase cheesecake by the slice or as a whole cake. Prices vary depending on the type of cheesecake purchased. For specialty items, 48-hour notice is required.

The Little Cheesecake Company, located at 143 E. Blooming-dale Avenue, is open Tuesday-Thursday from 11 a.m.-7 p.m., Friday and Saturday from 11 a.m.-8 p.m. and Sunday from 11 a.m.-5 p.m. It is closed on Monday.

Dale Bateman Retires after Coaching at Bloomingdale High School for 32 Years By Jane Owen

Words can't adequately describe the level of excellence that Dale Bateman has had in his running career.

In 1975, Dale Bateman won the Naval Academy Sword, the highest athletic award at the Naval Academy given to midshipman of the graduating class by the athletic committee, all due to his running achievements in college. Bateman holds the freshman 2-mile record at the Naval Academy (9:11). He held the 800 record for 38 years (from 1974 until 2012).

Bateman's competitiveness was evident early at Laurel High School in Maryland. He was state champion in the mile, half marathon, and 1000 yards. In his senior cross-country year, his team won state. He went on to Nationals and was 4th in the half marathon. Bateman has run 12 marathons. His marathon PR is 2:22 in Iwakuni, Japan.

His innate competitiveness is matched only by his passion for the high school student athletes that he has coached. Bateman started coaching at Bloomingdale High School in 1991. He retired from the Navy as a Lieutenant Commander in 1994. He became Bloomingdale's head track coach in 2017 and head cross country coach in 2019. In 2017, Bateman was inducted into Bloomingdale High School's Athletic Hall of Fame.

This year, Bateman not only took the largest number of Bloomingdale athletes in school history to the state track meet; he was awarded Hillsborough County Federal Division Western Conference Track Coach of the Year.

After 32 years as a high school coach, Coach Bateman retired after the 2023 track season.

If you ask him, his two greatest athletic achievements are winning the Naval Academy Sword and coaching high school athletes to success.

His coaching philosophy embodied a goal for every runner to consistently improve no matter their talent level. Bateman talks enthusiastically about the state placers he coached and the athletes he coached that started off struggling to run a mile and ended up loving the sport and making varsity and districts and regionals.

"Coaching at the high school level, you want the kids to have a positive experience... achieve goals and not have a bad outlook on running," Bateman said. "It's a process. They don't know their potential until you show them."

Bloomingdale High School teacher Jennifer Beach was coached by Bateman when she was a student at Bloomingdale and then coached with him for 21 years.

"I finished my last season of coaching involvement this past year and it gave me time to reflect on all the lessons I've learned from him. I've learned that the sport of running is a metaphor for life. With hard work and persistence, personal bests are always possible. Life has its ups and downs, like race times, but how you work through it determines your character," Beach said.

Bloomingdale's Athletic Director, Sara Bogue, says Bateman's retirement is a huge loss for Bloomingdale.

"Coach Bateman is a legend at Bloomingdale! He has dedicated many years of service to our student athletes, families, and community. As a hall of fame coach, he has built one of the best running programs in our district with many state qualifiers in both cross country and track and field," Bogue said.

Bateman has mixed emotions about retiring:



"You know, it's time. It's relief and then regret... because of what I am leaving behind. I am leaving somebody behind whose times far surpass mine as a sophomore in high school. I've told him- You've already surpassed me. So going on from here, I want to see even better things than me," Bateman

Regardless of what happens with the up-andcoming runners, Coach Bateman's inspiration is long-lasting at Bloomingdale High School. He leaves a legacy that is the combination of excelling both as an excellent runner, a winning coach and an inspiration to hundreds.

Other filming locations included a restaurant, Christmas Store, downtown Plant City and a bar.


"We are set to have our premiere in November," added Walden, "which is the beginning of the holiday season and it is also National Alzheimer's Awareness Month."
