Bloomingdale High senior enjoys the fast lane

At an age when many young people take the driver's seat to learn how to navigate neighborhood streets, Kelsey Lay was learning how to handle a car built to hurtle so fast it takes a parachute to slow it

The Bloomingdale High School senior, the youngest competitor to drive a Super Comp dragster in a National Hot Rod Association event, turned 18 the day she showed up for her first national drag race, the Gatornationals, last month in Gainesville.

"It was the best birthday gift I could ever have," Kelsey said." It was an amazing experience."

Hers is a sport where cars zoom to 180 mph in a snap of the fingers, and fractions of split seconds can win or lose a quartermile heat. She has been on a fast track toward racing in the big leagues since age 16, when she spent three months in a junior division and quickly realized that she wanted to compete against adults.

Community Cleanup Day is coming

Yard waste or regular household trash normally picked up at the curb cannot be accepted. Hazardous materials including paint; batteries, propane tanks, household chemicals and waste from commercial activities cannot be accepted.

The BHA is a voluntary, nonprofit organization run entirely by non-paid volunteers who live in the community. High school students and Scouts can earn community service hour credits for assisting with this project.

RESIDENTS MUST TAKE PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

At our March Sheriff's Bloomingdale Area Community Council (BACC)

we reviewed the crime statistics for our area. As I said earlier crime has taken a serious drop in area, down 21.2 percent in our District IV, which covers Bloomingdale, FishHawk and surrounding areas.

In reviewing the crime statistics, we noticed some obvious patterns as to the types of crimes and possible causes. The first example - there were several vehicle burglaries. In all of the incidents the vehicles were left open. This is just an open invitation for criminals. The solution - lock up your vehicles. The second incidents involved home burglaries. 
