The First Residents

In Florida we are blessed with a great deal of fair weather that facilitates outdoor activities. Here in Bloomingdale, it being a newly developed (and still growing) area, our outdoor activities often bring us in close contact with the natural inhabitants of Florida. These include snakes, insects and alligators. Many of us like as little to do with these creatures as possible - especially the dangerous ones. But, admittedly, they were here first and we must somehow learn to coexist together. Avoidance is sometimes impossible, especially in the spring during the animals mating season when they come out of their usual spots and wander around. Also, the reptiles and insects that are displaced by clearing and construction must find new homes; we hope not with us. Knowing some of the habits of these animals can help us get along with and/or avoid them.


Gratefully, there are no poisonous scorpions in Florida. The Hillsborough County Extension Service informs us that this is the time when they move about and sometimes come indoors through window and door cracks. Or come in with us when we bring pine comes into the house since they often live in the cones. The scorpions have a painful sting, similar to a wasp, and can cause an allergic reaction in some people. Spraying around the bushes outside and windows and doors with Spectricide, Malathion or some of the other sprays will take care of scorpions as well as the other insect pests.

There are a few poisonous snakes in our area, including water moccasins, copperheads, rattlesnakes, and coral snakes. It is a good idea to familiarize yourself as well as your children with what these look like. They have been moving through the inhabited areas of our community since the land along Bell Shoals is being cleared. Their homes have been disturbed and they're looking for new ones. A poisonous snake can kill a small child in three minutes, so it's a good idea to keep an eye out.

Bloomingdale has at least one five foot alligator in the drainage runoff pond. He (or she) travels throughout the drainage pipes (culvert) that runs under Bell Shoals. An alligator uses it's oversized tail to knock it's prey off guard and into the water where it is much more agile. Their twisting method of fighting enables them to confuse any prey and drag it to the bottom of the water where the prey drowns. The best way of dealing with an alligator is avoidance. They don't usually attack, but when something or someone gets close by in the water or surprises one, it will "drag and drown". Let's give our Bloomingdale Gator a wide berth.

Living in a tropical part of the country does give us plenty of chances to experience wildlife, but it's best to experience it on our own terms. Be aware of the animals that are around us and deal with them with caution.


