25X Riders Voice Concerns At Meeting

We met the Commissioner! Hillsborough County District 4 County Commissioner Al Higginbotham hosted a town-hall type meeting July 17 at Bloomingdale Regional Library.

Of 60 people present, about 15 represented county offices, and of the remaining 45 in attendance, five were 25X bus riders, four from SOCOM and one from CENTCOM.

Not a bad showing, boys and girls.


Several folks came prepared to take all of the commissioner's time and for the most part they were successful. Three topics dominated the discussion; lack of growth management and a Sydney mines project, a request for six lanes on Boyette Road, and a proposed amendment to a county ordinance on waste hauling.

Yes, your bus captain did get something in, although his only intent was to take pictures of his comrades. His first words were, "Hey you wouldn't need six lanes on Boyette if y'all rode the bus."

He also pointed out to the commissioner that standing-room-only continues on the 25X, and that something needs to be done about the Causeway Boulevard stop before someone becomes road kill. That was it.

One county rep spent a painful nine minutes explaining the amendment process to the comprehensive growth plan. The bus captain wanted to yell "And how many developers were turned down?" At the end, a businesswoman pleaded for support to block a trash hauling amendment. Nearly everything she said was already in the morning Tampa Tribune. At the end of the meeting, Antonio from CENTCOM was able to speak one on one with the Commish.

Code Enforcement Lists "Dirty Dozen" Top Violations

Hillsborough County Code Enforcement this summer announced its list of "Dirty Dozen" top violations in the county.

Properties with a lot of junk and debris were the most common violation last year, with 4,064 violations written for the problem. Other common violations included inoperable vehicles



It's Never Okay To Park Boats On Streets Or Right-Of-Way

At the July meeting of the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association's board meeting, Bill Langford and Armando Sanchez from Hillsborough County Code Enforcement discussed resident complaints regarding boat parking in the streets, in driveways and on right-of-ways. Langford recited statutes that indicate it is not legal to park a boat in the street or right-of-way under any circumstances. In addition, boats parked in a homeowner's driveway are in violation after the allowed 24-hour

time period. Residents are encouraged to submit complaints regarding potential County Code violations online at www.hillsboroughcounty.org/hcce or call (813) 641-6946. Complainants may remain anonymous.

Verizon Set To Wrap Up In October

At the July BHA board meeting, Gary Campau, a Verizon representative, gave an informative presentation regarding Verizon FiOS coming into all the neighborhoods in Bloomingdale to replace old copper wiring with new fiber optics. The company's target completion date for installation is October 2007.

COP Program Coming Soon

Deputy Pete Maurer, Bloomingdale's Community Resource Officer discussed the training program for the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office's Cops on Patrol program, also known as COP. Private citizens will be trained and issued uniforms to assist in some areas of law enforcement in select areas of the county.

Resident Suggests Surveillance Cams

Resident Rich Junker introduced a suggestion to curb vandalism and littering: to install surveillance cameras along the major right-of-ways, funded jointly by private homeowners and the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association. Immediate past president Ted Grable indicated that the homeowners association cannot issue citations and therefore has no way of enforcing such behavior. He suggested Junker talk with the Bloomingdale Special Taxing District and Deputy Pete Maurer to see if the sheriff's office would agree to take steps to seek prosecution of violators.

equipment and vehicles: 536
Improper use of property other than its zoning: 511
Improperly installed or sealed walls in a structure: 506
None or not enough smoke detectors in a structure: 464

Though many of these violations are well-known, others might not be as familiar. For example, County Code does not allow grass or weeds higher than 10 inches in height within 200 feet of any building, recreational area or street right-of- way.

Another common violation is a result of commercial vehicles

on residential property. County Code does not allow trucks or trailers with capacity of more than one ton and made for commercial use to be parked on a residential-zoned property for long periods of time. Another lesser-known code requires that every habitable room in a structure has to have at least one window, skylight or glass door facing directly outside.

Summer Forums Bring Issues To Light

President George W. Bush has been quoted as saying, "Leadership to me means duty, honor, country. It means character, and it means listening from time to time." I take the same view in believing that leadership means meeting people where they are at, pulling up a chair, and lending an ear.

During June and July, I had the great pleasure of sharing time with the residents of Eastern Hillsborough County during my District Dynamics Summer Series of community meetings. These meetings were open and informal. There were no time limits, and each person was invited to share their views on any issue. During the five meetings held throughout the county, more than 300 attendees became engaged and active players in local government by asking questions and sharing their opinions.


In June, I had great discussions with folks in Plant City and in Brandon. Citizens were free to discuss issues ranging from irrigation to indigent health care, from budget to buses, from parks to land use planning. While we may not always see eye-to-eye on each issue, we can at least look each other in the eve and build a relationship of understanding and trust.

My July travels took me to Balm, Valrico, and most recently to Bloomingdale on July 17. In Balm, I listened to concerns about borrow pits, handicap access to environmental properties and sustainable growth. Many Balm residents showed up to the meeting on both sides of an issue concerning a paintball park. Because of the District Dynamics community meeting, these two sides were able to meet in the same room, discuss their concerns, and they even found some common ground. Bringing people together is a cornerstone of the type of leadership I continually try to exhibit in my role as your elected representative.

"I'm not going to work until promised. "I'm like really excited and depressed at the same time because I want to know what happens but also it's over. It's going to be like there's nothing more to look forward to except for the movies and the Harry Potter theme park they're building in Orlando."

Sackman put it more succinctly, days later, when he reflected on his motivation to spend a night with friends, in line for hours, for the honor of buying a 759-page book.







summer bringing to the Barn every Thursday night an event, appropriately called, "Thursday Night Live."



Charges Filed In Deadly Bloomingdale Student Crash

On Wednesday, July 25, the Hillsborough County State Attorney's Office confirmed charges were filed against two adults who authorities say hosted a party in October where 17-year-old Bloomingdale High School student Tyler Clark consumed alcohol before dying in a fatal crash.

Lamar Justice and Tera McEntarffer were charged with having an open house party. The second-degree misdemeanor is punishable by up to 60 days in jail.

Investigators said that shortly after midnight Oct. 8, Clark drove six passengers in his 1995 Jeep Wrangler west on Bloomingdale Avenue, near Bell Shoals Road. The Jeep crashed into a tree just east of the intersection. Clark was killed and the passengers were injured.

Investigators said Clark's blood alcohol level was above the legal limit at the time of the crash.

According to the state attorney's office, Justice and McEntarffer, both 42, each were issued a notice to appear in court Aug. 20 for arraignment.



School is back in session Aug. 20. Drivers, it's the law: both lanes of traffic – driving in either direction – must stop for school buses stopped on roads without median dividers. That means even if the bus is on the other side of the road, going in the opposite direction, if there's no median, you must stop and wait until the bus finishes loading or unloading and pulls away.

In addition, if you get pulled over by a deputy for speeding in a school zone, no warnings will be given. Special patrols will be out in full force, and speeding fines are doubled in school zones.

Parents, please take the time to talk to your kids about the importance of being safe going to and from their schools. Emphasize bike safety and include the wearing of bike helmets, crossing only at crosswalks, obeying all bike-riding rules, and watching for cars.

Have your kids either walk or ride their bikes in groups with friends or classmates, and discuss the importance of being very careful if strangers approach them. Review the route they should take to school and walk or ride it with them. Remember to note the seriousness of them staying at their bus stop, watching out for cars and behaving while they wait.

After school, some kids will be home alone for a while when they first get home. Stress the importance of staying inside, knowing important emergency numbers and numbers for parents or friends, following the rules you set for using kitchen appliances and not talking to strangers or opening doors for strangers.

Parents, also, don't forget to prepare for a new school year too. Give yourself extra travel time for your commute. Check to see if any new schools have opened up along the way you take to work.
