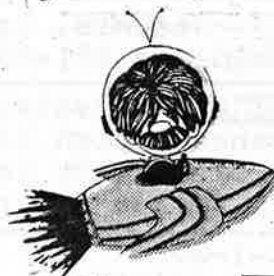

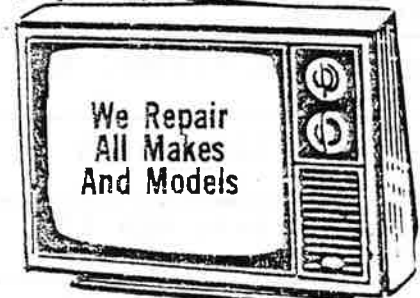

Brandon for the event.

Festival publicity chairman, Barbara Stillie, explained that in addition to the Balloon Race, a foot 'chase' is also planned - organized by the Brandon Running Association. Approximately 500 runners, she explained, are expected to show for this event which is to incorporate both a five mile and a one mile run with proper facilities and refreshments along the north east Brandon course.

Outlining the day's schedule of community fun, events chairman Fred Uphoff revealed that musical entertainment would include country, rock and steel drum bands, Brandon's own High School Band and the U.S. Army's 26 piece Dixie-Land Jazz Band, Fat Lightered. The group will travel from Ft. Gorden, Ga. to give several performances throughout the day. "They're sensational," said the publicity chairman. "Our entertainment is really top notch."

"Our activities are geared for people of all ages and interests," explained the chairman. These, he said, would include family sports events, greased pole, egg drop, sack and three legged races, watermelon seed spitting, and creative dessert contests. And along with

square dancers, cloggers and endless side shows, pony rides, belly dancers, alligator wrestling, as well as skydiving shows, will keep visitors to the first annual Labor Day event involved and entertained.

Uphoff explained also that local community clubs and associations had organized numerous concession stands offering a wide variety of food, and were prepared for a "very large turnout."

"The Chamber already is receiving a great number of calls from balloon race enthusiasts who want to know the time of the hare lift off," said Chamber executive vice president, Ouida Gray. This, she explained is scheduled for 7:45 AM depending of course on weather conditions.

The event site is, explained Ms. Gray, a very large field. "But it looks like we'll need it - along with the scheduled police traffic control," she commented.
