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Keeping Safe Around Water this Summer Season

With the fast approach of summer, the smell of chlorine and saltwater beckons us to jump in to escape the Florida heat. But every day, regardless of the weather, there's 11 fatal drownings in the United States – and according to the CDC, it's the number one cause of childhood mortality for those aged 1-4 years.

Luckily, water safety is simple if you know what to look for. For starters, knowing how to swim prevents most accidents. For friends who live close by, the Campo Family YMCA offers swim lessons to swimmers of all ages and abilities at reasonable cost. For those who don't know how to swim or aren't strong swimmers, life jackets are a necessity – on the boat, at the beach, and in the pool. Those cute floaties you picked up for your precocious swimmer at Walmart aren't enough!



Of course, never forget that swimming with a lifeguard on duty is on more layer of protection. These trained professionals offer an additional layer of security for swimmers. For parents watching their little ones, it's equally important for adults to supervise their swimmers. Simply sitting by without actively watching can – and often does – lead to more accidents, as drowning is typically quick and quiet.

Fences should be checked to make sure young swimmers can't access water without an adult

present. Adults that cannot swim well should refrain from the use of drugs and alcohol, as these can impair the ability to balance, coordinate, or make good decisions. Make sure that when swimming, there's at least one other person present – having a buddy can make all the difference.

Lastly, CPR is highly recommended. While not everyone needs to be certified to swim, having someone on site who can perform CPR in the event of an accident is crucial, as those moments without oxygen can leave lasting effects. The 8000 nonfatal drowning accidents in the U.S. – 22 a day – leave lasting impacts such as permanent brain damage.

Drowning doesn't look anything like the movies. Here's some things to keep an eye out for to prevent drowning incidents:

- Typically quiet or noiseless drowning victims are unable to call for help, as speech is secondary to breathing.
- Limited splash or flailing drowning victims bob up, down, or with the waves, moving to the surface to try and get a breath, and usually only use their arms to pull themselves to the surface
- Mouths can be at the surface or slightly above drowning victims inhale and exhale quickly as they rise to the surface, trying to get a whole breath in

It's important practice water safety no matter what body of water you're near. Staying safe this summer is the easiest way to ensure you keep having fun.



\$1 GOLF for Kids This Summer

Are the kids driving you crazy and playing too many video games this summer? Want to have them do something healthy and learn a lifelong sport? Ace Golf is offering a \$1 summer golf practice program for kids age 4 to 15. Every day from June 1 through August 31, kids can sign up to receive a \$1 small bucket of range balls or a \$1 round of miniature golf each day for the whole summer. Kids hit the balls on the practice ranges and miniature golf courses at bay area Ace Golf locations. And, it's all just \$1 per activity!

"There are a lot of families out there that just can't afford to put kids in camps or they just want something productive to fill their summer", says Bill Place, owner of Ace Golf Ranges and Golf Courses. "We want to help, and hopefully in the process, we may find the next Tiger Woods!" How it works:

- Children may sign up for free at any of two Ace Golf locations in Riverview and Land O'Lakes.

- A parent must accompany all children using the program at all times.

In addition to the Free Bucket or Mini-Golf program, kids may also play golf for \$1 when accompanied by a paying parent at Ace Golf's Plantation Palms Golf Club after noon every day starting June 1st through the end of October.

Let Your Voice Be Heard Proposed Energy Park Plans By Elise Cruz Aragon

As the county continues to meet regarding the proposed changes to the planned Energy Park at the intersection of Turkey Creek, Durant, and Route 60, there are some important updates for you to keep in mind.

As of March 19th, the Hillsborough County Board of Commissioners voted 6-1 to approve the consideration of HC/ CPA 24-06, which allows for the potential future development of residential homes on that parcel of land.

According to Isabella Pike, legislative aide to Commissioner Donna Cameron Cepeda, the vote "does not approve the Energy Industrial Park development." Instead, it will "allow staff to do environmental and infrastructural research, plan more meetings, and gather additional community input."

The BNA believes that proceeding with the original plan for an Energy Park is the best and only viable option. Adding additional houses without taking infrastructure concerns into account is tantamount to hitting the snooze button on an alarm and hoping to wake up on time.

BNA President Suzy Watts states that the County needs to "honor existing plans," rather than attempt to add more residences in this area. "The area is rural and can't accommodate the traffic patterns. Without thinking about how to change traffic patterns, it doesn't make sense to add more homes, since it will only exacerbate existing problems."

Beyond the problem of traffic, there is a larger concern of contamination in the proposed site. According to a recent study, there is dioxin present in the ground water resulting from the phosphate mines in the area. To use this site for an Energy Industrial Park only would be acceptable, as there's not a risk to inhabitants in the area. It would be disingenuous to build homes on a site that will carry such a risk – and leaves open questions on future viability of said homes.

Make your voice heard at the next meeting. Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners will meet again at Mulrennan Middle School on May 21, 2024 at 6pm.

GreenPal, an app that connects homeowners with local, vetted lawn care professionals, is launching this week in Bloomingdale.


