#### AN ELECTION TO REMEMBER

State Representative Johnnie Byrd and his staff played important roles during the historical year 2000 election. Our special thanks as a community goes out to Representative Byrd and his staff for their long hours and dedication in helping to make this most precious of privileges we have as Americans work.

Representative Byrd was selected to serve as Chair of the Procedural Council in Tallahassee. His primary responsibility was to direct the passing of a legislative bill required to ensure that Florida had representative electors in the Electoral College. He was caught right in the middle of the Florida Supreme Court's rulings and those of the United States Supreme Court. Needless to say, his task was challenging.

Representative Byrd and his Legislative Assistants Jessica Corcoran and Edward Howlette fielded a multitude of media requests and coordinated meet-

ings in Tallahassee while maintaining their Plant City office. Representative Byrd said, "With the 24-hour coverage by the media,

our typical work day was non-stop. Representative Byrd said that the most memorable moment came when word was received that the U S. Supreme Court had made the decision to end the long, drawn-out

"This particular election was one with special historical significance," said Byrd. "A lot was learned about our election process, our legislative process, our court system, and about the people involved in the process. We have seen first hand the importance of becoming involved in our local government, registering to vote, and voting for

the candidate's principles and not for a person."

Representative Byrd will remember one very discouraging fact that resulted because of the confusion with the military vote. "My daughter, a cadet at the United States Naval Academy, voted absentee like hundreds of other military members. They'll never really know if their vote counted," he said. Looking forward, he said, "Now that the process is over, we can get on with the business at hand in our community."

Representative Byrd holds satellite meetings at the Bloomingdale Community Substation to hear the concerns of his constituents. Residents are

The Bloomingdale Area Community Council (BACC) is composed of volunteers from area subdivisions who meet monthly at the Bloomingdale Community Substation at 4342 Bell Shoals Road. BACC members discuss current issues that have been brought to the attention of a council member, Deputy Pete Maurer or Officer Sandy Capitano.

The objective of each meeting is to find solutions, and to improve the safety and quality of life in our community. Any resident with concerns should contact the community substation at (813) 635-8040 so their comments can be added to the next agenda.

The November meeting of the BACC was held on November 16, 2000. The following items were discussed:

Deputy Maurer noted that the Sheriff's Office has responded to several calls regarding "party houses" and drug-related problems. He emphasized that any resident who notices parties or drug activity should immediately contact the Sheriff's Dispatch at (813) 247-8200.

Plans are being finalized to set up a permanent Park Deputy in Bloomingdale West park.

A South Oak resident inquired about the increase in burglaries in their community. Deputy Maurer noted that Bloomingdale is a target rich environment, and that all residents must insure their homes and vehicles are properly locked, especially garage doors.

A few residents have noticed homeless people wandering on Bloomingdale Avenue. Deputy Maurer noted that a few more have een as the city of Tampa pushes to clean up downtown for the Bowl. Any resident noticing a stranger in their area should call

the Community Station at (813) 635-8040.

The BACC is coordinating Bloomingdale High to have teens serve on the council.

Additional meetings are being planned to improve the traffic around Alafia elementary school.

Some disturbances in the Oakdale Reserve subdivision have calmed down due to meetings between residents and the parents of teens causing the disturbances. Speeding



#### STATE LAW WON'T REDUCE ALAFIA'S NEED FOR PORTABLES

New state guidelines for the use and condition of modular classrooms aim to eliminate a majority of the 1,200 portables currently in use in Hillsborough County schools. An estimated 40,000 Hillsborough County public school students attend classes in portables each day.

Under a statute established by the Florida State Legislature in 1998, half of the portables in each school district statewide must be phased out over the next five years. As of July 1, 2001, modular classrooms that remain in use must be upgraded or replaced to meet stringent guidelines.

With costs to bring each portable up to code ranging from \$4,000 to \$14,000 per unit, the school district has opted to remove hundreds of portables from campuses across Hillsborough County over the summer. Without the extra space that portables provide. administrators and teachers will be brainstorming for creative solutions to better utilize the space they have until new schools can be

With 17 portables in active use, continuously growing enrollment and plans for a new school still being finalized, Alafia Elementary School in Bloomingdale East won't be eliminating portables for the 2001- 2002 school year. Built to handle 868 students, Alafia's current enrollment tops 1300.

Plans for a new elementary school at the southern intersection of Natures Way and Culbreath in Bloomingdale East are in the land appropriate phase. School district officials hope to have the school ready for the 2002 - 2003 school year, and say they are expediting the process to relieve crowding at Alafia as soon as possible.

Alafia Principal Sylvia McMillan said, "We will be removing some of the older units and replacing them with newer models, but we will continue to operate with portables at least until the new school is

Boundaries for the new school have not yet been established. An initial review suggests that the best plan may be to assign students from the southernmost portion of Bloomingdale East to the new school. Alafia is expected to receive a good measure of relief, making it possible for the school to perform at or around capacity for the first time in over four years.

"Our teachers and staff, our parents and students, everyone at Alafia does such a tremendous job in spite of our overwhelming enrollment numbers," said McMillan. "Just imagine how incredible this school will be when the numbers are more manageable."

Many schools, including Alafia, will expand their team-teaching

#### Portable Classroom Requirements

After July 1, 2001, portable classrooms must meet the same standards applied to permanent facilities under the Uniform Building Code for Public Educational Facilities. The code incorporates minimum requirements for the safety and stability of construction and installation, fire and moisture protection, air quality and ventilation, wind resistance, and compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

Portables must also provide access to the same technologies available to classrooms within the main school facility, and must be accessible by covered walkways. Inspection reports must be filed with the district school board and posted in each portable classroom.

and combined class programs to accommodate growing numbers of students. Teachers of special classes like music and art may travel between classrooms in order to free up more regular classroom

The proposed Unitary Status Plan, approved by the School Board last year, may also offer crowded schools some relief. The plan calls for the restructuring of the district's current 18 clusters into seven regions, initiating controlled choice within seven choice zones, eliminating satellite attendance areas and expanding all magnet schools.

The plan is scheduled to go before the U.S. District Court in early 2001 and is expected to be approved.


To further help districts accommodate growing attendance numbers, "The state has dramatically increased the availability of new school funding," said Bill Person, Hillsborough County Schools Director of Pupil Assignment. "This plan will help us put new schools in place in a more timely manner, and should put an end to the use of portables as a long-term solution."

"With five new schools opening in Hillsborough County for the 2001-2002 school year, and plans in the works for several others, including the new Bloomingdale school, we are already seeing the positive effects of this legislature."



#### SPRINGVALE REZONING REQUEST UPDATE

I spoke with Dave Johnson in the Hillsborough County Real Estate Department on January 13, 2001. Mr. Johnson has received a preliminary request for the County to vacate the drainage easement at the Springvale conservation area. This means that the property owner is asking the County to relinquish ownership of the easement. The owner intends to apply for single-family housing zoning once the drainage easement is vacated by the County.

If the property owner's request for the County to vacate the easement is approved, it would then go to a Zoning Hearing Master for a final rezoning decision. Once the request to vacate the easement is approved, the Zoning Hearing Master can approve the rezoning request. The vacate easement process usually takes 90 - 120 days from the County's receipt of the request, so the February 27, 2001 hearing may need to be continued.

It appears that the only recourse to try to prevent the rezoning approval is for homeowners to express their private interests. We strongly urge all residents opposing the proposed rezoning to express their opposition in writing to County Commissioner Ronda Storms and/or County Project Manager Brian Grady, County Center, 601 East Kennedy Boulevard, Tampa, FL 33601.


Low power stations allow communities to broadcast their own neighborhood radio stations. The BHA is approaching this concept as an interesting project that could be used by the community,

With this welcome new business comes increased traffic in the area. Drivers should use extra caution as plans are being reviewed to improve traffic flow in the area.







#### Italian Kitchen

Whether you've been in Florida one month or 15 years, some of us still miss the atypical dine-and-dash Italian deli we once frequented for afternoon or evening meals. Well, fear not... I've found one! This little Café-Deli-Bakery is nestled on 301 South in Riverview, just north of the river.

You know it's authentic by the tell-tale signs; the huge cheese, dried peppers and garlic hanging from the ceiling, the wet mozzarellas and trays of olives and artichoke hearts in the display case, and the Italian cold cuts offered including capicolla, proscuitto, sopressata, Genoa salami and pepperoni.

Choose from sandwiches that include meatballs (\$3.95), Giovanni's Special (\$5.95) with ham, proscuitto, capicolla salami, provolone and mozzarella cheese. I had an unbelievably authentic sausage and roasted peppers \$5.95), which I swear tastes like everybody's Italian other or grandmother used to make.

Entrees offered for \$6.95 include Braciole, Rolled Stuffed Flank Steak, Roasted Loin of Pork with Rosemary, Chicken or Eggplant Parmigiana, Lasagna and Baked Ziti. Specials change daily, and on our visit they offered Veal Marsala. My wife selected the Chicken Parm and gave it a definite thumbs up.

Desserts include (hold on now!) Cassata, Chocolate Cheese Cake, Cream Puffs, Chocolate Mousse, Regular and Chocolate Éclairs, Cannolis, miniature Cannolis, Tiramisu, Crème Brulee, Anisette Toast, Almond Biscotti, Sfogliatellas, Butter Cookies and Tarts. Since everything can be packed to go, we took home a slice of Cassata, an Éclair, a Cannoli and a Cream Puff.

Remember, everything is made fresh, so you run the risk of them selling out if you don't call ahead or get there early enough. The Italian Kitchen is open 7 days a week, Monday to Saturday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. To paraphrase an old Italian adage, a meal without Italian food is like a day without sunshine. Bon Appetit!

The new 23 page animal ordinance that went into effect January 1 can be

www.hillsboroughcounty.org/animsvcs/ordinance/ordinance.html. It proceeds with great detail to explain the rules that animal owners must now abide by. But to most of us with a beloved pet or two, the details can be confusing. The important point to remember is that the county initiated it to help our pets stay safe, and to keep our children safe from animals owned by irresponsible owners.

There are a few easy steps to take to comply. One of the most emphasized issues regards the spaying or neutering of pets. The health benefits of these routine procedures prolong your pet's life and reduce the number of abandoned and euthanised pets every year. Animal services and some area clinics offer reduced priced surgeries.

While rabies licenses are required for cats, dogs, and ferrets, microchips are an excellent way to bring your lost pet home safely. Their cost is usually under \$30 and can be implanted without anesthesia in a matter of seconds. Most microchips are affiliated with a national database. The AKC companion retrieval service, which can be

contacted through www.AKC.org, will register any microchip number, tattoo or cuff.

The regulations regarding cats on someone else's private prop ty offer several means to compliance. While written permission can be gained from neighbors to have you pet on their property, the safe way to protect your cats is to confine them to your house and outing on leashes. Cat-specific harnesses and ultra light leashes can be purchased at most pet stores. Screened porches also offer a safe experience of the outdoors. Even adult cats can adapt to these changes if you persist with patience and their well being at heart.







#### **BB** Gun Safety

Anyone who purchased a BB or pellet gun for their kids for Christmas should become familiar with the rules and regulations covering firearm safety. Take the time to discuss proper handling and firing procedures with them. Bring them to the Community Station and I'll cover the rules with you and them. Remember that

you are totally responsible for the use of the weapon. It is a misdemeanor to violate State statutes covering firearm use. Anyone under 16 years of age must be supervised when using the weapon. This means being right with them, not inside your house. Hunting in our wooded areas or yards is not allowed. Deputies have had very serious confrontations with kids using the new realistic BB and pellet guns.

#### Scooter Safety

Many kids in our community have been seen using both the motorized and kid-powered varieties of scooters. Unfortunately, not all of them are using safety gear. A new County ordinance to regulate the use of motorized scooters is currently being processed through legal channels. It would require the wearing of helmets. Riders have been reported speeding on our streets. The motorized scooters have already proven to be deadly in our area. A truck hit two teens riding on one two days before Christmas; one was killed instantly and the other is in fair condition. Scooters simply cannot compete with autos; the riders are open targets.



#### Landscaping:

Planscape relocated the three white crepe myrtles on Canoga Park, installed 60 Indian Hawthorne bushes on Erindale and nine Burford Holly bushes at the Timbergrove entrance, and modified the landscaping at the Golf Manor entrance. Greenturf mulched the beds. DPMI inventoried 230 Crepe Myrtle trees to determine the location and quantity for a proposed pruning contract. DPMI transplanted 14 Nandina bushes that were removed from the Golf Manor entrance to various locations.

#### Damage control:


DPMI painted sections of the wall on Eastridge, Springvale and





#### What is a deed restriction?

A deed restriction is a legally binding covenant upon land that prohibits, regulates, or otherwise limits the uses of or activities upon the property. There are over 40 individual sections of Bloomingdale East and West (i.e. Fox Run, Bloomingdale Estates, The Greens, etc.), each with their own set of varying deed restrictions. Restrictions that pertain to one section may not be applicable to another, and include for instance the construction of additional

structures, parking commercial vehicles overnight, selection of particular color for the exterior of the home, types of fencing, visibility of solar panels, etc.

#### How do I know what the restrictions are on my property?

Deed restrictions are a matter of public record and are maintained in the County Courthouse. A copy of the deed restrictions should be included with each homeowner's closing documents. Restrictions for many Bloomingdale East and West neighborhoods can be viewed on our community web site. Visit the "Our Neighborhoods" section of bha-online.org to determine the legal name of your section

and to download deed restriction documents

#### How do I report a deed restriction violation?

Complaints to the BHA about alleged deed restriction violations should be made in writing. Residents must identify the neighborhood section in which they reside, and must cite and provide a copy of the specific deed restriction with the complaint. Many of these provisions may be downloaded from our community web site, and all may be obtained at the County Courthouse.

#### What action does the BHA take with complaints?

Residents registering a complaint may choose one of three alternatives for assistance from BHA volunteers - written interpretation by the BHA of the deed restriction at issue; a letter from the BHA giving notice of complaint to the breaching resident, or mediation of the dispute by the BHA Deed Restriction Subcommittee.

#### How are deed restrictions enforced?

Because the BHA is a voluntary association, it has no legal standing in enforcing deed restrictions. A homeowner or group of homeowners living in the same section as the deed restriction violator may choose to seek legal action. The BHA has adopted a new program to select on a monthly basis the most overt deed restriction violation and will provide some funding to help defray the cost of litigation. Fortunately, most deed restriction violations are resolved with the assistance of BHA volunteers before legal action becomes necessary. Some deed restriction violations are also violations of County laws or ordinances that can be enforced by various Hillsborough County agencies.


