Ask any local Realtor about the climate of the real estate business in Bloomingdale and you are likely to receive the same exuberant response; "Busy. Very busy!" As new home sales explode and existing home turnover continues at a steady pace, Bloomingdale real estate is moving and shaking. Over the past few years, there has been a resurgence of home sales not seen in our area since market peaked in the late

definite trend in resale home values increasing.

"We have come out of the static market that defined area

"We have come out of the static market that defined area real estate from the late 1980's to the mid 1990's. About three years ago, we began to see an appreciable increase in home resales at the entry level (\$80-100,000 price range), and have in the past year or so begun to see increases across the board," says Mr. Davis, "More and more people moving to our area are willing to pay higher prices to live in certain neighborhoods, including Bloomingdale."

Prospective buyers are often quite specific about buying in the Bloomingdale area for several reasons. The Bloomingdale school district, known widely as one of the best in the county, is a huge draw for young families moving to the area. The community offers miles of sidewalks for jogging and bicycling, two large and well equipped parks, and will soon be home to the Bloomingdale Branch of the YMCA. Accessibility to shopping and its' proximity to major arteries such as the cross-town expressway and I-75 are noted as location plusses for Bloomingdale. Dollar-wise, Bloomingdale residents are spared the high maintenance and/or community development fees (sometimes as much as \$85/ month) assessed by newer Continued on page 16



Restaurant Review: Alfie's

Alfie's "What's it all about?" 110 N. Montclair Avenue Brandon, FL 33510 685-0038

Alfie's is in the same location that housed the Whistle Stop. They originally opened in October with coffee and pastry only, but now they are open for lunch. So on a recent Tuesday my wife and I dropped in for lunch.

It is very cozy and comfortable when you walk in. They have a limited number of tables including a cocktail table and piano, but you don't have to worry about being crowded, even with a full house. The tile floor and vinyl lace tablecloths also add a nice touch and if you wish, you can choose to dine outside.

They open at 8 a.m. with gourmet coffee, Cappuccino, Espresso and Cafe Con Leche. You can also satisfy that sweet tooth with scones, gourmet muffins, cheesecake, banana nut bread or brownies.

The lunch menu is quite adequate, but the Alfie's House Sandwich is particularly detailed. The soup of the day was "Ten Veggie Soup," which I ordered. It was very good, full of a lot of diced or minced vegetables in a yellow creamy broth. I also ordered a Tuna sandwich on rye. It was very good with only tuna and no fillers you find in other restaurants. The sandwiches come on oversize bread, so if you're only moderately hungry go to the back of the menu for the soup and half sandwich. My wife had the Alfie's House Sandwich which is layered hot pastrami on lightly toasted bread with lettuce, tomato, provolone and

Alfie's sauce. The sauce turned out to be very similar to thousand-island dressing. It was a very good selection.

The sandwich section includes a Margie's Special Chicken Salad Sandwich with pecans and red grapes, or a Black Walnut Chicken Salad Sandwich with crusted black walnuts. For standard fare there is the BLT, Grilled Ham and Cheese or Egg Salad. There is also a sub section that features something called the Italian Stallion Sub. Don't overlook the salads and salad plates though, and they also offer daily specials. On the day that I went the special was not an off menu item, but a reduced price on an existing offering. Our bill for both sandwiches, a bowl of soup and 2 iced teas was \$16.41 including tax, not including gratuity.

On the down side, there were only two items worth mentioning, the service was quite slow and there were no children's items on the menu.

On the up side, they are open until 9 p.m. Monday through Friday and until 11 p.m. on Saturday, which is great for after the movies Saturday. According to Cyndi Buchanan, the owner, they have live music on Friday and Saturday nights and starting in January, they are planning on having Murder Mysteries, Fifties Nights, Car Shows and Craft and Variety Shows. Cyndi was not sure which would be first, the Fifties night or the Murder Mystery. I suggest you call her and make a reservation because seating will be limited. She is also planning on printing a flyer of some type that will show the upcoming events on a 60 or 90 day window. If it becomes available you might see it here.



Accidents Abound in Bloomingdale



It seems that November was a bad month for accidents. Two accidents occurred on Nature's Way in Bloomingdale East and less than 1/3 mile from each other. The first one (pictured on the left) resulted in a light pole coming down and 6 feet of the wall being totally pushed out. According to Al Devney, the property manager, the Sheriff's Department notified him, but he doesn't have any report about the injury to the occupant. Al stated that TECO had replaced the cement pole in less than a week while he got a contractor to remove the debris and is already processing the paperwork to get the wall repaired.



Erindale, Lithia Pinecrest and Culbreath while exerting more pressure on Alafia and Lithia prings Elementary Schools. The Traffic Depart-




ment is making every effort to get the traffic light up at Bloomingdale and Culbreath and widen Bloomingdale Ave.

seen the Center stretch and grow since its' opening 3 years ago. In addition to year-round classes, the Rec Center offers an after school care program. Approximately 125 students age 6 – 12 are currently enrolled in the after school group, with an average daily attendance of about 70. Children arriving at the center after school can have a snack and change into play clothes before enjoying free time in the well-equipped park and game room. The children are then rounded up for homework time, a favorite of Clouse. "The six and seven year olds are special to me because they say the funniest things, and they are at an age where they are excited about learning and doing their homework. They raise their hands during homework time and are so receptive to our help". After homework, the children are separated into three age groups and enjoy a rotating selection of games and activities, including soccer, foursquare and a popular rope hopping game, jump the creek. The after school program operates 5 days a week from 2:00 – 6:00, with a fee of \$15 per child every three
