






Women go wild for fundraiser

Las Vegas might have the bright lights, gambling and year-round appeal, but for one night a year, it's got nothing on Brandon.

At least that's the contention of Wild Dame Night 2010 organizers. The ladies-only event is a 19-year tradition that typically has women lining up outside Center Place, 619 Vonderburg Drive, to purchase tickets once they go

"What happens at Wild Dame Night stays at Wild Dame Night," organizers said during a recent meeting.

The event, which is a spinoff of the Rotary Club's Wild Game Night, began nearly two decades ago as a way for women to help raise money to offset the costs of children's theater at Center Place Fine Arts and Civic Association. The nonprofit organization brings live theater to the Brandon area and provides low-cost children's shows. Each year, an estimated 80,000 people visit the center to view works of art, see stage productions, take educational classes and more. Members and visitors come from all over the Brandon

It has become an annual tradition for Stages Productions, the children's theater company that performs at Center Place, to put an adult spin on one of the children's tales it brings to life on stage each year.

"This is a play your children will never see," said Susan Saunders, immediate past president of Center Place.

Considered the second largest fundraiser each year for Center Place, Wild Dame Night usually brings in about \$12,000 for the organization.


Mozzarella cheese, grated

Pepperoni

Parmesan cheese

Italian herbs seasoning

You can make these as big or as small as you'd like, so, first, roll your dough out in a circular shape to the size of your liking. On half of the circle, place pepperonis, leaving a 1-inch margin along the edge. Top with grated mozzarella cheese. Fold, meeting edges, crimp edges with fork. Cut a few slits in the top of the calzone to allow steam to escape and more even cooking. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese and Italian herbs seasoning. Bake in 425 degree oven until golden brown, 12-15 minutes, depending on thickness of dough.


