Residents in this part of Hillsborough County are not ones to sit quietly and see unacceptable things take place. In the recent past there was the redistricting of some of our children by Hillsborough County schools. A very organized lobby was put together, under the leadership of Ted Grable. This group negotiated with Hillsborough County Public schools and established a dialog between the school system and residents that was unprecedented in the county. There was also the issue of sidewalks along Canoga Park drive and traffic lights on Bell Shoals road into Bloomingdale West, which was successfully fought by a group led by Tim Golden. Obviously, people out here care about our community!

There is a new issue that this community will not sit idly and watch happen. Developer Dimitri Artzibushez would like to develop 71 acres of land to the south and west of Bloomingdale Estates. This property at 4202 John Moore Road is currently zoned as ASC-1, which means that under current zoning it could only be subdivided into one-acre lots. While this property is just outside the boundaries of "Bloomingdale," this rezoning petition affects everyone in the Bloomingdale community. According to Civil Engineer and Hickory Creek Resident David Kemper "when you take into account road easements and wetlands areas they will probably be able to develop only about 60 acres." While the thought of 60 new families moving in is not unwelcome, the developer has proposed a Planned Development which, in its current form, would put 135 homes on this property. Under this proposal you have 135 families with potentially 270 more cars on the road - how many of those cars will use Bloomingdale Estates as a shortcut east, can the speed bumps handle it? You have another couple of hundred students affecting our already over crowded schools - do we redistrict these children again? You add that volume to Bloomingdale Little League -already the largest little league in the county. What about the owls, hawks, fox, armadillo, turtles, and other wildlife that live here, with 135 more new homes, where will they go? Etc., etc., etc. Enough is enough!

The neighbors have united, get ready for another fight! Residents all along South John Moore Road have banded together calling themselves UNDO (United Neighbors, Dedicated Opposition). The mission of this group is to maintain the integrity of the existing 1-acre zoning. A petition drive and letter writing campaign are under way. We encourage all Bloomingdale residents to get involved! Administrative



Cal Henderson Visits Bloomingdale

On Thursday, May 21, members of the Bloomingdale Area Community Council (B.A.C.C.) and local residents listened as Hillsborough County Sheriff Cal Henderson gave an overview of the Community Policing Concept.

Sheriff Henderson opened by quoting some statistics representative of this policing concept. He said there are 29 targeted neighborhoods or communities in the county that will be covered by a local community station. To date, 18 are currently up and running, and he anticipates that all 29 will be open by the end of calendar year 1998.

The Community Policing Concept has been in place in Hillsborough County since 1988, but funding and grant considerations have delayed full implementation until now. It has become a high-profile policy for the County Sheriff's Department.

According to Sheriff Henderson, the County has 1.0 officers per thousand residents, as compared to the 3.1 per thousand maintained by the City of Tampa. The county patrols an area that is 8 times larger than the city. In spite of this, Hillsborough County's Community Policing program is so successful that the National Sheriff's Association uses it as a prototype for other areas throughout the country.

Community Policing calls to mind a time when law enforcement officers used to "walk the beat." When Sheriff Henderson began his career in 1965, he walked a beat in Ybor City. In today's version of the concept, officers use cars, but that is necessary to accommodate the large distances officers travel.

The current philosophy is for deputies to get to know the residents, and for the residents to get to know the local deputies. This allows the local deputies to respond to problems that are unique to each community.

To Sgt. Nelson Zalva, whose community station covers Sun City, Ruskin and Wimauma, this makes sense. He pointed out that the overall problems in Wimauma are much different than those of the individual residents.

The key to the continued success of this program is what Sheriff Henderson calls "empowerment." Each

deputy is empowered to make decisions that are right for their community without going to headquarters for approval.

Our local Resource Deputy, Pete Maurer, is very emphatic that he has the flexibility to respond quickly to matters that are unique to the Bloomingdale neighborhood. Pete says that the biggest volume of complaints he receives are related to traffic problems. As a result, Pete was instrumental in obtaining the new access routes in and out of the Wal-Mart shopping center.

Pete is also trying to get a date positive for the traffic light at Bell Shoals and RoseMeade. He will also assist in setting up portable speed "controls" at various locations in the community to help slow down drivers.



Solving the Speed Problem

The following is an open letter dated April 30, 1998, from Mack Austin and the Bloomingdale Area Community Council to Commissioner Dottie Berger.

Commissioner Berger:

I am writing this follow-up letter as a member of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office Bloomingdale Area Community Council. After a near-fatal accident, I contacted your office in April of last year regarding a serious traffic safety problem in front of the Bloomingdale Senior High School. I was referred to engineers at the County Traffic Engineers Office. Following are the results of their surveys, traffic accident data for this area furnished by the Sheriff's Traffic Department and additional information for your

PROBLEM: The current speed limit on Bloomingdale Avenue from Lithia Pinecrest Road to Bell Shoals Road is 45MPH. This traffic area includes a Little League Park, a daycare center, two churches, Bloomingdale Senior High School - which is also used on Sundays by Calvary Baptist Church, a future YMCA, a nursing home to be built on the east side of BSHS and the four major intersections at Lithia-Pinecrest Road, Culbreath Road, Springvale Drive and Bell Shoals Road.

ADDITIONAL FACTORS: (1) According to the Bloomingdale Senior High School Resource Officer, there are approximately 2,200 students with drivers licenses and limited driving experience. With the current double sessions, traffic flow is spread out over four different peak times. However, with the plans for single sessions next year, the traffic flow peak times will be reduced to two, thus significantly increasing the traffic volume.

- (1) The high traffic accident rate of 132 from 1993 to 1997 on this section of Bloomingdale Avenue involved over \$422.4 thousand dollars, not including work/school/personal time lost. This includes an increase from 10 accidents involving 33 people at a cost of \$45.6k in 1993 to 38 accidents involving 189 people at a cost of \$127.7k in 1997.
- (2) Additionally, there is a significantly higher volume of truck traffic flowing to and from increased construction sites and the mines in Eastern Hillsborough County.





Response: Dottie Berger forwarded Mr. Austin's letter to Daniel Kleman, County Administrator, and to Sheriff Cal Henderson. This is the response thus far:

(excerpted from a letter to Mack Austin, from Bernardo Garcia, Director, Public Works department, dated May 18, 1998)

The Traffic Section will review accident records of the Sheriff's Office and the Florida Highway Patrol to determine

if speed related accidents are occurring on the subject section of Bloomingdale Avenue. The Sheriff's Office Traffic Accident Reporting System (T.A.R.S.) is a summary of all reported accidents. The only way to identify if there is a correctable problem is to review each individual accident report.

We expect to complete our review by June 19, 1998. Gary Tait, of our Traffic Section, will contact you with our findings at that time.

Chairperson and Hickory Creek Resident Marta Zarrella said "The County Commission and County Staff have to realize that communities are more than just "cartops and rooftops," what they do directly affects our quality of life. They have maps, rules, and numbers, they have no idea what kind of environment or lifestyle we have out here. That is why Hickory Ridge, Dogwood Hills, Hickory Creek, Wood Dale Road, Hickory Highlands, Camelot Woods, and John Moore Road all have representative "Chairpeople" on this multi neighborhood committee.

Mark Vargo and Ted Grable are the Bloomingdale reps. We have people investigating the cost of hiring a lawyer whose expertise is in rezoning so there may be some fundraising going on. With elections around the corner, there will be some political lobbying of Commissioners and Commission candidates by our politically connected neighbors. We have people checking in with County staff weekly so that nothing elips by, and we are hoping to get the letter writing and petition igning campaign into other neighborhoods, not just those of us along John Moore Road.







