Campo YMCA safety project is no "turkey"

any Bloomingdale residents are anxiously awaiting the opening of the new Campo Family YMCA at the corner of

Bloomingdale Avenue and Culbreath Road. It seemed to take forever for the ground breaking, but now games have been played on the new Little League Senior baseball field, and a major portion of the parking area has been completed. The walls are starting to rise on the YMCA center itself. It won't be long now. Construction is scheduled to be completed in January 2001.

One of the major areas of concern that has been addressed in this area is that of providing the safest possible conditions for kids and parents to cross Culbreath Road back and forth from the YMCA to the Little League Park. This issue was opened over a year ago as a safety project by members of the Bloomingdale Area Community Council (BACC). The BACC realized that they were not professional engineers but simply concerned residents that wanted to assist in providing the safest possible environment in this area. They were given the professional support of Representative Johnnie Byrd and his staff to research possible sources of funding for this very expensive project - \$800,000 to a million dollars.

During this past session of the Florida Legislature, the request for funding this project and another related project to pro-

May 2000 meeting minutes (abridged)

•The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.All trustees were in attendance.Al Devney, President of DPMI, introduced the Property Manager's Report (printed monthly in the Gazette).

•The Treasurer's report, presented by Mr. Vince Ferraro of Ferraro and Company, listed BSTD's total fund balance of \$352,147.

•The major entryway project update showed that the surveys for Garnet and Greenhollow are complete. The board voted to borrow \$500,000 from Zion Bank to start the entryways as soon as possible. This will be discussed further at the June meeting.

•The board reviewed the policy on the definition of sealed bids. It was discussed that no exceptions should be made when the sealed bids are ready to be opened and read at a meeting.

•The assessment roll for fiscal year 2001 will anticipate an additional 167 houses to be assessed.



Revving his engine

Q: My neighbor is constantly repairing his outboard motor on the boat in his backyard. The noise is deafening, and usually continues for an hour or two in the evenings or on weekends. We can't even hear our TV set. Is there anything we can do about it?

A:To report any noise that can be categorized as a disturbance of the peace, Hillsborough County's Environmental Protection Commission (EPC) suggests you first contact the Sheriff's Department at 247-8000. If you require further assistance, please call the EPC's Air Management Division at 272-5530. The EPC protects the environment from air, water and noise pollution through surveillance and enforcement of environmental laws and rules. Each division conducts investigations of ongoing complaints. For more information, visit the Hillsborough County web site (www.hillsboroughcounty.org) and enter "Environmental Protection Commission" in the search field.

Whose pond is this?

Q: While the upkeep of the common landscaping in Bloomingdale is to be commended, I must take slight excepion to the condition of the conservation pond on Treeline rive, intersecting Cold Creek Drive, in the Windsor Woods subdivision. There is considerable overgrowth around the pond, with the weeds overflowing into the road from several privately owned empty lots. Also, because of the construction in the area, there is a lot of trash and debris that has been accumulating. The whole area is an eyesore. I have called various governmental agencies to find out who is responsible for the upkeep of the surrounding areas of the pond. Everyone I spoke with concurs that residents may not take it upon themselves to maintain the area. As far as which agency is responsible for the upkeep, everyone I spoke with has given me conflicting information.

A: It seems that you are dealing with two separate issues; overgrown yards and the accumulation of trash on privately owned vacant property, and the overall maintenance of the pond and surrounding areas. First, Hillsborough County's Community Improvement/Code Enforcement Department handles complaints concerning nuisances such as trash on lots and high weeds and grass on vacant lots. To register a complaint, call Code Enforcement at 744-5568, ext. 110.

As for the condition of the pond, it is our understanding that most (but not all) of the storm water retention pond areas in Bloomingdale are the collective property of the homeowners on the pond, with the exception of the drainage easements, which may (or may not!) fall under the responsibility of the Hillsborough County Public Works Department. Got that?! The county's Storm water Management Section offers an "Adopt-A-Pond" program to help residents keep their pond clean, clear and planted through restoration and improved

New neighbor for BSHS?

A local developer, Bob Schmid, wants to modify the zoning of the property immediately West of Bloomingdale High School and build an office complex with 77 homes. He is proposing 29,500 square feet of business and medical offices on Bloomingdale Avenue, 37 town homes to the North along the school's driveway and 40 single-family homes at the Northern boundary. Several residents have concerns about the development. One resident living near this area noted, "It presents one very major concern - more traffic located right next to the school!" It is inevitable that some type of businesses or homes will be built on this property. Having a voice in what it is can be the difference. Residents with concerns can call the County Planning and Growth Management Office at 272-5920 for additional information on the rezoning process or on how to contact the developer directly. A County zoning hearing master is scheduled to review this request on Monday, July 31st, with the County Commissioners ruling set for September 12th.



water quality projects. Ponds eligible for the program must be owned by the county or privately owned with one or more drainage easements dedicated to Hillsborough County. No wetland or protected conservation areas are allowed in the program. Access to the pond must be available for county crews and equipment, and the pond group must submit an Adopt a Pond application and demonstrate a commitment to helping to maintain their pond. For an Adopt a Pond application, call the Storm water Management Section at 272-5912. You will be asked to collect signatures from neighbors who may be interested in participating. Once the application is reviewed and your pond's eligibility is confirmed, a county biologist will meet with you and your neighbors to walk the pond and make recommendations.

ers that spend endless hours on the road, literally. Their numbers have stayed the same while our community has grown like crazy.






Do you work in central Brandon? Are you on your way to or from the Brandon Library, post office, hospital, etc.? Are you hungry for a light breakfast or a hearty sandwich? If so, please visit or call the Lunch Bag Express for some of the most carefully prepared sandwiches in the area. The restaurant is located 1 block south of Brandon Blvd. (SR60) in between Bryan Road and Montclair Avenue. You may have to hunt for it, but you'll be glad you did!

This is a family business, run smoothly and efficiently by Sandra Christiansen, who is always happy to chat with customers. I would describe the Lunch Bag Express as a quaint little restaurant boutique, brightly lit and neat, too. If cleanliness is next to Godliness, then indeed you are tapping on the door of Sandwich Shoppe Heaven when you walk in.

The restaurant opens at 7 a.m. with homemade muffins, fresh baked pastries and a great cup of coffee. Lunchtime garlen salads combine green leaf and iceberg lettuce. The chef

salad, made with ham, turkey, cheddar and mozzarella cheese, lettuce, tomato, onion, radish, croutons, bacon bits and cucumber and egg slices is only \$4.45.

A bulletin board lists the daily specials of soup and/or sandwiches, including roast beef, ham and cheese, turkey, club, BLT, Cuban, tuna, egg salad, chicken salad and another house special called the Veggie Delight, with American and Swiss cheese, onion, green pepper, olives, lettuce and tomato with your choice of dressing on a hoagie roll. I'm partial to the tuna and egg salad combination on rye with cheese, lettuce and



tomato for only \$4.25. Sandwich prices range from \$2.45 for a PBJ to \$5.45 for a club. The "Kiddie Lunch Bag" for \$2.50 includes 1/2 sandwich, chips and milk. The desserts are a daily surprise.

I suggest you try the Christiansen's original creation, the Pizza-wich, featuring pepperoni, ham, bacon, 2 types of olives, 2 types of cheeses and green pepper and onion, covered with a light pizza sauce, pressed and served on a hoagie or Cuban bread. Wonderful at only \$5.95.

One last tip. If you are looking for a caterer, call Susan. The Lunch Bag Express family is exceptional at catering your lunch or gathering.



It's clear that George and Jean have a sincere love for the game of baseball. They're especially rare in their love for kids and their willingness to accept the responsibilities and sometimes difficult challenges that come with umpiring. We can only wish we had more couples and people like them. Baseball is a wonderful game, especially at the Little League level. It takes dedicated people like George and Jean to make it possible for our kids to enjoy it as a safe and fair game. Be sure and thank them next time they umpire a game for your kids.

Bloomingdale Recreation Center renamed to bonor teen





Drought is likely to occur in every part of Florida at one time or another. Increased urbanization, coupled with a limited water supply, is predisposing much of the state to a greater chance of water shortages. Because of Florida's sandy soils, plants may experience drought stress after only a few days without rain or irrigation. During a drought, or when conditions indicate a drought may be imminent, the water management districts have the authority to restrict water use. The restrictions are designed to be equitable, but high priority is given to water use for human consumption, agriculture, and industry. Accordingly, irrigation for commercial and home landscapes may be restricted. With these limitations on water, the landscaper or homeowner must decide how best to use the limited water available for landscape irrigation.

The following guidelines are given as suggestions for management practices during drought.

Water Management Practices During Drought General Practices

Irrigation Priorities. Irrigate highly visible and intensively managed areas first.

Time of Day. Water early in the morning.

Irrigation Frequency. Irrigate deeply at long intervals rather than frequent, shallow waterings.


