To the Editor:

Congratulations to the Association on the excellent job done by Susan DeLuca and Mike Kelly at the Arvida Rezoning. I hope that it will be successful. I have seen many concerned citizens reference the forthcoming growth management law, but to no avail. I've seen many talk of the spirit and intent of the law, but the public official's ears were deaf. The widening of Bloomingdale is being pushed back further and further.

The Association's action in bringing to light the traffic problems of Bloomingdale is the first step. But if you want to be successful, it cannot be your last.

Mr. Selvey is only one vote and his votes are true to his district. It is the votes of the other commissioners that constantly defeat the progress of the Bloomingdale widening. Here are several techniques that could prove valuable if you decide to make the Bloomingdale widening a priority. First, lobby the other commissioners and report their attitudes in your press. You might

want to suggest that if they cannot provide road services to East County then they should not be approving new growth. This is essentially the attitude of the new growth management legislation. The various commissioners' replies will indicate their intentions to uphold the law or evade it.

The second action the Association may want to take is to pressure the Commission into putting Bloomingdale in a higher priority. There are a variety of options available to you: a mass call-in to the Commissioners on a predetermined date, the traditional

"fill up" the Commission chambers, or bring media attention to the issue.

The Association must decide how important road improvements are. Sadly at this time Hillsborough County government appears to respond only to external pressure and not to a sense of right and wrong. I applaude your efforts to make government responsive.

"But dear, I thought you said there were only 3!"

The sign reads "One home, three to go." It hangs in the front window of a quiet home on Peachfield Dr. in Bloomingdale East. It is the home of John and Lianne Watson and the sign refers to their four babies--yes, quadruplets. The babies were born March 22 at Tampa General Hospital, each weighing about two pounds. Their names are: Philip Ward, John David, Leigh Ellen, and Susan Ann. The babies need to weigh at least four and one half pounds to come home. (Philip came home May 17 weighing in at five pounds.)

Lianne explained that they knew they were having triplets and were just getting used to the idea when another ultrasound at Thanksgiving showed quads. Near the end of January she began having contractions and was admitted to the hospital. Lianne was given medication to stop them and was urged to stay in bed as much as possible. She remained in the hospital until the babies were

born in March. "It's a good thing John is such a good listener," she said. "I was pretty crabby those 10

She said she felt ill most of the time whether she was sitting or lying in bed while the contractions continued intermittantly each day. Finally the day came when they did not stop. The doctors had hoped they could keep the births from happening until the babies were at 30 weeks, which is considered term for quadruplets--Lianne was at 28 weeks. Lianne was rushed into a delivery room just before 7:30 p.m. She was given a general anesthetic when the doctors felt there wasn't enough time to wait for an epidural to take effect and the babies were delivered by Cesaerean section within three minutes. John, who is an Air Force flight surgeon at Macdill AFB Hospital, was permitted to be in the delivery room, but choose to wait just outside the door. He explained that it was so crowded with Lianne's doctors, a doctor and nurse for each baby, plus incubators, that he felt there just wasn't room. But he never felt left out, either.

Lianne said she felt terrific after the births. The next day she was out of bed washing her hair and shaving her legs.

The Watson's visit their babies every day. Since Philip came home, it is harder for Lianne to get to the hospital each day, but John always goes on his way home from work. "I'm glad they will come home one at a time. I need the time to bond

with each of them one-on-one. We didn't get the time in the hospital,' Lianne said. "And our neighbors have all been wonderful--we couldn't have managed without their help," both agreed. The Watson's are getting some outside help, too. Of course, relatives will be coming to Tampa to take turns helping care for four babies. Also, Gerber Baby Foods is donating some food, and Miles Laboratories is donating formula for a time. Brandon Chrysler is giving a discount on a new mini-QUADS, see page 6



Report from the

Commissioner's Desk

During recent meetings with Commissioner Selvey, the BHA requested traffic studys, exit and entrance polls, and various upgradings of law enforcement in an effort to better understand the speeding problem on Bloomingfield Drive. Bob Buschman, Director of Public Works (and Bloomingdale Resident), summed up the problem and offered solutions in this letter:

May 6, 1987

Dear Mr. Brosnaham:

This responds to your request to Commissioner Selvey concerning traffic problems on Bloomingfield Drive. The necessary traffic studies have been completed and the results are as follows:

CUT THROUGHS

On February 27, 1987, Traffic Operations personnel conducted an auto tag study during the peak hours 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The purpose of this study was to determine what percent of the motorists on Bloomingfield Drive during the peak hours are using

Bloomingfield to avoid Bloomingdale Avenue. The results of this study indicated 819 vehicles using Bloomingfield Drive. However, only 62 vehicles (8%) could be classified as "cut-through" vehicles. The majority of the vehicles on Bloomingfield Drive are residents of the Bloomingdale West subdivision. A total of 19 out of 62 vehicles that do cut through are registered to residents of Bloomingdale East. Therefore, only 43 vehicles (or 5% of the 819 vehicles recorded) are "cutthrough" vehicles from other areas.

POSTED SPEED LIMIT

Your association has asked for a reduction of the existing 30 mph speed limit on Bloomingfield Drive. The posting of a 30 mph speed limit complies with Florida Traffic Laws. Thirty miles per hour represents the safe speed under ideal conditions as well as the legal limit. Where less than ideal conditions exist (i.e., darkness, inclement weather, curves in the road, pedestrians near the roadway, etc.) it is the driver's responsibility to alter his speed to suit the existing conditions. The driver's speed is

influenced more by the appearance of the roadway and the prevailing traffic conditions than it is by the posted speed limit. Some driver's will obey the lower posted speed while others will feel it's unreasonable and simply ignore it. This disrupts the uniform flow and increases accident potential.

During March of this year, Traffic Operations requested the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office to increase enforcement of the posted 30 mph speed limit on Bloomingfield Drive as well as motorists passing school buses while children are boarding.

SPEED HUMPS

Recently, the County Attorney's Office prepared an opinion that is it unlawful for a political body, such as Hillsborough County, to install a traffic control device, such as a speed hump, which does not comply with the Florida Department of Transportation's Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. In addition, speed humps can be hazardous to bicycles, motorcycles and can delay response times of emergency vehicles. For these reasons, speed humps are not installed on public roads maintained by Hillsborough County.

CONCLUSION

Our recent 24-hour traffic count indicates approximately 4,000 vehicles use Bloomingfield Drive which serves as a local minor collector to the residents of the 900 homes in Bloomingdale West. Our auto tag study results indicate there is an insignificant amount of cutthrough traffic

Therefore, it would seem that many of the motorists exceeding the posted speed limit must be residents of Bloomingdale West. The only deterrent to this type of motorist is persistent law enforcement. We suggest Bloomingdale (with its strong homeowners association) advise its residents that the residents are causing many of the problems and not just motorists cutting through as many residents believe. As indicated earlier, we have asked the Sheriff's Office to provide additional enforcement of the speed limits in your area.

The sad part of the story is that Bloomingdale will not see the Watson quads grow up. John is being transferred in mid-June to San Antonio, Texas, to do his surgical residency. Lianne and her mother will drive the babies out there some time in July. The smallest baby, John, may be transferred to the hospital in Texas via medical flight, accompanied by his doctor. John is still having some respiratory problems.

Neither John nor Lianne seem worried or nervous about the prospect of caring for four babies simultaneously. They are calm, quiet people who recently celebrated their second wedding anniversary. And while four children ought to shatter some of



The Mobile Watch would like to give a big "Thank You" to Jim Godfrey, who is being transferred to a new military base. Jim has given many hours of his time as a base station, mobile observer, and a core committee member. We'll miss him. Good luck, Jim.

Last July, the Mobile Watch wrote a letter to the community describing the lack of volunteers. As a result of that letter, we received an excellent response to our pleas. Now we find ourselves in the same condition and feel it is time to speak out again. Our letter of last year is reprinted below. The date and numbers may have changed, but the facts haven't.

AN OPEN LETTER TO THE RESIDENTS OF BLOOMINGDALE

The time has come to take off the gloves and tell it like it is. The Mobile Watch has been trying to help our community for the past 6 years. In that time the development has grown from about 100 homes to more than 1600. Where it took one car 20 minutes to cover the occupied area it now takes 2 cars one hour each to cover the occupied sections.

When we first organized we had 55 volunteers out of about 200 adult residents. Over the years the number of volunteers has increased somewhat. Currently our roster numbers 93 active members, out of 3200 residents, which does not allow us to be out every night. To be

blunt, That percentage stinks.

We have consistently asked for volunteers to give 3 hours of their time once a month. The response we have received is slim to none. Some people have said they don't have time. Some of our volunteers work 12 hours a day and still find time to give us between 3 - 12 hours per month as mobile observers and/or base stations. Most of the residents in our community work a regular 8 hour day, and yet they don't participate. WHY???

As we don't have an active, effective Neighborhood Watch Program (signs alone don't make a Neighborhood Watch) we have been the only viable deterrant to vandalism and crime available to you other than infrequent Sheriff patrols.

We can come to only two conclusions. You don't care about protecting your community; or don't think our community needs watching.

We challenge you to prove us wrong by volunteering to join us in record numbers. If not, we will have no choice but to stop altogether as of August 31, 1986. We cannot and will not ask our few volunteers to give more time to keep the Mobile Watch operating. To volunteer, simply call any of the core members (list appears on Page 2).

Where Does All The Money Go? A Special Taxing District Monthly Report

The May 11 meeting of the Special Taxing District Board was called to order at 8 p.m. at the Bloomingdale Community Church. In attendance were Fred Uphoff, Chris Deem, Russ Thompson, Tom Calcaterra, Chris Pheils, Joe DeLuca, and Errol Whitfield. The following items were on the agenda:

1. Wall painting contract--Apollo Equipment was the low bidder as well as having the best results on

the scrub tests. A board subcommittee met with the contractor to discuss terms of the bid specifications and contract. All interpretations were agreed upon. Apollo Equipment guarantees their work and paint for one year. They also have agreed to guarantee their bid price of 18.4 cents per square foot for six months. This allows the board time to plan how many more walls can be painted this year within their budget. The Board

voted unanimously to accept the contract, and it was signed by board and contractor. The work will begin immediately and is expected to be completed in six weeks, weather permitting.

- 2. Home America, owners of part of the entrance wall at Rosemead in the West, doesn't know what they might do with the wall. They also have no plans to make a decision about it for another four to five months. No taxes have been assessed to them because their units are not finished. Tom Calcaterra made a motion to paint the wall and begin a clean-up of overgrown shrubbery and vines to give a uniform appearance to all sections of walls and entrances. It was seconded and passed unanimously. A letter will be sent to Home America informing them of the Board's intentions.
- 3. Tom Calcaterra sent a letter to the county asking for an accounting of the tax fees assessed to the STD. The county deducts money from the total collection to cover costs of that collection. The Board would like to know exactly what percentage is

deducted so it can be calculated into the budget. No answer has been received.

- 4. Joe DeLuca has contacted an accounting firm about bookkeeping services and auditing the STD books. He received a statement of qualifications from that company. It was agreed to get a few more of these so the Board can choose a good company. Tom recommended contacting local companies in the Brandon area to simplify the process and hopefully get more personalized service.
- 5. Grass mowing--bills for February and March have been paid. Lynn Wagner, Property Manager, said the company will refertilize and spray for weeds. He did not feel that the grass was growing as it should if it had been fertilized adequately, but there is no way of knowing if or how much fertilizer was used. Lynn has requested that the company contact him when they are going to be doing weed and feed so he can verify that it was done to the Board's satisfaction. The Board agreed to pay past bills, but not pay any more unless Lynn is able to see it has been done.
- 6. New fence--A Bloomingdale homeowner asked the Board, according to the instructions in their deed restrictions, to allow them to erect a fence along their property line. Their presentation included photos of people trespassing on their property and the litter that came of it. Most of the people enter their property to fish in the pond behind their house. Their property line extends half way along the side of the pond and also out to the middle of it. Cars park on the grass and have torn up the sod. The homeowner's have tried asking people to stay out of their yard and even did some landscaping to let people know it was part of their property. They don't mind the fishing, but like all property owners along ponds in Bloomingdale, they are also liable for any accidents that happen in the pond. They would have preferred to build an extension of the concrete wall that now exists next to their property, but found this prohibitive. A wooden fence of some sort was the next solution. They are considering a fence line of about 50 or 60 feet and then cutting in toward the water. This would give people access to the water for fishing, but still give them some



STREET LIGHT COMMITTEE REPORT

By Jerry Underwood Lighting District Chairman and BHA Director

The following is an updated report on all of the street light areas within Bloomingdale as of May 27, 1987.

CURRENT SITUATION:

Bloomingdale West - all sections have street lights. The only streets that do not have lights are Rosemead and the northern end of Canoga Park.

Bloomingdale East - all developed sections have street lights. Sections O, W, L, and R (subsections 1 and 2) are partially developed and do not have street lights. The remaining sections are undeveloped.

Main roads without lights are Bell Shoals, Glen Haven, Natures Way, Springvale, Erindale, and Culbreath.

CURRENT STATUS:

Rosemead\ Canoga Park - the county has not accepted the roads from Criterion because the planned sidewalks were never installed. They cannot be incorporated into the lighting district until accepted by the county.

Sections O, W, L, R (subsections 1 and 2) - approved by county December 86, lights sometime after October 87.

Bell Shoals - will be submitted for approval this year (87), lights sometime after October 88.

Natures Way (west half)\Glen Haven - approved, TECO crews will start work in June 87. 41 250 watt lights.

Special STD Lights for Dangerous

Intersections - approved by the STD for their 88 budget. Can be installed as private lights after September 87 and then incorporated into the lighting district a year later. These intersections are: Springvale and Bloomingdale; Glen Haven and Bell Shoals; Garnett and Bell Shoals; Erindale and Lithia Pinecrest; and all of Bell Shoals Road by the sidewalk leading up to the shopping center.

Get approval for remaining sections

as they are developed.

Followup with county on Rosemead and the north end of Canoga Park.

Parks East and West -YOU have some very important decisions to make.....

On Pages 16, 17, and 18 we have presented a lot of information to help you make some very important decisions regarding the future of Parks East and West. Your decisions will effect our property values, the activities of our children, and what you want and don't want now and in the future for both Parks. After you have read and weighed all the material,

you will find a ballot on Page 18. Every family in Bloomingdale is expected to fill this out and mail it in. The information will be tabulated by the BHA Board and presented to the Hillsborough County Parks and Recreation Department within two weeks. This information will then be used to write the five-year plan for our Parks.

Background Information

On May 14, Ed Radice, Director of Parks and Recreation, met with 30 residents of Bloomingdale. The initial purpose was to give the community some insight as to what will be accomplished yet this year and what is available in the years ahead. The turnout of residents was so small, it was decided that it would be unfair for these few to make the decisions for the next five years for the entire community. Therefore, it was decided that Mr. Radice's information would be presented here and a ballot on page 18 would provide the ability for the community to communicate what it

Current Status

The fence in the West is almost done, despite the damage done by vandals. There is a possibility that this fencing (foot railing) can be extended along the back of the lots that abut the Parks (both). It might help cut down on the cutting through. A "Tot Lot" is going to be built at both Parks East and West by October 1987. This is designed for very little children. The tennis courts are going to be re-surfaced at a cost of \$2,500, also before October 1987. Picnic Tables will be added and a sidewalk will be poured from the parking lot to the tennis courts in Park East. The funding of these items comes from the \$24,000 that Criterion paid the Parks Department.

AVAILABLE EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES

Each year the county allocates money for the Parks Department beginning with October. The Parks Department has no way of knowing how much will be given to them and it varies each year. When they do get money for capital improvements, they spend it according to what a community has prioritized. The more costly the requests, the longer the possibility of a wait-depending on the county.

The following are a list of items suggested by residents:

1. A recreation building in Park West. Particulars are on the next two pages.

2. Jogging paths. 4 types available: Crushed limerock (it spreads out); Clay (it washes out); Asphalt (hard on feet); and Wood Chips (goes all over).

3. Swings for babies to sit on.

4. Electricity in Park East.

5. Half-court basketball courts.

6. Increased parking facilities.

7. Tennis court lights with a timer to turn off at 10 p.m.

8. Crosswalks on the street near the parks for children to cross.

9. Some kind of top or covering over the raquetball courts.

10. No Parking signs on the grassy areas around the park.11. Programmed activities for

children and adults.

The Field House Decision

What you see here are greatly reduced photocopies of the actual blueprints of two styles of recreation centers that are available to be placed in Park West. Whichever we choose, it would be built by the tennis court/basketball area. There would be an increase in the parking area to accomodate the population and building size. These two buildings are currently in existence now, one in Balm Park and the other at Bellamy Recreation. The following is a listing of the differences between the two:

Balm Park

3,500 square foot • \$70,000 to build • Capacity of about 120 in one room No other center like this in south county
Would have manned programs geared to us
Programs would be available to anyone
Can have many activities going on all at the same time
Higher cost means it might take longer beforefunds are approved

Bellamy Recreation Building


1,700 square foot • \$35,000 to build • Capacity of about 75 in one room Would have manned programs geared to us


Both of these structures would fit in with the surrounding neighborhood and according to our local deed restrictions. When they would be build is dependent upon the amount of monies allocated through the County Commission. The buildings would be manned at times dependent upon time of year. Planned programs usually extend to 6 p.m. in the evenings. Both buildings would be available for use to anyone. The BHA, STD, Mobile Watch, and all groups would be able to meet here. The needs of the community would be placed on a priority basis. The buildings would also be available for private use, such as for a bridal reception, or private party. They would be booked through the Parks Department.



STD Money, from page 11 privacy and relief from the litter. The Board decided that it could not begin taking on the building of concrete walls in situations like this. They voted to allow the homeowner to build and maintain a fence. A letter will be sent notifying them of the decision.

7. Gulfland Homes is going to rebuild the wall on Bell Shoals that they took down for access to their construction trailer. Lynn Wagner will meet with the superintendent of construction for Gulfland. They are also responsible for repair to the wall where a car struck the edge of the open area.

8. Jerry Dvorak presented his survey of homeowners having the wooden fence put up by Pulte
Developers. He polled 27 of the 39
owners having the fence on their
property line. All of them would welcome replacement of the fence. 21 of those surveyed said they would agree to sharing a portion of the replacement cost. Of the five who said no, three are moving out of the area soon. Mr. Dvorak would like the board to keep an open mind to this problem, and hopefully consider replacement some time next year. A woman in the audience agreed with him, stating that the other homeowners in the Pulte area also would like to see replacement, and that a decrepit fence reflects on all of Bloomingdale. She also feels that on-going maintenance is costly, and that the wooden structure is not much of a safety factor for those homes. Fred Uphoff said he felt that while it is a concern of the Board, he felt that it would probably be a long-range budget item that would not be addressed for two to three years. There is an abundance of deferred maintenance

needing immediate attention. Russ Thompson added that the Board would like to put aside \$15,000 as a capital outlay for wall replacement in the future. This may come under this budget item. Joe DeLuca would like to see more input from the Bloomingdale community before spending such a large sum in a small section. The Board intends to keep it in mind and address the issue some time in the future.

On Monday, April 27, the East Tribune ran an article on the frustration citizens feel about transportation planning for the Brandon area. Citizens complain that they are not informed. The public officials insisted otherwise. The citizens are right. There are two ways in which citizens are to be informed. The first way is through the Brandon area representative to the Citizens Advisory Committee to the MPO. I am told that that individual is a Mr. John Colterman. If you haven't been receiving information from him, then begin your complaint there. The second way is through public advertisement. What have you read lately? It is my understanding that the MPO has something less than a good record on informing the general public. The MPO may not even bother to tell property owners that the MPO intends to condemn their property!
Where is Due Process of Law? For the average citizen, there is as little as possible. In the Tribune article, Mr. Kubicki says that "the board welcomes anything that people

come up with." Be aware that they may "welcome" but they may ignore it. You must be insistent.


Here are some already known techniques that are used or could be used to provide the public with information. First-public advertisments, not at the end of the process, but at the beginning. If they say it's too expensive, don't buy it. A press release is the mechanism and the newspapers will pick it up if you the readers say you want it. Second, insist that your reprensentative be required to communicate regularly with you. C.A.S.T. some months ago asked that the requirement of citizen representatives be to contact their constituents at the time of application to Boards and Committees. Commission Chairwoman Pam Iorio felt it was unnecessary. Only the vocal insistence of Jan Platt saved the request at all. It was sent to the Citizens Advisory Committee.
When did you last hear from your representatives on that committee? A third method is to duplicate a little known technique that allows for an association to request notification of


all zoning in an area by grid

number. This could be applied to transportation studies. These are a few of the many techniques available through government to inform the citizens. It angers me that you are expected to 'come up with' these things. The citizen activists tell them these things frequently. Yet the officials always insist that they were unaware of a problem. I urge you to keep up the pressure. Never give up your right to know.

STD Money, from page 26 sprinkler system and all are working now. While it is dry he tries to water the entrances at least two or three times a week. The painting at the Green Hollow entrance is almost complete. He continues to pick up trash, trying to coincide with mowing days. A portion of the wall along Bell Shoals south of the Garnet entrance is sinking. This happened last fall; Criterion said they repaired it. There is no footer under the wall, which the Board feels is needed to keep this from continuing to


happpen. They will try to find out who is liable for the problem now, Criterion or the homeowner.

10. Henry Brosnaham addressed the Board on behalf of the Bloomingdale Homeowners
Association. The BHA has been told by the county attorney that the STD or the BHA may enforce deed restrictions. The STD Board said the county told them they had no legal standing to enforce them. Henry has found that the community of Carrollwood has their STD pay the costs of

enforcement done by their homeowners association. Mike Kelly suggested a meeting between the attorney who works with the BHA, members from both boards, and the county attorney to clarify the facts. Chris Deem, who is a practicing lawyer, said he would attend a meeting to get this matter straightened out. The STD Board will contact the county attorney to initiate this meeting. Henry stated his strong feelings on the matter of deed restriction compliance in Bloomingdale. He feels both boards "need to work together to get on the case of those who make a mess of the neighborhood for others." Henry asked Lynn Wagner to attend a BHA meeting to explain his job and duties. BHA Board members receive many phone calls from homeowners and at times are not sure whether to refer the caller to the property manager, the STD Board, or handle it through BHA. Lynn agreed to attend. Henry also asked about the problem of cars parking on the grass at both Parks. He hoped small wooden signs attached to the fence would work. Fred said there used to be signs like that, but they were stolen. It was decided to ask Ed Radice of the Parks Department

about signs. The BHA is concerned about walls being taken down to allow contruction of swimming pools. Is this weakening the walls?

11. A homeowner asked permission to take down a wall on Garnet to put in a pool. She did not submit a letter on the particulars of the situation yet. Russ Thompson felt it was all right if it was replaced. Tom Calcaterra was worried about the patchy look of painting on these new sections of walls, and the overall condition of walls that are taken down and replaced. Fred said that the property owner also owns the wall, and that there are times when the equipment to dig the pool cannot be brought between houses for a specific reason. He suggested the Board require the wall be replaced as soon as the hole is dug because other contractors did not require that kind of space. Russ wants a request in writing with an answer in writing to specify replacing the wall and resodding the grass in front of the wall. It was noted that the newer walls have expansion joints every 40 feet that will resist weakening a whole wall when a portion is removed.




