

He taught me how to tie my shoes, whistle, count, multiply, swim, and most of all he helped me learn about God and how to have faith in my life.



## Phosphate Injection May Cure Leaky Water Pipes

There's something in the water but residents will neither taste it nor smell it.

What they may notice - not immediately but over time - is fewer incidents of pinhole leaks in their copper water piping. At least that's what the county is banking on.

That's because as of June 1, the county began adding ortho-phosphate to the area's water supply in an effort to reduce the copper levels in drinking water. Bloomingdale and all recipients from the Lithia Pumping Station are among the first in the county to receive the treated water.

Ortho-phosphate is a food-grade chemical, which when added to water, adheres to metal surfaces. The county is hoping it will create a barrier between water and the copper piping through which it flows inhibiting corrosion.

Pinellas county has been using this method successfully since 1988.

"Nobody knows for sure how it works, it just does." said Bob Powell, a chemist with Pinellas County utilities. "There are several theories but they vary depending on the chemistry of the system. We do know that phosphates coat metal surfaces."

Powell also said it does not create a health issue.

"People could eat it by the spoonfuls with side effects that amount to nothing more than frequent trips to the



Ironically, the brothers will have no contact except by mail. In fact, Josh will be able to phone his parents in the U.S. only two times a year.

For Josh, senior class president while at BHS and an athletically active and popular college freshman in Utah, such restrictions might seem daunting. However, young Trent seems eager to grab his two suitcases and backpack and head off to this rugged region located near Cape Horn and noted for its constant rain and countless volcanoes.

"College was really intense," he said. "and I'll really miss the upbeat atmosphere of the students and all my personal relationships, but I'm really looking forward to my time in Chile and serving my church." Josh credits his parents' strong faith and his brother's example for inspiring his own mission.

Faith and a recurring dream had a lot to do with his mother's accomplishing her goal. When the Trents were married,

business efforts, Trent also dreamed continually of being lost on a college campus.

"I couldn't find my classes; I didn't know which class I was supposed to attend or what I was supposed to be studying," she recalled. "Going back to school and getting the degree gave me a good deal of confidence, and that nightmare disappeared."

In fact, Trent feels that returning to school in mid-life is a bonus because people bring the sum of their life experiences to the classroom, making the experience more interesting.

"I think as an older student I was more focused; I could put grades in perspective, and grades came more easily," she said.

Grades came easily, but choosing a major was another matter. Trent wanted to devote her study time to something about which she was truly passionate. She sampled physical education, sociology, computer science, and even becoming a fish, game and wildlife warden before settling on criminology. An internship with the State Attorney's Office, where she started in the juvenile division and later worked with domestic violence cases in court, steered Trent toward issues surrounding victim's rights and the possibility of working with victim assis-




### To The Seniors

### Tax Topics

### **Inheritance Almost Always Tax-Free**

Many individuals do not realize it but recipients of inheritance do not pay tax on the amount received. Estate tax is paid by the estate if any is owed. Essentially an inheritance is almost always tax-free. Taxes may be due, however, if you receive a K-1 from the estate listing some taxable items.

Also, the beneficiary will not pay capital gains tax on the receipt of assets from the estate. This is due to a tax break called "stepped-up basis". The asset received will automatically step-up its cost basis to the current fair market value at time of death (or a six months later date if the estate elects a second method). This means your cost is not the same cost the decedent had but the more recent value assigned at the time of establishing the estate. If sold at this value,

then no tax will be owed.

Conversely, selling inherited property at a loss will generate a capital loss subject to certain limitations. Capital losses are deductible dollar-for-dollar against capital gains and excess losses may be carried to other years.

Sometimes it is

advantageous to disclaim an inheritance and not accept it. This is done to save estate tax on the beneficiary who also has a sizeable estate. The estate tax can be as high as 55% of assets. If the beneficiary who receives the gift should die, then less than half will flow to his/her decedents. Should the beneficiary refuse it then the gift may pass taxfree to the decedents depending on the will or

If the estate has a higher tax bracket than the decedent you should decide to take estate administrative expenses as a deduction on the estate return. However, if the decedent has a higher tax bracket then deduct the expense on the income tax return. The objective, of course, is to pay the least tax so as to maximize the inheritance to the beneficiaries. Also, estates can elect a fiscal year end. There are several benefits in electing a year end other than a calendar year. You may defer tax and reporting by the estate, take advantage of additional estate exemption amounts and further defer payment an additional year by reporting income to the benefi-

There are many complicated tax aspects on treating estate income and expense. You should meet with a competent tax advisor on how to handle your individual situation.

cases of allergies like there is to chlorine."

Pinellas studies have shown a 30 percent decrease in copper levels in their system's drinking water, and a "significant reduction" in pinhole leaks, according to Powell.

Ortho-phosphates can actually be beneficial, said Doug Ferrell, Ph.D. of the Environmental Protection Agency. "People need organic phosphorous."

In studies conducted by Hillsborough County, pre-weighed pieces of lead and copper were inserted in a pipe loop made of pvc. According to scientist Steve Axelrod, water was run through the pipes at a pre-determined rate and the metal pieces were then taken out and weighed again.

"When we added ortho-phosphate there was a remarkable drop in corrosion," he said. Axelrod added that customers will notice no difference in taste or color of their water.

Repeated tests have led the county to believe adding the chemical to the system will decrease copper levels in drinking water and reduce the number of pinhole leaks users are experiencing

For years Bloomingdale residents have fought builders,

plumbers, and insurance companies over the high rate of copper pipe failure.

Homeowners have placed blame on everything from the quality of the water, to the quality of the copper, to lightning.

John Thomas, a long-time water quality expert, believes the fault lies in the installation of inferior copper piping during what he refers to as "the Disney phenomenon"

"In the late 70's and early 80's during the building boom of west central Florida, copper was in high demand and in short supply, so builders imported copper from foreign countries which met the bare minimum building standards," he said.

The county's water supply comes from deep water wells of the Florida Aquifer. Naturally occurring substances in the water such as chlorides, sulfates, and carbonates all contribute to corrosion. Because of Florida's limestone base, carbonic acid (dissolving carbon dioxide) is also present. "It's what makes limestone porous and creates underground caves," said Ferrell.

"Carbonic acid can also eat away at copper piping," claimed Thomas, although this theory is not subscribed to by either Hillsborough or Pinellas counties or the EPA.

### Keeping You Up To Date

Joel Jackson, project supervisior for the Bloomingdale West Recreation Center, said recently it will be at least another 75 days before groundbreaking takes place at Park West. Bids went out four weeks ago, and that process, he said, takes six weeks. Tack on another month for contract negotiations and the time it takes for the county commission to give its stamp of approval.

"From the time bids are advertised until construction begins has taken an average of 100 days," Jackson said.

When completed, the 3,500-square-foot center will feature recreation, community, and arts and crafts rooms plus outdoor play area. It will be supervised full-time by the Hillsborough County Parks and Recreation Department staff which plans to have after-school and summer programs once the center is completed.

According to parks and rec director Ed Radice, the Culbreath property is in the hands of the county's real estate office and is currently being appraised.

Cross said he was working on the documents to consumate the sale of the land to the county.




