



Annual Membership Drive Underway

Mercedes has it, Nike has it, and Bloomingdale, has it - name recognition synonymous with high quality, standards and value. The Bloomingdale Homeowners Association Inc. exists to help maintain that positive image.

This week more than 5,000 homeowners who live or own property in Bloomingdale will receive an annual membership drive letter from the BHA asking for their support and annual dues payment of \$25 - a great value at less than 50 cents per week.

The organization's mission is simple - keep Bloomingdale a first-class place to live by maintaining and improving the quality of life, property values and standards of living its residents enjoy today.

The association's principal objectives, as defined by its by-laws, are to promote a spirit of neighborly relations and cooperation; promote, coordinate and obtain improved utilities, governmental services and other beneficial improvements; maintain high standards while opposing any encroachment or conduct which may lower community standards; to promote physical improvements for the common good; and to oppose any act which may depreciate property values.

Ted Grable, membership drive coordinator and past BHA president, said funds, in the form of residents' membership dues, are required to help maintain those objectives.

"The Bloomingdale Homeowners Association is different from the Bloomingdale Special Taxing District and the mandatory homeowner associations within some of our neighborhoods," Grable said. "The only income we receive to support our many community programs is income from our annual membership drive."

In addition to the many programs and activities supported by the BHA and residents' dues, board members – all volunteers who live in the community – attend myriad city, county and state meetings. Their goal is to promote and protect Bloomingdale by presenting a unified voice for issues affecting the community such as safety, development and traffic issues.

"There is something to be said about being in a community that has a [unified] voice and vision," Grable said.

The association in recent years successfully fought a Hillsborough County School District plan to rezone attendance areas that would have sent high school students in Bloomingdale West to Riverview High School on Boyette Road.

The organization also successfully petitioned the county to move the proposed location of the Bloomingdale Regional Public Library from land near the River Hills subdivision in Valrico to its current location on Bloomingdale Avenue.

The board also influenced the school district to locate Cimino Elementary School within the Bloomingdale community to better serve neighborhood families.

The association, with the help of the Bloomingdale Area Community Council, successfully lobbied to have stop lights and turning lanes installed on Bell Shoals Road at Glenhaven Drive; a northbound left turn lane on Bell Shoals at Garnet Drive; and a traffic light on Lithia-Pinecrest Road at Erindale Drive.

The BHA board is currently involved in a number of projects, including an ongoing effort to facilitate sidewalk repairs, an issue that affects hundreds of residents who use the sidewalks daily for exercise and recreation and to walk to and from school.

Through the hard work of the association's board members, neighborhood volunteers and residents' membership dues, Grable said Bloomingdale has maintained a high standard of living and community values and pride.

"When you say you live in Bloomingdale, everyone knows where that is and that it is a desirable
place to live, instead of just another faceless neighborhood," Grable said. "Maybe you can't contribute your time to help keep Bloomingdale the kind
of community we want to live in, but by contributing your membership money, you help those who
have the time help you.

The BHA, a nonprofit, all-volunteer organization, is the only homeowners association representing the entire Bloomingdale community, including Bloomingdale East, Bloomingdale West and Bloomingdale Oaks. Neighboring areas whose residents routinely support and participate in BHA activities are also included in the association's membership area, including Hickory Creek, Dogwood Hills, Hickory Ridge and Butler Road.

BHA board meetings, held at 7 p.m. on the first Monday each month at the community office, are open to the public. All Bloomingdale residents are invited to observe the proceedings or address the board with their questions and concerns. Community volunteer opportunities are always available for residents in the BHA area, from scouts and high school students to singles, families and senior citizens.



The Bloomingdale Homeowners Association receives resident and mailing address information from the Hillsborough County Property Appraiser's Office. If you received a dues notice with incorrect information, please contact the county property appraiser, (813) 272-6100.

Office:

The BHA shares the Bloomingdale Community Office and staff with the Bloomingdale Special Taxing District. The office, at 3509 Bell Shoals Road behind SunTrust Bank and the Citgo service station, is open 7 a.m. – 11 a.m. Monday to Thursday.

The community office staff maintains information about the community, helps residents resolve deed restriction complaints and neighborhood issues, and offers a notary service for a nominal fee.

Neighborhood Improvement Program:

BHA volunteers continually strive to promote and enforce deed restrictions and works with Hillsborough County Code Enforcement to promote county code and ordinance compliance. Residents can report potential violations on the community Web site or by calling the community office to request a complaint form.

B. J. Stelter Bloomingdale Community Scholarship:

Established in 2006, the scholarship is awarded annually to one or more Bloomingdale High School seniors. Scholarship applications are available year-round at the school and on the community Web site. Neighborhood Pride Program:

Introduced in 2002 to promote a sense of pride in ownership and community by encouraging neighbors to clean up and improve their homes,

yards, and streets. Neighborhood Name and Sign Program:

Ten of Bloomingdale's 40 neighborhood sections were not officially named by the original developer. The BHA introduced this program to allow homeowners in those sections to choose a name and have entryway signs installed. Currently, all 10 sections are officially named and most have received new entryway signs.

Community Cleanup Days:

The BHA, with a grant from Hillsborough County and the assistance of the Parks, Recreation and Conservation Dept. and neighborhood volunteers, conducts annual Community Cleanup Days that enable residents to dispose of household junk for free at a convenient neighborhood location. The next Cleanup Day will be held in fall 2008 at a date to be announced in the Gazette and on blooming-dalegazette.com.

Bloomingdale Area Community Council:

The BHA supports the efforts of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office and the all-volunteer BACC council to help keep Bloomingdale safe. The council meets 7 p.m. on the third Thursday each month at the Bloomingdale substation at 4342 Bell Shoals Road, next to Beef O'Brady's restaurant. Residents with questions or concerns about law enforcement issues are encouraged to attend. For infor-

In May, a group of teens from Bloomingdale High School were named grand prize winners of the 2008 Act Out Loud: Raising Voices for Safe Teen Driving contest. The online teen safe-driving contest, sponsored by National Organizations for Youth Safety and funded by The Allstate Foundation, featured 10 teams of teen driving activists from across the country who competed to raise awareness for safe driving in support of National Youth Traffic Safety Month in May.

The Bloomingdale team received a \$10,000 grand prize for their project, "Buckle Up," and will designate a \$5,000 grant to the Katie Marchetti Memorial Foundation. The foundation was created to honor the memory of Marchetti, a Bloomingdale-area teen who lost her life in 2006 in a car crash.

In April, Bloomingdale High School encouraged safe teen driving by promoting its "Buckle Up" program through the student government and by docu-

menting their project through blogs, photos and a video posting at actoutloud.org. The team also filmed a daily segment for their school's television station. which promoted seat-belt use and defensive driving and incorporated teen driving statistics and interviews from students about the importance of wearing seatbelts.

The winners were determined by the number of online votes they received on the contest Web site. The Bloomingdale teens worked tirelessly to encourage people to check out and vote for their project on actoutloud.org. As a result, they received thousands of votes.

"We're excited we won because everyone on the team has worked so hard to spread the word to our peers about being safe and responsible drivers,' said Claire Chipman, captain of Bloomingdale's team. "There are so many ways to use this money to save lives. We're really happy to have the opportunity to keep our efforts moving forward."

"This is all about saving teen lives,"said Lucas Grabeel, spokesperson for Act Out Loud and star of the movie High School Musical. "It's cool to see people who are so creative and dedicated use their talents to have a positive impact on the world around them. We have the power to help reverse these stats and help prevent our friends from becoming one of the statistics."

The top 10 Act Out Loud teams across the country educated their peers right before summer, the deadliest season for teens on the road. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, seven of the top 10 deadliest days for teen drivers fall between Memorial Day and Labor Day. In 2002, Westfield purchased the shopping center and Cimino Elementary School opened in response to rapid residential development in Bloomingdale.

By 2007, Westfield Brandon opened a new wing with higher-end retailers to keep up with the changing demographics of the community. The population had grown by nearly 20 percent to 287,750 (compared with the national average of 5.8 percent), and the median price of a home had jumped 2.5 times to \$249,900.

More high-end housing developments, like Culbreath Estates and the Wrencrest Circle development on Erindale Drive, took up every bit of available land in Bloomingdale.

Some areas like FishHawk Ranch in Lithia experienced population growth as high as 57 percent since 2000, with a median home price of \$379,900.

Today, the greater Brandon area is outgrowing itself and expanding even more to the east, south and west with high-end development and extensive road-widening on Bell Shoals, FishHawk Boulevard. and Lithia-Pinecrest Road.

Parents Must Monitor Idle Summer Hands, Minds






