Easter Bunnies are hoppy house pets

As spring and the Easter holiday approach, many area pet stores feature rabbits for sale as pets. Surely at first glance bunnies are adorable and loveable, but do they really make good house pets?

The Kelly family of Bloomingdale East thinks so. Mimi and Dan Kelly and their three children Brigette, Kevin and Caitlin welcomed their abbit, Peter, into their family 5

years ago. The Kellys all agree that Peter is a very affectionate, gentle creature who thankfully requires only a limited amount of time and attention.

Peter is housed in a bunny hutch on the Kelly's screened lanai. During the day, the door to his cage is left open so that he can hop

about the patio. Mimi sees this space to roam as optimal for house rabbits. "I always feel bad for the rabbits that are continually caged. Peter obviously loves to have some freedom", she says. The rabbit can often be found playing on the lanai, pushing his toy ball around with his nose and chasing it. The Kellys delight in their affectionate pet, who will approach them fearlessly in hopes of being petted. "Peter will sit still to be petted for as long as you are willing", says Mimi. The Tampa Bay Humane Society recommends that although a rabbit does need a hutch for sleeping and for when he cannot be attended, he should be taken out and played with and socialized as a part of the family, just as you would do with a dog or a cat. And as with a cat, rabbits can be housebroken. The Kelly's bunny is litter trained, and uses the boxes

provided in his cage and on the lanai with fairly good accuracy. Clean up consists of a weekly sweeping of the floor and changing of the bedding.

The Kelly's rabbit has enjoved excellent health, and area veterinarians report that rabbits are very hearty pets with very few major health problems. Laurie Piana, Service Coordinator of Animal Medical Center at 1102 East Bloomingdale Avenue, concurs. "We have only two clients at this facility who bring their rabbits in to see Dr. Antunano", says Piana. "Generally rabbits are very good natured animals with few medical problems. We do have one rabbit owner who needs to bring her bunny in monthly," she says smiling, "to have its teeth trimmed! Every month we trim down the teeth and sure enough within a few weeks the bottom teeth have grown back over the Continued on page 8



QUESTION: I am considering selling my older home. Should I be concerned about selling it in competition with new homes?



upper lip," Piana says. "This is an abnormality however and very rare. Most rabbits do just wonderfully and have little or no major health problems. As with any outside pet," she adds, "there are sometimes fleas and ear mites, but those can be dealt with effectively." Piana cautions that the popular flea serums such as Advantage must not be used on rabbits or any other animals not listed on the packaging. Other safety precautions to be aware of include the importance of protecting rabbits from temperature extremes, predators, electrical cords, rough handling and poisons. The Humane Society recommends that rabbits be spayed or neutered. Vaccinations are not required, but bunnies should be de-wormed.

As for a rabbit's diet, the House Rabbit Society, whose primary consideration is the welfare of house rabbits, recommends feeding bunnies commercial rabbit chow supplemented by carrots and occasional treats. Breeders caution against providing lettuce or cabbage as a snack since leafy greens can cause digestive problems and even death in pet rabbits. (remember the rabbits passing out in Mr. MacGregor's garden?!). The Kellys teed Peter the recommended rabbit chow and alfalfa, with occasional snacks of a fruit and nut rabbit treat mix. But for Peter, nothing hits the spot quite like a banana. "He loves bananas so much," says Mimi, "that his back actually twitches when you give him some!" Fresh bananas or the dried variety that appear in the treat mix are the Kellys' bribe of choice at night when it's time for Peter to return to his hutch, a suggestion that the family would like to pass along. "We used to chase him around and corner him when it was time to go back in his cage, and he would just be so upset. Finally we figured out that if we put his treat in the hutch he would gladly retreat on his own."

The general consensus on the disposition of rabbits is that they are indeed very sociable and sweet animals. Occasional nips and scratches are inevitable but, as Mimi notes, "The kicking and scratching that occurs seems to be instinctual rather than aggressive," as it only seems to happen when the rabbit is being picked up suddenly or handled in a precarious manner. The Kellys would recommend rabbits as pets to families who have some space to provide the freedom they

thrive on, and a bit of time for care and attention. Mimi appreciates the fact that compared to other pets they require very little maintenance and can be left alone for extended periods of time if need be. Rabbits are inquisitive, sociable animals that by all accounts are well suited to be house pets. They are indeed lovable, gentle animals (did you know they can purr?), and can be trained with a little patience and attention. If you decide to bring a real Easter bunny into your home this spring, you may find it to be a very enjoyable, low maintenance addition to your family.





charm and quality of her work, and suggested she market her obvious artistic skills. Pearson acted on their suggestions, and a career was born.



It was only a matter of being in the right place at the right time.



He hired me as an artist with very limited experience and really gave me a chance to develop my skills and confidence". Carapella, owner of Cozzoli's Pizza at Regency Square Shopping Center, says of working with Pearson, "Deborah is a very pleasant person who works hard and does a good job. I would certainly recommend her to anyone interested in having some decorative painting done". Upon hearing of Pearson's growing portfolio of work, an obviously delighted Carapella indicates, "I am very happy for her and glad to have had the opportunity to help her get started."



Bloomingdale community notes

Community Oriented Policing-a new idea? Not really, but it's not just a rehash of the old "cop on the beat" either. To quote author Robert C. Trojanowicz it's "A philosophy of full service, personalized policing, where the same. officer patrols and works in the same area on a permanent basis, from a decentralized place, working in a proactive partnership with citizens to identify and solve problems".

In addition to permanent shifts and area (zone) assignments for Patrol Deputies, Hillsborough County Sheriffs Office has assigned Community Resource Deputies to various areas, some "squad Based", combining Patrol and CRD duties, while others are permanently assigned to Community Stations.


In our station at 4342 Bell Shoals Rd.., we serve the "Bloomingdale Community", which, for our program, is defined as the area between John Moore Rd., and Lithia Pinecrest, bordered on the North by Bloomingdale Ave. and to the South by the Alafia River. The Community Station offers service to surrounding areas also and provides a workplace for nearby Squad Based CRD's such as the Buckhorn area's Deputy Jillene Castro.

Probably the most common complaint and identifiable problem we hear is TRAFFIC. Lets face it we are in one of the major growth areas and the situation is not going to go away! WE, a little word of tremendous importance and responsibility, because it's the "we" that can make it better, not the "they" (who must have caused this mess), or the "them" (who will fix it for us).

WE are the ones that have to leave early enough to get where we're going on time so we don't have to:

Speed ("I can go 5 to l0MPH over the posted limit, or "That 25or 30MPH sign in my neighborhood is just an advisory", and there is always "What speed limit sign?"). Like the song says-WRONG! This will cost you money, time and points on your license.

Run Stop Signs: ("But I slowed down!) Same song-more money! A YIELD sign means slow



down, yield right of way to oncoming traffic, then proceed. However STOP means just that! All motion ceases! The wheels are not rolling!

Roll Through Right Turn On Red: "W" word again! You Must stop first, then proceed with caution and you do NOT have the right of way.

Tailgate: Getting there a few car lengths behind is better than parking in the trunk of the one in front of you! Same song-Mo' money.



The return of the yo-yo

The sign in the window of a Bloomingdale East consignment shop says it all: "Yo-Yo club... It's not the same old yo-yo!" Maureen Jensen, owner of Bloomin' Kids at The Village Center plaza on Bell Shoals and Glenhaven, displays the sign in support of the Brandon Pro Spinners, a yo-yo club for kids of all ages. Maureen's sons Erick, 9 and Anders, 7 are members of the club, which was founded last October and originally held weekly meetings at the Brandon West Recreation Center. The popularity of the club has since soared to the point that, due to space limitations, meeting, are now being held at Sadie Park Recreation Center in Brandon, Friday nights from 8:00 – 9:30pm.

Tim Mulligan of Bloomingdale West Recreation Center was sorry to see the club relocate after only one general meeting last year, but concedes that the membership grew so quickly they had to make a move. "I attend the club meetings whenever I can and try to bring back the tricks and skills I learn to the kids here at our after school program. I would recommend the Brandon Pro Spinners to kids ages 8 to 12, maybe some younger if they have a high interest. Everyone involved just has a lot of fun, and it's a safe place for the kids to hang out for awhile on Friday night and meet new

friends", says Mulligan. Meetings are held indoors at the Sadie Park rec center, and while most parents do drop off and later pick up their older children, many do stay and participate. And vo-vo contagion seems to be ageless. Mulligan, who along with several other adults help out as needed at the meetings, has seen a 2 year old yo-yo prodigy having a great time right alongside a grandfather brushing up on an old past time.

The Spinners provide yo-yo enthusiasts with an opportunity to hone their skills and learn the latest tricks. Members can earn certificates and prizes as they advance through a serious of skill levels, all free of charge. The group is sponsored by Yomega, Bandai and Kitty Hawk Kites, manufacturers and distributors of specialty yo- yo's, and by HPK Marketing.

Coordinator David Brunner says the club boasts a current membership of about 360 kids, ages 4 and up. Weekly attendance of club meetings runs at about 120 members. Brunner, an Officer with the Tampa Police Department, is also active in the "Dare to Dream, Dare to Do" school assembly program currently being offered in Hillsborough County Schools. Brunner and his associates use their advanced yo-yo skills to captivate their young audiences as they present lesson about achieving personal goals and dreams and steering clear of the "dream killers" alcohol and drugs. "We really grab their attention with the tricks and stunts and that makes it much easier to deliver our message," says Brunner. "Once the tricks begin, you could hear a pin drop in these assemblies," Brunner marvels.

The yo-yo craze has been growing since last summer, when K-B Toy Works Assistant Manager Beth Allen first began to notice an increased demand for the toys. "We just cannot keep the yo-yo's in stock," says Allen. "The Yomega X-

Brain continues to be the most sought after, but they have been in such demand that it seems the kids will buy any kind they can get their hands on." She estimates her store in Bloomingdale Square sells an average of 150 yo-yos a week, "When we have them!" she adds.

Basic yo-yo prices range from about \$3.00 for the Duncan variety to about \$15.00 for the popular Yomega series. Specialty stores like Kitty Hawk Kites and Learningsmith at Brandon Town Center carry top of the line models such as the Silver Bullet yo-yo, advertised to be made of the same metal the space shuttle is composed of. The Silver Bullet sells for a staggering \$100. Yo-yo enthusiasts credit the popularity of the Yomega series to the smooth spinning bearing assembly which allows the yo-yo to spin faster and "sleep" longer than traditional models. Clerks and customers alike agree that the very expensive models perform similarly to the more affordable varieties, and offer

little else than the notoriety of owning one. This is definitely a fad in high gear.

K-B's Allen also notes an unprecedented demand for replacement yo-yo strings, presently available in quantities only by mail order. Apparently yo-yo string takes a beating due to the repeated practice of today's popular tricks. Docile stunts you may remember like walk the dog and rock the cradle have been joined by many quicker and more difficult tricks such as Brain Twist and Lunar Loops.

The typical yo-yo customer at K-B Toy Works ranges in age from 4 through teens. "We even have some associates who have quite a collection of them", says Allen. The last shipment of yo-yo's that K-B received numbered several hundred. Within a week, they were all sold. Could the hulahoop be far behind?! Signs of Spring

On any given Saturday, all through the year, you can see the signs dotting Bloomingdale street corners. Some are scribbled on neon poster board anchored to stakes. others computer generated copies taped to street signs, all bearing similar advertisement; "Garage Sale!"..."Huge Yard Sale"..."Multi-Family Sale". Especially in the spring when we are treated to clear, mild mornings, garage sales are a popular way to spend a few hours (or an entire day) relishing the weather, chatting with neighbors, unloading garage and attic cast-offs, and haggling with complete strangers. All in good fun, of course.

On a recent Saturday morning we counted 21 yard sales being held throughout Bloomingdale East and

West. Furniture and clothing topped the list of items being offered. Baby paraphernalia and used toys were the most sought after items, according to bargain hunters. On this crisp Saturday morning Laura Bowen of Quail Briar Drive and her dog Sassy set up shop at 6:30 am, in hopes of unloading a variety of items including furniture, clothes, toys and odds and ends. Lou DiPaolo and his sons Christian, 9 and Nathaniel, 5 bundled up against the early morning chill to man their garage sale. 

tor hired by the STD to manage property repairs and maintenance, says that most garage sale signs go up on Friday and thankfully are taken down by Monday, when he makes his usual rounds inspecting the community property. However, Devney notes that some signs are posted in places that are clearly inappropriate. "On many occasions I have had to pry nails out of newly planted trees," he winces, "and remove staked signs from the middle of trampled flower beds". Stake-type signs inserted along the roadside in the grass and notices affixed to street signs with clear packing tape will get the word out without creating a nuisance or destroying our community property.

To keep the peace on your street, garage sales should be an occasional occurrence. Do you have a neighbor who seems to be making a living year round running garage sales? Do you often feel like you are walking into a flea market parking lot

when you only wanted to go outside and get the Sunday paper? You might then be interested to know that there is a Hillsborough County ordinance that states residents may hold no more than two (unlicensed) yard sales in a six-month period.

Garage sales are a fun "something to do" on a free weekend. They can inspire us to clean out our attics and closets with the promise of a little "found money" for a day's work. And anyone who has sold clothes out of their driveway knows that there are plenty of people not able to pay full price for clothing and toys or baby items that really appreciate the bargains offered. Then there is the sheer amusement of watching the inevitably well heeled customer with a Tommy Hilfiger shirt pull up in a Jaguar and promptly offer you 50 cents for an old tape dispenser you had marked 75 cents. All in good fun, of course.


