


waiting for Zoning Hearing Master Martin Smith's recommendation to the County Commission. The additional concerns center around the increased traffic generated at and near this site.





### The Alafia -A river to respect

Most Bloomingdale residents know there's a river called the Alafia just south of us, but not many of us have the privilege of really knowing the river.

The Alafia is a living, breathing, delicate wonder of nature.

It is a narrow, twisting river that winds it way under huge oaks, tall cypress trees and beautiful cedars. There are birds wading in the shallows, turtles bobbing up and down, opossum and raccoons wondering on the shores, and even an occasional alligator streaming

Walt Molkenthin really knows the Alafia. His family has owned property on the edge of the river since 1942. The Molkenthins have enjoyed fishing, canoeing and the peaceful setting of the Alafia over the past forty-plus years, during which Walt says the river has seen good times and bad.

Walt has some serious concerns about the Alafia's present and future. His property is close to where a canoe launch is being proposed. He remembers the old canoe launch near his property, and the problems that finally resulted in it being closed down.

"I am very concerned about this proposed canoe launch," he said. "There would be some real security and traffic issues with it. I've already had folks using the river invade our privacy, abuse our docks

and trash the river."

"The main thing we want is for everyone to respect our privacy and to respect the river. I've seen people throw cans at the birds wading on the shore. That's not respect at all. The huge hole near our dock is full of all kinds of pure junk."

Walt is also concerned about the pumping of water from the Alafia to other counties. The pump located on the southeast corner is supposed to siphon 51.7 million gallons of water a day to relieve

"What about our stressed supplies?" said Walt. "The Alafia is already about fifty percent down and we're in one our worst droughts ever. There is no real way to know how much water is being pumped out.We'll know when the river turns into a creek!"

Another critical concern lies upriver. In 1997, 54 million gallons of acidic water were spilled into the Alafia from a gypsum stack at the Mulberry phosphate plant. State regulators estimate that 1.3 million fish died as a result of the spill. The river still has not fully recovered.

The prospect for another environmental hazard looms as Mulberry Corp. struggles to stay in business.

Officials concur that if the company shuts down and the plant is not maintained, acidic ponds could once again flow into the Alafia. It could cost the state, and taxpayers, \$100,000 a week to maintain the plants. As Walt said, "The Alafia River is irreplaceable and demands our protection. It can't protect itself from so many real dangers."

"We must respect this river and those who live along its shores."







### Lights, sidewalks, action!

A lack of streetlights and sidewalks has led homeowners in the newest section of Bloomingdale East to turn to the County for help.

Bloomingdale Homeowners Association (BHA) Vice President Len Jasczak can attest to the precarious safety conditions in the vicinity of the southern intersection of Culbreath Road and Natures Way.

The Jasczaks live in Bristol Green, off Culbreath Road, just north of the intersection.

"Unlike the rest of Bloomingdale, this area has absolutely no lighting," said Jasczak. "In the morning there are children waiting for school buses in the dark. This is unsatisfactory for a development of this size and the large number of children living here."

Incomplete sidewalks along Culbreath Road are also a safety concern for area residents.

"There is a critical need for complete sidewalks on both sides of Culbreath Road before the new school opens, before there are hundreds of children and cars negotiating that intersection twice a day."

The BHA sent a letter regarding the lack of lights and sidewalks to three Hillsborough County Commissioners on January 12, 2001.

Hillsborough County Director of Public Works Bernardo Garcia responded in a February 1, 2001 letter.

Garcia indicates that, pending a satisfactory review by the County's Traffic Engineering Section, streetlights will be recommended for installation.


But don't put your flashlights away yet.

The county review process generally takes about six months to complete, and there's no guarantee that it will be approved. Sidewalks don't appear to be on the horizon any time soon either.

The owner of 11+ acres of land off Springvale Avenue in loomingdale East purchased the property last year with full knowldge of standing deed restrictions that clearly prohibit modifications the drainage easements and usage of the property. The land is oned for conservation and recreational use.

The original deed restriction documents state that the restricons shall remain in effect for a period of 30 years, after which time a en-year extension will continue, unless at that time the affected proprty owners agree to change the restrictions.

We purchased our property accepting these restrictions and expect new property owners to respect and abide by the same

The owner is asking the County to vacate the drainage easement on the site, a prerequisite action required for the rezoning of the property. Once the County vacates the easements, the owner intends o seek RES-4 zoning, which allows the construction of four singlemily homes per acre.

A previously scheduled February 27 hearing has been continued. The applicant is coordinating with the County Real Estate to determine when the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) will hear the easement request.

According to County Project Manager Brian Grady, the date of the coning change hearing will be on or after the easement request heardate. The new hearing date should be determined in the next two ks. A request to post the proper "Notice of Public Hearing" sign on







Why are my teeth sensitive?

If you have teeth like Rambo and they never bother you, you are in a small select group of people. Of course, nothing bothers Rambo, so maybe that's a bad example. Most people don't

think much about their teeth as teenagers, but as we get older we find they can give us all kinds of sensations. Just why do our teeth feel the way they do?

This is not as simple a question as it would initially seem. Obviously, if you have a hole in your tooth,; if your tooth is very loose; your gums are sore and bleed just by touching them; or many other signs; you have dental problems that need attention now! But what about the other weird things we feel sometimes when we eat or drink things. You must remember these are real generalizations at best, but this is what I usually see when someone has a certain feeling that they're concerned about. Sweet sensitivity almost always means there is new decay or old leaking dentistry. Hot sensitivity is not a good sign for the nerve in your tooth. Go to your dentist now. Occasional pain on firm biting - possible fracture in the tooth - may be serious or not. Cold sensitivity is caused by too many things to discuss here and is not always bad. Brushing sensitivity exposed root surfaces on teeth. These are the top five problems seen in my practice.

All of these should be evaluated by your dentist when they occur with any regularity.

Things have definitely progressed from the old days of depending on volunteer dads to mow and maintain the park.







### Winthrop dream takes shape for Brandon couple

By Laura Frazier

Brandon residents John and Kay Beckett Sullivan will watch their dreams take shape this year at the corner of Bloomingdale Avenue and Providence Road

The Sullivans are the developers and town founders of Winthrop, a traditional neighborhood development (TND) being planned for construction on the 148-acre former Hobbs Dairy farm in Brandon. A TND incorporates single-family homes, townhomes, apartments, retail units and community facilities into one "walkable" community.

Plans for the development are in the final stages of a lengthy multiple-use rezoning process, which John reports is going smoothly. "We

anticipate announcing a groundbreaking date this spring," he said.

Construction will begin with a retail center on the northwest corner of the site. The developers say that building the retail center on the outskirts of the development will allow shops to establish consumer support from outside the community while the new village is being built, and for

Plans call for a total of 690 residential units, including 220 single-family homes plus townhomes and apartments. "There will be a wide spread of price ranges, with affordable

options for a large segment of homebuyers," said Kay Beckett Sullivan. Home prices have not yet been set.

By the time the first residential units are completed, a new school will already be in place. Symmes Elementary School, currently under construction just outside Winthrop off Watson Road, is scheduled to open for the 2001 - 2002 school year.

Andres Duany, the world-renowned architect best known locally as the designer of the communities of Celebration in Orlando and Seaside in the Florida panhandle, is Winthrop's town planner. Dr. James Moore, USF Professor of Architecture and local proponent of traditional and neo-traditional architecture, is the town architect.

John and Kay will be among the first residents of Winthrop. "That's where our townhome will be," John says, pointing to a hypothetical homesite in what is, for now, a wide open field with a couple of old cow barns. But, like the quote headlining the Winthrop billbo says, "Nothing happens, unless first a dream."

### Who let the dogs out?

A pack of stray dogs has some Bloomingdale homeowners looking nervously over their shoulders when they're out for an evening stroll.

No one has been bitten yet, but the animals have reportedly exhibited aggressive behavior, including giving chase to at least one resident out walking his dogs.

Over the past several years, stray dogs have frequently been seen roving the banks of the Alafia River and the future elementary school site, a 22-acre vacant parcel situated between Culbreath Road and Lithia Pinecrest Road.

Residents are concerned that the impending new school construction will drive the dogs even closer to homes situated on the area's wooded conservation sites and the river bank.

Hillsborough County Animal Services records indicate a number of unrelated calls about stray dogs have been responded to along

Dennis McCullough, Animal Services' Communications Supervisor, says a more concentrated effort is required to resolve the problem, and

he'd like to help.

"We are here to serve the community, and would like to help resolve this problem," said McCullough. "We will need a homeowner homeowners willing to give our catch crew access to their property to , set up traps and to help us monitor them."

McCullough said the crew would not set traps in remote areas unless an emergency situation exists. Limited manpower combined with a demanding county-wide work load could result in an animal being trapped for up to 15 hours, a situation McCullough says is cruel and unnecessary in all but the most extreme circumstances.

Once the animals are trapped, they are taken to Animal Services, scanned for microchips and held for seven days before being evaluated for adoption potential.

Homeowners who wish to support the BHA's efforts to have the animals removed or are willing to provide the County's catch crew with access to their property, are asked to call Dennis McCullough at (813) 744-5660, extension 221.
