

- 2. Need feed-back from the Watch Members as to a desire to extend coverage to other days.



Apple-Ham Casserole

cooked, diced ham

2 TB prepared mustard

2 apples, cored and sliced

2 TB lemon juice

brown sugar

1 tsp. grated orange rind

2 TB flour

Place the ham in a 12 quart casserole and spread with mustard. Place the apples over ham and sprinkle with lemon juice. Combine the brown sugar, orange rind and flour and sprinkle over apples. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Serves 4 to 6 people.



GARDEN TIPS

ROSES

Now that we are pretty sure that we won't have another freeze or frost it's time to prune your roses to insure a good crop of blooms in the months to come. Good pruning is essential for productive plants since most current roses bloom on new wood. The main objectives of pruning are:

1. To remove any old, damaged or weak wood to maintain the plant in its most healthy state.

2. To provide as much new growth so that the number of blooms is maximized.

3. To provide a sturdy framework for continued growth.

The first step in rose pruning is to clean the plant of any diseased tissue and to remove any damaged canes. Once accomplished, the next step is to clear out the center of the plant by removing most of the small growth which typically crowds the center of the plant. This allows for good air circulation which is important to the prevention of disease. The final and most difficult (emotionally) step is to remove about one third of all remaining growth. When you are finished, you should end up with four or five main healthy canes remaining on the plant if your plants are two to three years old. Older plants will be larger and should have perhaps six or eight well-placed remaining canes. If you have just planted your roses, the only pruning you should do is to rub off the inward directed buds to help maintain the center of your plants as clear as possible.


