Flexibility and Changes Keys to Surviving Modern Motherhood

My next door neighbor, Charis Wheless, and I had a good laugh the other day. We talked for an hour about children, work, and husbands, which isn't unusual for neighbors except for the fact that it was the longest

conversation we've conducted in the four years since we've been neighbors.

Demanding schedules and meeting the needs of our respective families have limited our chances to build a neighborly friendship although in that one hour we managed to find plenty of thoughts to share on a range of topies.

One thing we agreed on is that you can look up and down our street during the day and encounter very few stay-at-home moms—a result, we believe, of the

ever increasing number of women seeking financial rewards or personal fulfillment in jobs or volunteer work.

Like many young mothers today, Charis has had to weigh the benefits and disadvantages of working full-time or part-time, her job choices changing with each adjustment to family size and schedules. In fact, as we talked, we agreed that change and flexibility were key components in modern day mothering whether one is a young mother like Charis with a new baby, a preschooler, and middle-schooler or a middle-aged mom (like myself) with three in college

and one in junior high,

Part of our lack of connection over the past few years has been the result of our various forays into the work world while trying to meet all of our obligations to children's

activities and local volunteerism. Finding a part-time teaching job to approximate the children's school day helped me to avoid one of the biggest headaches for working moms: the daycare dilemma.

Charis began working full-time when her oldest child, Mishell, was three and continued working full-time until her second child, Kristina, was born in 1992. So she was faced with choosing daycare for her youngest.

"It's really a difficult choice. No matter how many times you visit a

day care facility, there's always the nagging fear that your children are not being cared for the way you would want them to be,"commented Charis, adding, "And their healthit seems my daughter was always getting sick with whatever was going around with the other kids!"

During the same time, she was attending classes at night for licensing in therapeutic massage. Like so many other young women, Charis was looking for an occupation in which she could tailor the hours around the needs of her

Meeting "Illuminates" Park Lighting Issue

Twelve Bloomingdale residents joined representatives of the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association at a special meeting held in the Community Office on April 17

to discuss the pros and cons of the proposed lighting system for the tennis and baskethall courts located in the Park East and West complexes.

Guests Lois Kessler and Larry Mitchell of the Hillsborough County Parks and Recreation Department answered homeowners' questions and addressed their concerns about the proposed lighting. Mitchell, who is Manager of the County Parks and Recreation Bond Program, discussed with residents the sophisticated lighting systems

being considered since one objection to the project centered on the potential glare from court lights projecting onto properties surrounding the parks.

"Technology is there to direct the amount of lighting needed toward the specific activity," commented Mitchell. "We're looking at the General Electric sports lighting where we can redirect what's called 'the spill and glare' away from residents' lawns."

Fitted with devices called louvers or hoods, the court lights would provide one foot candle of light or the equivalent of one street light, with the focus of the light directed toward the sports activity.

A second objection was expressed by one Bloomingdale East homeowner who felt the lighting would encourage

> non-residents to enter the neighborhoods to use the facilities at night, increasing the noise factor and safety concerns in the immediate areas.

Mitchell pointed out that the lighting systems could be manually controlled or fitted with timers to automatically shut off at nine in the evening to eliminate sports activities and noise past a designated time.

Several residents expressed their support for the court lighting, pointing out that it gives working adults a chance

to unwind with a sports activity in the evening after work."

Although the majority present at the meeting favored the lighting, it was acknowledged that a consensus of opinion is needed from all homeowners whose properties are adjacent to the East and West Parks. Consequently, a major item on the agenda for the May 13 meeting of the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association will be a continued discussion of the lighting issue. All residents who feel their properties will be impacted from the addition of the lighting system are strongly urged to express their support or their concerns at the upcoming meeting.

Would you buy a house where the next door neighbor parks on their lawn or doesn't cut their lawn? Well, sadly here in Bloomingdale there are people who do park on their lawns and don't cut their lawns. These are both some of the common deed restrictions that are violated. It's very sad when people don't respect the rules and regulations that we are all obligated to follow.

Our volunteers send out deed restriction cards for all violations that are called into the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association (BHA) office. Most of the time, probably 75% of the time, the majority of people comply; those that don't usually are sent a second notice. Unless the complaining party wants to file a lawsuit, that is as far as we can go to try to get compliance. The BHA has a special fund set up to help anyone who wants to file a lawsuit if the BHA feels the suit can be won in court. So far, we haven't had anyone file a lawsuit, but it is an option if you feel strongly about an offending neighbor. Most homeowners are conscientious and do a great job keeping up their property. which in turn keeps their property value up, and consequently yours, too.

Brandon and Bloomingdale are growing by leaps and bounds and it is a beautiful, convenient place to live and

If anyone has good ideas on how we can improve our neighborhoods, please come to our monthly BHA meeting, we'll be more than glad to listen. To most of us our homes are our biggest investments we'll ever make. We want to keep Bloomingdale a place we're proud to call home. Let's not let our neighborhoods get run down, pitch in, help a neighbor who needs help fixing a fence, cutting their lawn, etc., when illness or other problems occur. Maybe someday you'll need help and there will be a neighbor there for you.

Abandoned homes can be a problem, especially in older sections of Bloomingdale. If you have one near you, call the BHA office and we'll notify the county to see what can be done, also, we'll make the sheriff's department aware of it.

If you are a new homeowner in Bloomingdale and didn't get a copy of the deed restrictions, call the BHA office at 681-2051 and we will make sure you get a copy of your area.


On March 15, the eighth grade class from Immanuel Lutheran School in Brandon took an exciting, yet educational five-day trip to Washington, D. C.

Dr. Garry A. Scheuer, Jr., founding pastor of St. Mark United Church has retired from the church after 14 years of tireless service. He has also served six previous churches over a 38 year period.

Dr. Scheuer moved to the Brandon area in Janu-

ary of 1983. He was called by the United Church of Christ Board for Homeland Ministries to begin a new church locally.

Services began at the old Center Place on Vonderburg Drive and by 1987 the congregation grew so much that it had to be moved to its present location at 2914Lithia Pinecrest Road. This building has served the congregation and community for the past

Looking forward to his retirement, knowing now he will being able to spend more time with his family-wife, children and grandchildren. There will also be a little more time to pursue his

various interests and hobbies. His wife Carolyn, Director of Music at St. Mark Church, is also retiring. She has served in this position since the beginning of the church, and was the church secretary for the first 8 years. She will continue with the Brandon Youth Theater and with her voice studio, teaching three days a week.

Dr. Scheuer makes the analogy between one golfer and St. Mark. "Tiger Woods won the Masters Tournament by the largest margin ever. He shattered records held by such greats as Nicklaus and Floyd. He is the first member of his race and the youngest ever to win the Masters. He is a young champion. The future is wide open before him. 
traditional symbol - is the Lion).

School Uniforms

Responses to a Lithia Springs Elementary School uniform survey indicated a preponderance of parents favor such a program, according to principal Connie Gilbert.

Reporting the results of the survey to the school's P.T.A. Board of Directors, she said her staff is studying the implementation of a uniform program for the fall of 1997. She said she favors a navy blue and khaki uniform with a collared white shirt or blouse, either woven or knitted.

Gilbert said the program will be optional, but expects about eighty percent compliance if Lithia Spring s follows the experience of other schools which have already started a uniform program.

Many schools have reported a decrease of discipline problems and distractions with uniforms, Gilbert said, While economically favorable for parents' pocket books, the primary reason for uniforms is a classroom atmosphere that increases learning.

Gilbert said she will make a presentation of uniform's policies and details at the last P.T.A. meeting of the school year, May 20. This meeting will also conduct the business of the nominating committee for the next year's P.T.A. Board and will also honor school volunteers.

Accelerated Reading Program

A program designed to interest students to read more and more books with increasingly better retention has been started at Lithia Springs Elementary with the third grade classes.


By the fall of 1997 semester, all other classes will be added to the "accelerated reading program."

The accelarated reader is a system of computerized testing and record keeping. The student selects and reads a book from his grade level, goes to the computer, and takes an objective test about the book. The computer can take the place of book reports and evaluations and assures the teacher the student has read the book and then is graded on

comprehension. The computer keeps the student and teacher aware of how many books he/she has read and how they are scored and accumulates points for a total. Teachers use the system as both a game and motivational tool.

According to teachers and librarians, the program generates the student's enthusiasm for reading: The more books, the more scores are accumulated. The computer does the paperwork by tabulating and recording constantly.

The real benefit is measurable, with this program students gain better performance on academic achievement tests in both reading and mathematics.




