## Is Your Child Is In Danger?

- The Internet browser history is empty. (Kids

## What Parents Can Do

- Learn about the Internet and keep up with technology.
- Surf the Internet with your kids and ask them to show you their favorite destinations.
- Review the content of what your teenagers read and/or type in chat rooms or by instant messaging.
- Keep computers with Internet access in a family room, kitchen or living room, not the child's bedroom.
Educate your teen about the potential dangers of online communication, online sexual predators, and online sexual solicitarooms. phrases.
- Set up a family Internet policy that includes scheduled times and permissible websites, and limit online communication to familiar peers. - Tell your children that personal information stays personal.
- Keep kids out of chat
- Get to know their "online friends" just as you would their school friends. Learn Internet lingo and know what your kids are saying and doing. 95 percent of parents can't identify common chat room

## Burrito Pie

1 pound ground beef
2 to 3 garlic cloves, minced
1 can ( $11-1 / 2$ ounces) condensed bean with bacon soup, undiluted
1 jar (16 ounces) thick and chunky picante sauce, divided
1/4 cup cornstarch
1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley
1 teaspoon paprika
1 teaspoon salt
$1 / 4$ teaspoon pepper
1 can ( 16 ounces) kidney beans, rinsed and drained 1 can ( 15 ounces) black beans, rinsed and drained 2 cups ( 8 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese, divided $3 / 4$ cup sliced green onions, divided Pastry for double-crust pie (10 inches) 1 cup ( 8 ounces) sour cream

In a skillet, cook beef and.garlic over medium heat until beef is no longer pink; drain.

In a large bowl, combine soup, 1 cup of picante sauce, cornstarch, parsley, paprika, salt and pepper; mix well. Fold in beans, $11 / 2$ cups of cheese, $1 / 2$ cup onions and the beef mixture.

Line pie plate with bottom pastry; fill with bean mixture. Top with remaining pastry; seal and flute edges. Cut slits in the top crust. Bake at 425 degrees for 30-35 minutes or untill lightly browned. Let stand for 5 minutes before cutting. Garnish with sour cream, and remaining picante sauce, cheese and onions.
