

This is a protein packed Mexican-inspired pie that came to me through a friend years ago. It has a few more steps than my normal entrees, but believe me, it is well worth the effort! It's been a highly requested dinner in my family for years!

This is very filling, so no side dishes are really necessary, but if you need a little something on the side, chips and salsa are a great accompaniment.

That's this month's Dinner @ 6 – just in time for Cinco de Mayo!

Burrito Pie

1 pound ground beef 2 to 3 garlic cloves, minced

- i can (11-1/2 ounces) condensed bean with bacon soup undiluted
- 1 jar (16 ounces) thick and chunky picante sauce, divided

1/4 cup cornstarch
1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley
1 teaspoon paprika
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 can (16 ounces) kidney beans, rinsed and drained
1 can (15 ounces) black beans, rinsed and drained
2 cups (8 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese, divided
3/4 cup sliced green onions, divided
Pastry for double-crust pie (10 inches)
1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream

In a skillet, cook beef and garlic over medium heat until beef is no longer pink; drain.

In a large bowl, combine soup, 1 cup of picante sauce, cornstarch, parsley, paprika, salt and pepper; mix well. Fold in beans, 11/2 cups of cheese, 1/2 cup onions and the beef mixture.

Line pie plate with bottom pastry; fill with bean mixture. Top with remaining pastry; seal and flute edges. Cut slits in the top crust. Bake at 425 degrees for 30-35 minutes or until lightly browned. Let stand for 5 minutes before cutting. Garnish with sour cream, and remaining picante sauce, cheese and onions.
