American Art: Styles and Techniques for Kids, hands-on American art history class

June 26 - June 29, Ages: 8 - 12.

Utilizing two outstanding exhibitions on view at the TMA (American Painting from a Century of Collecting: Maier Museum of Art, Randolph-Macon Woman's College and American Abstract Drawings, 1930-1987), teachers will present a hands-on art history class in American art. Students will have a chance to paint like Georgia O'Keeffe and draw like Philip Pearlstein.

Storytelling Through Art July 17 - 20

Ages: 6 - 9
The narrative paintings in the Barnett-Aden Collection of African-American art feature examples of the way ethnic stories and family heritage are passed from generation to generation in

art. Collage, photographs and painting will be explored as students tell their own family and fantasy stories.

Photography for kids August 7 - 10

Ages: 8 - 12
35 millimeter cameras will be provided for this exploration of photography and how it is used to express an idea. An historic perspective of this medium is seen in the Zewadski Collection of photographs with antiquities as their subject, on view that month. Students will take their own photos, develop some of their own images and learn what to look for through the shutter. Students will need to supply three rolls of film (ask for specifics when registering).

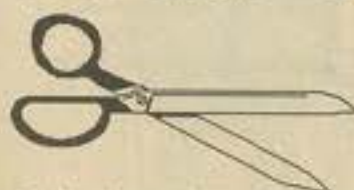

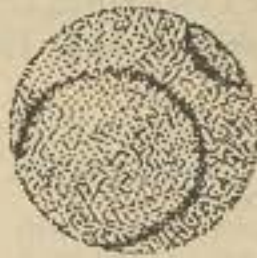

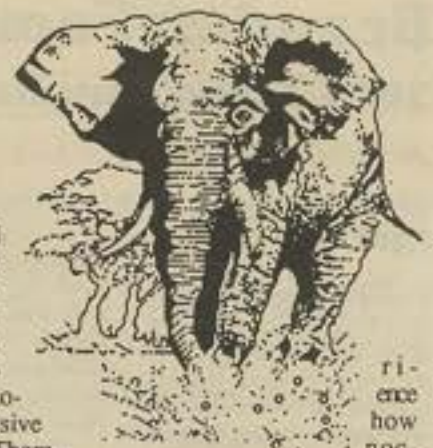
