Utilizing two outstanding exhibitions on view at the TMA (American Painting from a Century of Collecting: Maier Museum of Art, Randolph-Macon Woman's College and American Abstract Drawings, 1930-1987), teachers will present a hands-on art history class in American art. The lunches are free and are available to all children 18 years and younger.


