

So, Your Child Wants a Bike...

Bicycles are great fun-every child wants one. But is your child old enough, mentally and physically, to be responsible for driving the bike on Bloomingdale's streets? A bike is a vehicle when riden in traffic and is governed by our traffic laws the same as for automobile drivers. Bloomingdale is fortunate in that it has sidewalks, but children need to be taught bicycle etiquette and the proper ways to handle a bike around others. Keep in mind that before you allow your child to ride on Bloomingdale's streets that about 41,000 bicyclists are killed or receive disabling injuries annually so a bicycle represents a serious reponsibility.

Now that you've made the decision to actually purchase a bike, here are several major considerations to keep in mind: Types of bicycles, Fit of the Bike, and Safety Equipment.



Types of Bicycles

There are three types:

- 1. High-rise. This type has a small wheel, short wheelbase, handlebars, and banana seat.
- 2. Single-speed matter.

 This is a standard-looking bike with coaster brakes. It recommended for young cyclists.
- 3. Multi-speed lightweight. This type has 3-5 or 10 speeds for special needs like racing and long distance. This bike comes with hand brakes which young children should not attempt to operate due to the lack of strength in their hands. This kind of bike also requires regular maintenance.

Fit the Bike to the Child

Age	Wheel Size
Under 5 yrs	12" or 16"

8-10 yrs.....24"

When the child sits on the bike and it is the right size, the cyclist should be able to balance the bike with the tips of the toes resting comfortably on the ground and not leaning to one side or the other. Adjust the seat to accomplish this.

Handlebars should be set with the grips at the level of the seat. For drop-type handlebars seen on racing bikes and "10 speeds", the upper part of the handlebar should be level or slightly below the seat with the grips tilted down at about a 10-degree angle. High-rise handlebars should be lower than the driver's shoulder.

Safety Equipment

All bicycles should be equipped with:

Warning bell or horn Chain Guard Coaster brake Reflective devices on front, rear, sides and pedals **Fenders** "Day-glo" safety flag

You now have one excited child, a properly fitted bike, safety equipment, and sidewalks. What else is needed? Rules. After they have learned the basics of how to stay on the bike without falling off, you then need to stress the following:

- ·Local bicycle rules and regulations
- •Riding with traffic
- •Keeping to the right side of cars
- •Using hand signals
- ·Being cautious around parked cars
- •Never carry a passenger on a bike

Continue to observe your child's driving habits and, if necessary, restrict cycling. Your continued supervision is always necessary.

FISHING

Salt-water fishing and fresh-water fishing are excellent sources of recreation during the summer months.

With over 600 varieties of saltwater fish that can be landed off our coasts, it provides an excellent opportunity to take home a trophy of sorts. Deep Sea, surf casting, bridge and pier, tidal water, river and lake are a few of the types. Tarpon, which run in late spring and summer, are especially good



around Tampa Bay. No license is required for salt-water fishing.

On the other hand, if fresh-water fishing is your hook, a license will These can be be necessary. obtained at Wal-Mart, here in Bloomingdale, at \$18.50 for an annual hunting and fishing license combination for Florida residents. \$8.50 is the cost for the fresh-water license only which is good for one year from the date of purchase.



Orthodontics means more than a beautiful smile--it means a healthy smile, too. Also known as dentofacial orthopedics, orthodontics is the dental specialty concerned with correctly positioned teeth, jaw bones, jaw joints, and chewing muscles. Today's braces are less noticeable than ever and won't interfere with the active lifestyles that teenagers enjoy. Treatment may last one to three years and include a combination of appliances.

More and more adults are seeking

orthodontic treatment, eager for a more attractive face and smile, healthier gums, and freedom from jaw joint pain. Today's appliances include less visible braces, so orthodontics can fit into any adult lifestyle. With fully mature adult jaws, treatment may take longer than for teenagers.

The length of treatment depends on your bite problem, age, response to treatment, and cooperation with wearing your appliances.



CENTER PLACE

The heartbeat of Brandon

Brandon offers many opportunities that make it a rewarding place to live. One such opportunity is Center Place. More than a

meeting place, an art gallery, and an entertainment center, it is the heartbeat of Brandon. Pulsating with the



growth and excitement of our thriving community, Center Place strives to serve the needs of Brandon.

Several years ago an idea was conceived by the President's of the various civic clubs that a common meeting place was needed in Brandon. In 1979 the Brandon Cultural Center was opened. Safety and a Skatepark

by David Laytart The Jean Machine

Skateboarding, which has been around for some twenty-five to thirty years, has become the number one growing sport in America today. There are no manuals on "How to Skateboard"; there are no classes on skateboarding safety; and there are no local parks or bowls where skateboarders can learn to increase their skills--yet. With the increasing popularity of the sport, they are inevitable. In the absence of all of these, here are a few safety tips for skateboarders for this summer and all year long.

Before You Ride Your Board

...Check your wheels to be sure they roll freely and are not too loose on the axle.

...Examine truck bolts for tightness

along with the king pin and I-bolts. (The vibration of the ride along with normal wear and tear, can cause these to come loose.)

While You Skate

Whether you skate street or ramp, or even freestyle, always use common sense with the following tips:

...Don't attempt maneuvers you're not ready for yet. I.e.: A street skater who is just learning ollies shouldn't attempt to ollie over four feet of sand when he knows he *might* make two feet. The board could jam, the skater might fall, and a possible injury could have been prevented.

...Don't skate areas that are littered with broken bottles, cans, and rocks

...Be aware of vehicles wherever you skate and don't put yourself in a position of danger.

...Wear the proper safety equipment at all times. The pros do and they've been skating for years.





Wrist guards, knee pads, and elbow pads deflect the impact of falling and lessen your chance of injury. Don't forget a helmet, too. Always wear safety equipment!

While Riding Ramps (Halves or Street)

...Check for nails tht have come loose and hammer them back in.

...Check the coping to be sure it's tight and that there are no loose or sharp edges sticking up.

...Be sure the ramp is secure to the ground and doesn't move on contact.

...Inspect for rotted plys and replace as needed.

We're fortunate in Hillsborough County to have county officials who feel that our children's safety is important and for that reason are working very hard to help put a skatepark here locally. A skatepark is important to our community in that it provides an area for our children to skate in a safe, more controlled environment where they can challenge their skills safely without the dangers of cars, trucks, broken bottles, and no safety equipment.

Let's get out there and support the proposed skateboard park and perhaps we'll have several skateboard parks all over the county for our skateboarders to use and enjoy. 
