The Greyhound Gang **Finds Homes For Retired Racers**

What happens to retired racing greyhounds? Euthanasia used to be the method of choice to replace aging track dogs with new ones. Public outcry led to groups whose sole purpose is to facilitate the adoptions of retired racing dogs into loving, stable homes.

The Greyhound Gang of Florida, Inc. is one such group, and they need your help. Based in Seffner, the group has placed 650 dogs in homes since 2001. Leading the adoption effort is group founder, Joan Ray.

"Our job is to help these dogs

go from athletes to pets and to prepare them for their 'forever' homes," she explained.

From athlete to couch potato is how Ray describes the greyhound's transition to pet life. "Most people mistakenly think these are hyper dogs, requiring a lot of exercise. The truth is they are very docile, affectionate, even-tempered, and love to sleep, sometimes up to 16 hours a day."

Dogs come to the agency through track and kennel owners, as well as the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. The adoption process begins with a veterinarian visit

for a health work-up, including spaying or neutering, and vaccinations.

An important part of the adoption process is the foster home where the dog learns how to be a part of the family. Volunteers foster a minimum of two weeks, and follow strict

procedures to acclimate the dog to his new surroundings. Dogs must be exposed to new sights and sounds including, vacuum

Salon Raises Money **For Crime Victim**

You could say Bleu Salon & Spa has a heart of gold, donating time and talent to raise money for the victim of the Bloomingdale Library attack, but proprietor Jan Adams says, "We're just giving

Six months ago, an unidentified 18-year-old high school girl was viciously attacked and sexually assaulted as she returned a library book April 24. Since then she has been hospitalized, still blind and unable to speak, swallow or walk. Her care costs upwards of \$30,000 a month in a Sarasota rehabilitation center, and Medicaid recently notified the family that it can no longer foot the bill due to insufficient progress in her rehabilita-

All over Hillsborough County, fundraisers have sought to raise money to ensure that the girl can continue to receive therapy despite insurance issues. Bleu owner Jan Adams recognized the need and organized an event to help the family cover some of the costly therapy. The salon offered hair cuts, blow-dry, styling, waxing, manicures, pedicures and massages at discounted prices, donating all funds to the victim's family.

"We want to help this family and at the same time teach our people to give back," said Adams.

donate his time and talent for the event, which he heard about from Adams.

"It's just such a horrible thing," said Day.

Renowned in the industry, Day "pumped up the staff to help make this event successful," said


Bleu Salon is normally closed on Monday, but stylists willingly donated their time to come in and raise money for the victim whose story has touched so many of their hearts. The salon also raffled tickets for a chance at a "Day of Beauty" or "Gentlemen's Retreat," which alone raised over \$600. Silpada jewelry representative Ellen Williams had another reason for participating, one close to her own heart.

"My daughter and the victim are friends," said Williams, who donated 100 percent of her jewelry sales to the cause. Williams said of the victim,



Tips for this column will be compiled using, the Hillsborough County Extension Service Web site, other online resources, and advice from local area nursery and garden center specialists. Enjoy, and happy gardening.

Fall has arrived, bringing with it cooler, dryer weather, and many planting opportunities.

For November:

- Plant and fertilize annuals. Strawberry lovers still have this month to plant spring's strawberry crop. Annuals include sweet pea, verbena, pansy, hollyhock, alyssum, wax begonia, candytuft, calendula, baby's breath, nasturtium, snapdragon, marigold, coleus, vinca, torenia, impatiens, gloriosa daisy, salvia, portulaca, cosmos, ageratum, and celosia.

Reduce lawn watering. Keeping within county guidelines, water as needed. For some areas, watering every other week may be sufficient. This is the season to check irrigation systems, trim summer growth around sprinkler heads, and make repairs as

Thanksgiving Trivia: Turkey Talk For The Table

More than 116 million households are potential gathering places for the uniquely American tradition, Thanksgiving. The upcoming holiday is a time for families to gather and give thanks and express gratitude for all they have, as well as share with the less fortunate.

The tradition traces its roots back to centuries-old harvest fests around the world. In the United States, Thanksgiving began in 1621 with the Pilgrims of Plymouth, MA. That year, the Pilgrims and their Wampanoag Indian neighbors gathered for a three-day feast to give thanks for a bountiful harvest.

From then, the holiday was observed randomly. Many presidents proclaimed Thanksgiving observances, including Washington and Lincoln, who is credited with making the observance an annual event. However, Thanksgiving became an official national holiday when President Franklin Roosevelt established the fourth Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day on Nov. 26, 1941.



Bloomingdale Bulls Getting High Praise

From a trader on Wall Street to varsity head coach on Bloomingdale Avenue, Jason Stokes has created a Bull market as the team embarks on their first winning season in the school's history, garnering attention from the press and community neither coaches nor players at the school have ever experienced before.

Recently, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers lauded Stokes as High School Coach of the Week, honoring him with a trip to One Buc Place, a signed game ball presented by Jon Gruden and a check for \$1,000. Stokes took Blooming-dale Principal Mark West, Coach Dave Hutcherson and junior offensive and defensive lineman Matt Kacer with him to tour the training facility.

The Bucs High School Coach of the Week program is designed to honor local high school football programs that have a positive influence on young athletes as well as the communities they live in. There's no denying Stokes' presence has made a positive influence on the football program. For the first time in many years, funds are flowing into the program from a series of fundraisers as well as the \$1,000 from the Bucs.

"A lot of people don't realize how much money it takes to run a program," said Stokes. "We put most of the money into a new locker room, and the rest to team meals, field paint, film towers and general equipment."

Two needs still unmet are new uniforms for the players and a new press box, which, according to Stokes, "needs a lot of TLC." Any community member wishing to help meet these needs can reach Stokes at (813) 765-2882. But some goals have already been met for the coach and his players.

"My first goal was to change the attitudes of the kids, and I think we've done that," said Stokes. "My second was to look competitive on the field and I think we've done that as well." The Bulls are 4-2 with 4 games left to go in the regular season.

"I kept telling them that talent-wise they aren't much different from the teams we play," Stokes said. "I've seen the players from the other teams in our district with my own eyes. I promised them if they worked hard in the weight room and on the field, they will have success."

When Stokes came on in early 2008, there was much work to be done, a good part of it in the way of changing attitudes.

"When I arrived in January, they were willing to work, but I could tell they didn't believe in themselves," he said. "So, my coaching staff and I kept reinforcing a positive attitude, confidence and being competitive at all times. After a Riverview win





Lotto Winnings Still Unclaimed

The Publix at 3461 Lithia-Pinecrest in Valrico made big news locally as the store that sold a \$1 lottery ticket containing the six winning numbers that would fetch a prize of \$43 million. Speculation was rampant in the checkout line on Sept. 22 as customers and cashiers rendered guesses as to whether it was a customer or an employee that picked the lucky numbers.

Store employees admitted that they were waiting to see who didn't show up to work that day. The identity of the winner remains an unsolved mystery. As of Oct. 17, that prize was unclaimed, according to the Florida Lottery. The winning Florida Lotto numbers for the Sept. 20 drawing were: 02-17-24-26-48-51. Surprising to most will be the fact that all of that unclaimed money will not roll over to the next jackpot.

Florida law requires that 80 percent of unclaimed prize funds from expired tickets be transferred directly to the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund. The remaining 20 percent is returned to the prize pool from which future prizes are awarded or used for special prize promotions. And one more tidbit of information, lottery winners can not remain anonymous. Florida law mandates that the Florida Lottery provide a winner's name, city of residence, game won, date won and amount won to any third party who requests the information.

So, there is no multi-millionaire flying under the radar in your neighborhood. However, there may be someone frantically turning their house upside down in the hunt for the winning ticket. The winner has 180 days from the date of the drawing to claim their prize.



No one has yet claimed the winning lottery ticket bought at the Publix on Lithia-Pinecrest.

1 can cream of chicken soup


2 cups milk

With these efforts, your family will be well-fed while you cross items off their holiday wish lists! So, that takes care of "the day after".




