#### TENNIS COURT ETIQUETTE ?

We've had several questions about tennis court etiquette & would like to make mention of a few of the rules governing the courts. These methods are guaranteed to get you thrown off the best court in town:

- 1) Be sure to walk across all of the courts to get to the empty one when approaching the court. This is sure to ruin the rhythm of the court neighbor's game.
- 2) Wear hard-soled shoes on the tennis courts or even better cleats!
- 3) Hand on the nets, especially the center strap. Break as much of the net as possible. Without this thing in the center your serve will go in every time.
- 4) Roller skate on the courts. This leaves such cute little marks.
- 5) Bring trash from home to strew around the courts. Preplanning will allow you to really make an impression.
- 6) Bend the gates to get into the courts this way they're totally useless and you have had total victory over an inanimate object. You can also feel superior to non-vandals.

#### MISSING CHILD ?

The secenario is simple, it's crossed through your life before but probably worked-out O.K. - You're shopping with your child. How many times have you told him not to wander off, and he does! There's that terrible minute when you can't find him - then you do with thankful relief. But what if you couldn't, really couldn't, and a day had gone by. The police are looking but don't have many leads. Things would go better if you had a set of your child's fingerprints to give to the Sheriff's office. This is one of the primary points to the Missing Children Help Center. The center is in Brandon (137 N. Moon Ave., 681-HELP) and is connected to a nationwide effort to find missing children fast - BEFORE harm comes to them. The Help Center is organizing to fingerprint all children and give these fingerprints to the parents to keep with the medical records or in a lock box. The fingerprints are not turned-in anywhere else unless the parent personally does it. Volunteers are trained by a representative of the Sheriff's office to do the fingerprinting. Fingerprints may be the only way to trace your child if he is ever missing. A child in a car will almost always touch the glass and all around, especially when he wants out. A habit that could save his life because even with careful cleaning some may be left on - even a partial print is helpful.

The Center has a computer which will help police to identify missing children through fingerprints once the nationwide network is complete. The unidentified bodies of over 1000 children are still being held in New Jersey but they may never be identified. 2,000,000 are missing nationwide (mostly runaways) - 5,000 of these are found murdered. Some parents never find out what has happened to their child - and this is a living hell. 2,000 of the bodies are never identified.

Children are such easy prey. We must protect them by being watchful ourselves (this includes being aware of strangers in the neighborhood) and by teaching the children to be mindful of strangers. Sad but true, they must be wary. Older children having difficulties at home, and others who are not, are easily lured away by drugs, money, cults, and promises. They are often unable to return home on their own, and must be found.

The Missing Children Act needs support. The act would provide a National clearinghouse for information concerning missing children and unidentified bodies. More information about this may be gotten from the Help Center. It is now a reference and referral agency. They welcome voluntary help of course, but are also asking you to call and arrange about fingerprinting your children. Phone 681-HELP for information.
