



Sand Bag Sites Aid Homeowners

In preparation for Tropical Storm Fay, Hillsborough County Public Works delivered more than 14,000 sandbags and 96 yards of dirt to five county Fire/Rescue stations, while Hillsborough County Parks, Recreation & Conservation supplied the Bloomingdale area with a sandbag site on Culbreath, near the little league fields.

General Manager and Public Information Officer for PRC, John Brill, said the service has been provided since the infamous 2004 hurricane season. The sites remain the same and are maintained throughout hurricane season, which runs from June to November. Brill said, "It is refreshed as needed, and when the season is done the sand is picked up by a PRC maintenance unit and is used by our department for masonry mix, topsoil on athletic fields, as well as other uses."

A local sandbag site is a help to many homeowners who use the bags as a temporary fix to slow down water in the event of flooding. The bags are not a "fix all solution", according to Brill. "Some people feel peace of mind using them, while others claim they don't do much good," he said. Brill also stated that using the bags in combination with plastic aids in their effectiveness. "We do this as a service and convenience for the community. We provide the sand and bags, citizens must provide the shovel and the muscle." And, as we Floridians know from experience, the storms provide the motivation.

Bloomingdale Merged Into Brandon's Community Plan

In 1998, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners approved a Community-Based Planning Program. Community-Based Plans are designed to address and offer solutions to the community's critical planning issues and concerns, and to protect the qualities and characteristics that define what is unique and special about the community. A community-wide consensus is established on an action plan that may include a vision, goals, objectives, policies, and strategies for guiding growth, regulating development, and delivering public services consistent with the resident's priorities.

The meetings for the Brandon Plan were started in July 2007. The planning process usually last about 18 months. Meetings are held on the fourth Monday of the month at the Brandon Service Center, located at 311 Pauls Drive. Meetings run from 6 to 7:30 p.m.

What makes this significant for Bloomingdale, our plan was not to start until late 2011. And with budget cuts by the county, it was expected to move this date further into the future. One of the problems with this, is you have the possibility of being heavily influenced by other plans that have been completed that surround your border. Presently Riverview has completed its plan, Brandon is about two-thirds of the way finished, and Valrico is now coming on line. To our south will be the Fishhawk/Boyette Plan.

Thanks to the effort of the Bloomingdale Homeowners Association and the support of the Bloomingdale Community, the county commissioners voted to include Bloomingdale in the Brandon Plan. The significance here is this is the first time two plans have been merged. And from day one, the Brandon Committee has stated they felt that Bloomingdale should be


shutting down late inning rallies from two of the tournament's toughest competitors to enable the team to continue to advance to the championship game.

Leaving the university for Bloomingdale High School was a no-brainer. "I wanted to work more directly with students," she explained, "In this capacity, I get to see them from start to finish in the college decisionmaking process."

Haldane sees an average of 70 students a week in her office located inside the guidance department. While many students come for one-on-one assistance, others come to take advantage of the gold mine of information she maintains in

is available to broaden students' research capabilities.

Haldane is a "hit" with students who appreciate her caring demeanor, and she enjoys an almost instant connection and enviable rapport with them. But, it is her knowledge, proven success and sound advice that keep her office busy. Her advice varies depending on the student's grade level and future plans.

For ninth and tenth graders, she suggests students begin exploring options for after high school. "This is a great time to gather information, research colleges and careers, and even visit schools if your child shows an interest," she explained, "It is never too early to start."

For juniors, the advice is more specific. "The junior year is maybe the most important

data. In addition, internet access year in the process," stated Haldane. She advises selecting at least three school choices, along with majors the student may have an interest in, visiting those schools, preparing for and taking the SAT [Scholastic Aptitude Test] and ACT [American College Test] in the second semester of the junior year, and taking a strong senior vear schedule.

For seniors, her mandate is simple: Apply early to colleges, stay on top of deadlines, and apply for every scholarship for which you meet the criteria. Noting that standardized test scores and grade point averages for admittance are higher than ever before, she said, "Getting into college is getting more competitive each year; and students are better prepared. They are looking for the academic well-rounded student with a proven record of academic achievement."

The bottom line, she said, "Don't get overwhelmed, take it one step at a time, and above all, make sure the choice you make is the right one for you."



"I have a background with kids and I enjoy playing sports,"




