Sheriff opens new Bloomingdale Community Station

There's going to be a bigger law enforcement presence in Bloomingdale, thanks to the opening of the new Bloomingdale Community Sheriff's Sta-

The fancier new digs at 3622 Erindale Drive, just east of Lithia-Pinecrest Road, actually cost less to rent than the old substation headquarters on Bell Shoals Road near Beef O' Brady's. However, it offers about 300 more feet of space and a more central location, allowing deputies and detectives from both sheriff's District II and District IV to use the office, said Maj. Ron Hartley, noting that the boundary for District II and IV is Lithia-Pinecrest Road.

For the past 12 years, the Bloomingdale station has occupied a small storefront on Bell Shoals Road, which didn't give detectives much space to conduct private interviews or make phone calls. The

Overgrown yard? Here is what the county can do

Complaints about overbrush are among the top five complaints Hillsborough County Code Enforcement receives each month, particularly at this time of year because of the summer rains. The County's Minimum Standards Ordinance is clear - keep your property neat, attractive, and safe.

Here are some answers to the most common questions property owners ask Code Enforcement officers.

How is overgrowth defined?

Overgrowth is defined by the county as the growth of grass, weeds or underbrush exceeding 10 inches in height within 200 feet of a building, structure, recreational area or street right of way; and is determined by the county to create a nuisance for the surrounding community.

Why is overgrowth considered to be a violation?

The excessive growth of grass, weeds or underbrush creates a harborage or shelter for disease carrying insects and vermin as well as poisonous reptiles. Overgrown properties detract from the overall value of the neighborhood and can attract a criminal element into your community. Cases have been documented of criminals using overgrown properties to hide from law enforcement, as well as to commit other nefarious acts under cover of the grass and weeds.





Back To Church Sunday




